College Park. Stay in the right lane and immediately after passing over the Parkway, make a right (at the light) onto Southway (see below).

Once on Southway: Go straight to the second (2nd) STOP sign. Make a left onto Crescent road. Go to STOP sign and make a right into the parking lot behind the Greenbelt Library. Once in parking lot, look to right. The large, white building is the Greenbelt Community Center. Enter building using doors near fenced tot lot. The multi-purpose room is on the second floor. There is an elevator to the left of the entrance.

- Diecast Cops and Robbers! Danbury Mint will be releasing....drum roll, please....the Barris Batmobile!! It is rumored to list for \$149, payable in five installments of \$29.80, plus \$8.00 shipping and handling. Release date is listed as 'late 2001.' Well, they have you covered there too, with their new 1949 Ford appropriately titled, "Lead Sled"! It features a radically lowered stance, frenched headlights, skirts, a custom Carson top, a 'custom' paint job, and a multi-carb Cadillac mill! It features a removable Carson top, opening doors, hood, and trunk, which features a removable tool kit and spare tire. The tires spin, and wheels steer through the steering wheel. The final touch is a scale "Do Not Touch" sign for the windshield!! No word on how much, but if you are interested, contact 'em at the number listed above. And yet one more! How about you Fomoco fans? Want a 1961 T-Bird? This one is in the factory Turquoise Metallic, with a white top and interior. It features opening doors, hood (to showcase the 300 hp., 390 cu. in. V-8), and trunk, lift-off top, and removable fender skirts,. Additionally, the steering wheel swings away, just as on the real car. This one is only \$112, payable in four monthly installments of \$28 (plus a total of \$7.80 shipping and handling). And last, but nor least, the Maryland Terrapins '50 Chevy pickup. Basically a reissue of their '50 Chevy pickup in Terps colors, including optional accessories such as: a Weber kettle grille, director's chair, Maryland helmet & jersey, duffel bag, bag of nuts, two coolers, and a figurine of "Testudo", the beloved Terps mascot. This one lists for \$145, payable in five monthly installments of just \$29 (plus a total of \$7.50) shipping and handling). There you go, something for everyone!
- New stuff! Word reaches me about some new stuff from the gang at Revell slated for release in the third and fourth quarters. They include: a ProFinish PT Cruiser Slammer (Posie-styled two-tone), a "Vanishing Point" metal '70 Dodge Challenger, a "Gone in 60 Seconds" metal '67 Ford Mustang, #88 UPS Taurus ProFinish, #24 Gordon ProFinish, a '56 Chevy Delray (new tool!), a '70 Torino Cobra, a 25th Anniversary Firebird, a lowrider, '69 Superbee 2 'n 1, '58 Corvette convertible, Ferrari 360 Modena, a California Dune Buggy, #6 Viagra Taurus, #24 Gordon (glue kit), '41 Willys street rod (based on the Mazmanian tool), a 1/8th scale Jag XKE Coupe, an Amigo Pack Dodge Ram pickup w/a 1/64th scale diecast, an Amigo Pack T-Bucket w/a 1/64th scale diecast, and Jungle Jim's Monza funny car w/figures ('Jungle' Pam?!). Several other 1/64th scale diecasts are also enroute, including a '29 Roadster rat rod, 'T' pickup rat rod, '29 Ford Tub rat rod, a 1/25th scale "Vanishing Point" Challenger w/figure, and a 1/25th scale "Badman" '55 Chevy w/Tom Daniel figure, as well as several color variations of current diecasts. Additionally, a recent story on the new NASCAR website talks about Revell's latest and immediate future stock car releases. They discussed the #1 Mopar Performance Dodge truck, #28 Havoline Taurus, #17 Dewalt Taurus, #36 M & M's Pontiac, #43 Hot Wheels Dodge truck, #43 Cheerios Intrepid, #24 Dupont Monte Carlo (ProFinish & glue), #88 UPS Taurus (ProFinish & glue), and the #6 Viagra Taurus (glue). They also mentioned that they wanted to add another Intrepid stock car to the lineup, and are talking to a few Dodge teams about that. For obvious reasons, guess we can automatically rule out the Coors Light, and Kodiak cars, eh? A good one could pole-winner Bill Elliott's Ray Evernham-owned Dodge Dealers #9 Intrepid. Some of the pictures I gazed at included: Mickey Thompson's 'Attempt I', Warren Johnson's 200 mph Firebird Pro Stock, Bob Glidden's Fairmont Pro Stocker, Tommy Grove's Doug Thorley's '66 Chevy II funny car, just to name a few! So, check it New stuff continued! This time, its ERTL/Racing Champs. Visiting their website, a press release dated February 11th, they list several series of diecasts being released. These include: Musclecars, with new releases for 2001 such as a '68 Chevelle SS396, and '71 Torino Cobra; Memories, including cars such as the '60 Ford Starliner, and '58 Plymouth Belvedere; Chrysler Collection, including cars such as the '57 Chrysler 300-C; Cars of the Stars, obviously including things such as the highly successful "American Graffiti" cars; Ten Fastest Musclecars, including names like Hemi, Stage I, and Cobra; Police Cars, including for 2001 cars such as the '60 Ford Starliner, '49 Merc sedan, and both '58 and '64 Impalas (all 1/18th scale); Musclecars, again including the '57 Chrysler 300-C; Mint 50 Fastest Musclecars, including cars such as the '61 Impala SS409, '62 Ford Galaxie, and '64 T-Bolt (among others!); Body Shop (prefinished, unassembled 1/24th and 1/18th scale kits); and Precious Metal (24K gold-plated collectors coins in sets such as Kings of the Street, Pony Express, and Greatest Cars of the Century) (1/64th scale, except as noted). For model year 2003, the new Dodge Viper, which will be powered by an 8.3-liter V-10 producing 505 horsepower, and 500+ foot-pounds of torque, will sport a pushbutton starter, much like the new Honda Mini designer dead! John Cooper, a car designer who was responsible for designing the rear-engine Formula One racer and the lovable Mini Cooper, died of cancer recently in Worthing, England at the age of 77. The Mini was the first British car to win the European Rally Championship, and took the checkered flag at the Monte Carlo Rally three times!
