The Ala Kart

If memories of your youth do not include such things as milk bottles, the Arthur Godfrey Show or John F. Kennedy's presidency, then you may not fully under-

stand the impact of the Barris-built Ala Kart show car on the rod and custom scene in 1958. Hot rods, as they were called then, were mostly early Fords, painted black or red with steel

wheels and flathead engines or an occasional Olds or Buick powerplant. A handful of "high dollar" cars were powered by the NEW Chevy V-8. Custom cars

#9 Dodge® Intrepid R/T

[Revell #85-2361; 1/24th scale; 103 pieces; white, clear, vinyl tires]

More likely than not, the hottest story for 2001 was the return of the Dodge brand to Winston Cup racing. Back in the 70's, when the aero wars were in full swing, the winged Daytonas and Superbirds seemingly ruled the Superspeedways, until Mopar pulled out of the series.

This kit appears to have been knocked off of Revell's upcoming Profinish Dodge Intrepid. I say this mainly due to the thickness of some areas of the body (plus, the screws to attach the chassis to the body are a dead giveaway!). That said, let's move on.

Engine: The simplified engine consists of fifteen pieces, and features the requisite longitudinal seam to attend to. Of note here are the nice finned Dodge valve covers. The headers are hollow on the back side, where they won't be seen, and mount up to a two-piece exhaust dump.

Chassis/Interior: Nothing new here—one-piece left and right hand roll cage pieces with the padding molded in, which mate up to the chassis (nine pieces in all for the roll cage). The pedals are molded to the floor, and the steering wheel is separate. The window net and air intake hoses are also soft rubber as in the ProFinish kit. The front suspension is simplified, with the upper A-arms separate items, and the lower suspension molded as one piece, with metal rivets to mount the front wheels and tires. With the exception of the rear shocks and springs, the rear suspension is also molded simply,

with the majority of the suspension from the firewall back being molded as a single piece. The rear end housing hides the metal axle. A driver figure is included, as in the ProFinish kit series. Decal markings are also included for the driver's uniform.

Wheels/Tires: The tires in this kit are, as noted previously, the tampo-printed Goodyear Eagles from the ProFinish kit line. This saves the builder from painting the lettering, or worse yet, having to use decals or dry transfers to replicate the Goodyear Eagle markings.



The rims feature open slots, and separate brake rotors for each wheel.

Body: As noted earlier, the body seems a bit thick in spots, but seems to be pretty accurate for the new Dodges (which are based on the Ford Taurus racers). At first glance, the hood fit so well, I thought it was molded shut! Consequently, it may take some 'clearancing' prior to painting to allow it room to close properly. A nice touch is the inclusion of the camera pod for the roof, as well as the much-maligned 'barn door', which is used on superspeedways to slow the cars.

Glass: The glass is also pirated from the ProFinish series of kits,

meaning that the requisite areas on the inside of the glass have already been painted black. The glass even features openings for the jacking points, to allow for adjustments during the race.

Decals: Very nicely done, with very little excess carrier visible. Obviously, with the inclusion of the better pre-marked tires, 'Goodyear' markings are absent. But little else is. Head and tail lights, grouped sponsor decals for the fenders, screened-in grille openings, and a gauge face decal to mount behind the open dash cluster. A small negative here is the definite lack of any placement aids for help in positioning the headlights—you are on your own!

Instructions: Again, no surprises here—Revell has been kitting NASCAR racers long enough in order to ensure clear, step-by-step instructions, and diagrams to ensure proper decal placement for the multitude of decals on a modern Winston Cup stock car. According to the instructions, this car depicts the car that paced the 2001 Daytona 500 race, where the Dodges were seemingly 'sandbagging', until they snatched the two front row starting positions (this made possible by Jerry Nadeau's Chevy failing tech inspection for being 1/2" too low, allowing Stacey Compton to move up to the front row)! And the rest, as they say, is history. In their inaugural year in Winston Cup, the Dodge Boys managed to win races—four in all, at Michigan, Darlington, Charlotte, and Homestead, with drivers Sterling Marlin, Ward Burton, and Bill Elliott proving, quite convincingly, that *Dodge is back!*

Sooper, Sooper, Sooooopercar!

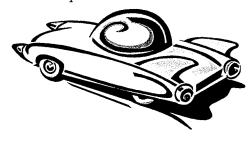
General Motors plans to take an active role in development of a new, \$250,000 U.S.-built supercar in order to compete with the likes of Ferrari, Lamborghini, and Aston Martin.

The vehicle under development is now known as the *Cunningham C7*, which was debuted at the 2001 North American International Auto show in January. It was designed by the *Cunningham Motor Company*, a so-called virtual car company. As such, Cunningham's plans call for outside suppliers to be responsible for the design, engineering, and production of its vehicles.

GM and Cunningham announced last month that GM had acquired a minority ownership interest in the company. The company was created in January 2000 by *Briggs Cunningham III* and *former Chrysler Corp. exec Robert Lutz*,

who, coincidentally is the new vice chairman of product development for GM!

The Cunningham C7, described as a 'world-class touring car', is currently configured as a two plus two coupe with a 6.8-liter, 600



horsepower V-12, which is supposed to be available sometime in 2004. It is rumored to be available with your choice of either an automatic or a 6-speed transmission, and all-wheel drive. The majority of the car is supposed to be built by subcontractors. With GM's new involvement, it is assumed that GM will either help build the car,

or farm out parts of the production. Cunningham said it hopes to builds and sell *600* C7 cars each year.

It should be noted that *Roush Industries* of Livonia, Michigan has been chosen to develop and integrate the car.

Mr. Lutz will continue in his role as a part-owner and board member, but will not actively participate in transactions between the two companies.

Rumor has it that GM's involvement is based on 'Supercar Envy'—the lack of a supercar in their lineup, what with Ford owning Aston Martin, BMW owning Rolls Royce, and VW having the rights to Bentley. Guess we'll have to wait and see how the General does on execution.

Pewter Snakes?

Well gang, it has been a little while, but the guys at Franklin Mint are making a real play to get at the green stuff in your hip pocket! This time, its you Ford fans who need to worry. The Mint is set to release a 1/12th scale Shelby Cobra 427 S/CTM in fine pewter! This baby is reported to be 12 3/4" long, and weighs 12 pounds! It includes most features of other Franklin Mint cars, i.e., opening doors and hood, but this one goes further. The seats in this car are upholstered in real leather. When you order this puppy, they provide you with a personalized Certificate of Authenticity, as well as a custom-made nameplate engraved with your name to attach to the wooden display base. The first car in this run, number 0001, is reported to be on its way to Shelby hisself! If you are interested, this guy could be yours after only ten monthly installments of \$100 each (plus state sales tax, and a one-time charge of \$19.95 for shipping and handling), for a grand total of only \$1,069.95 (at least for you MD residents!). It should be noted that due to the 'personalized' nature of this offering, you should allow four to six weeks for delivery. Guess most of you guys saw the Superbowl, and *Cadillac's new ad campaign* for the *CTS*, where they featured the song "*Rock and Roll*" from *Led Zeppelin*? Well, I don't know about you, but I am no fan of the 'New Look' CTS (or the Escalade and EXT, for that matter!)

Wouldn't it have been more interesting if they had chosen another Rock and Roll icon's song to draw buyers into showrooms? Something like, Bruce Springsteen's "Pink Cadillac"?! Guess at that rate, they could count on sales to the nice folks at Mary Kay, eh? I don't know if I could imagine any one of these vehicles in Mary Kay pink, though!

Lightning Strikes!

For nearly a decade, *Johnny Lightning* has had its finger on the pulse of the diecast community. Forty brand-new castings lead Johnny Lightning's hot new *2002 lineup*.

February will see the release of the Thunderbirds series, dedicated to the '50s and '60s cars that defined personal-luxury automobiles for a generation. From the classic two-seat '56 to the '58-'60 "Squarebird," the bullet-shaped '61-2s and the unforgettable '67-8s, four new castings spanning ten years of classic Ford power and style will be introduced.

In March, watch for the Volkswagens series! Four more new castings grace the lineup—three classics, and a new favorite! A '64-'66 Beetle, a '64-'66 Type 2 "Microbus" 21-window van, and the rare Type 2 pickup (all sporting slender Euro-style bumpers) cover the vintage era, while a New Beetle, ripe for customization, will round out the lineup. Watch also for the debut of the America's Heroes series, featuring castings that will celebrate the police, fire and rescue workers that are this country's unsung protectors of safety, health and liberty.

Woodies and Panels will be in stores in April! Five hot new castings—a '31 Ford Model A Woody, '33 Willys Van, '41 Chevy Woody, '40 Ford Sedan Delivery and '55 Ford Panel Delivery—will join the classic Merc Woody in this lineup. Optional engines poking through hoods, bright colors and new wheels for every release will make you want to collect every one of these hot new castings. Also debuting in April will be the Clas-

sic Chevy series—in reality, a repack of the fourth and fifth releases of Camaros 2 and Corvettes 2. Most collectors didn't get a shot at these vehicles as they were very narrowly distributed and nearly impossible to find.

May sees a number of debuts, including the Marvel Comics series, the Pro-Collector Tin series, and the latest Classic Gold series. The Marvel Comics series celebrates forty years of the best-loved super-

hero comics produced! With the X-Men a big-screen hit and Spiderman sure to repeat that phenomenon come Spring, you can bet that this licensed diecast will be the hottest thing since the Fantastic 4's Human Torch. Two dozen different vehicles will be available, each with a miniature replica of a significant Marvel comic cover. The Pro Collector tin series offers a new way to collect Johnny Lightning: by keeping it in its own protective box! You've got to see it to believe this innovative concept. Classic Gold will contain a typically wide mix of vehicles including cars you've seen in magazines, including a former Hot Rod Magazine project car and the Teralingua Shelby Cobra. A Chrysler PT Cruiser is also scheduled to debut in Classic Gold this month.

June will see the debut of a new Camaro series, celebrating the 35th anniversary (and impending de-

mise) of one of America's best-known and loved performance cars. A '98-'02 Camaro will be available in Z28 and SS forms, and in coupe, T-top and convertible guises.

They kick off Corvette's 50th anniversary a little early, in July with four great new castings: the '98-'02 (coupe, roadster and hardtop, including the white-hot Z06), a '68-'72 coupe, T-top and roadster, and the '86-'96 models, including closed coupes, open targaroof models, and open-top roadsters. Just think: just four castings, with roof and year variations, replicate more than five dozen different classic Corvettes! And that's before they start making color changes!

Also in July ... are you ready for the '70s? Two separate series, Boogie Vans and the Super '70s, will be on their way—seven new castings total! Boogie vans recreates the ultimate '70s customized machines: each release will feature two Ford, two Chevy and two **Dodge** castings in far-out paint schemes. Who cares who's knockin'...these vans are rockin'! Their Super '70s lineup consists of a series of disco dandies like the '71-'72 Pontiac Grand Prix, '70-'72 Chevy Monte Carlo, '71-'72 Buick "Boattail" Riviera, and the '76-'77 Olds Cutlass Salon formal-roof coupe.

August will see two new programs featuring reissued castings: Retro Rods and Tom Daniel Dragsters. Retro Rods will feature their Hot Rods 2 castings, and other favorites, done up '50s-style. If you love the look of a traditional

hot rod, in candy-apple or suede, on wide-whites and steelies, this series is for you. Tom Daniel's latest joint venture with Johnny Lightning recreates a line of 1/32 scale snap plastic model kits he did in the early '70s. Six different 1/64 scale all-diecast Johnny Lightning funny cars with Daniel-designed graphics will make up the sole release of this sure-to-be-classic series.

September heats up with James Bond, a new Willys Gassers series, and a new Mustang series—ten brand-new castings this month alone! Britain's top super-spy celebrates forty years on film, and to celebrate Johnny Lightning will have one vehicle from each film available to collectors! New castings will include the Aston Martin Vanquish from the new film (untitled, at this writing), the AMC Hornet from The Man with the Golden Gun, the Hispano-Suiza seen in Moonraker, and the super-

charged 4.5L Bentley seen in From Russia With Love. Additionally, the View to a Kill Corvette will be made from their new C4 Corvette tooling. Willys Gassers will combine their two classic Willys Coupe castings and their newfor-02 '33 Van casting with two more brand-new Willys castings: a '33 pickup and a '41 pickup! Their Mustang series will feature allnew versions of the '70 fastback, '65 notchback, '71 ragtop and '69/'70 Shelby GT500 coupe and ragtop versions will be stampeding to your favorite stores in September.

October is new-car season ... and in the '50s, GM celebrated new-car season in style with their traveling Motorama show. Johnny Lightning has been given the exclusive license to do Motorama cars ... and along with a phalanx of vintage '50s GM tooling in the series, one lone new casting—the '54 Corvette Corvair fastback—will make its debut.

It's supposed to get chilly in November but you'd never know it looking at their releases! Street Tuner will feature six new castings, to be named later. More will be announced at a later date, but they are expecting Street Tuner to be a breakout program in late 2002. New programs featuring reissued castings will include Ragtops and Mooneyes. Ragtops features some of their best-loved topdown castings, to get you thinking summery thoughts as winter approaches. One of the greatest speed-parts companies ever comes to life in 1/64 scale with their Mooneyes series! Six vehicles tuned and painted in signature Mooneyes livery will bring you back to a simpler time.

All feature the exquisite details you've come to expect from Johnny Lightning including diecast body and chassis, realistic wheels, and graphics that replicate real cars. Forty castings—a little something for everyone.

"Another One Bites the Dust!"

Well, it looks as though another brand will be history shortly! I am talking about Ford's recent announcement to discontinue the Lincoln Continental!

Many loyal Lincoln Continental fans and club members believe this to be a good thing, to discontinue a car that has seen steadily dwindling sales in favor of releasing a new style that harks back to its heyday of the 60's, when they were so successful. Club members hope to see a new car after a two or three year hiatus. As a matter of

fact, just last month, Ford displayed a prototype Continental at the Detroit Auto Show, which draws upon this successful 60's image.

The car was never actually intended to be a production model. Many years ago, Edsel Ford, Henry Ford's son (and the company's owner at the time), was planning a trip to Florida. In preparation for the trip, Ford's chief designer, Bob Gregorie, built a special convertible coupe from the 1938 Zephyr. It was three inches

lower, and seven inches longer than the Zephyr. It also featured a squared-off roof and trunk, that added an elegant flair to the car. It caught so much attention on the trip to Florida, that he decided to put it into regular production. The Lincoln Continental was born!

The car made its debut in 1940, powered by a *V-12 engine* which produced 120 horsepower, and a price tag of \$2,840. Fast forward to 2002, when a Connie could set you back 40 large. Guess that's progress for ya, eh?

were mostly Fords and Mercs, chopped and channeled, with enough lead in the body work to flatten the tires while they were parked.

Most of us were introduced to the Ala Kart through the pages of the October, 1958 issue of *HOT* ROD magazine and I remember staring at those pictures for weeks. This ground-breaking, radical show car was unlike any rod or custom I had ever seen. It was a Model A pickup with the back half of a '27 Model T welded to the cab with sculptured fenders, a shortened molded bed, a radical handformed nose and grille, quad headlights (!) and a wild chromed suspension. It was sprayed with 30 coats of pearl white paint with multicolored scallops, which today would be called "graphics". Motivation came from a heavily chromed Dodge Red Ram "baby hemi" engine. Most other rods and customs of the time suddenly looked like old antiques compared to the Ala Kart. To say that George Barris raised the bar for all future show cars would be a huge understatement.

Much to the delight of thousands of youngsters, a detailed model kit of the Ala Kart was released by AMT in 1961 which also included a second, stock Model A roadster right in the same box. I quickly cashed in my lawn-mowing revenue and paid the princely sum of two dollars for the Double Trophy Series kit. Throughout the 60's and early 70's, the kit was reissued a few times, each time losing more and more of the original Ala Kart parts until it became a kit of the

stock-bodied Model A roadster with the Ala Kart engine and a couple of the "Kart's" chassis components. It was last seen as the A-Venger Model A roadster and is likely to be reissued again sometime this year.

Almost 40 years after the original kit release, AMT/ERTL announced it was bringing out an *ALL-NEW KIT* of the Ala Kart. This was very welcome news for adult car modelers as mint, *original kits* were valued at about \$200, if one could be found at all. After another two-year wait since the initial announcement, the new kit is finally here! Let's take a look.

The body parts consists of the cab, bed, "padded" uptop, one-piece hood, unique nose piece and the one-piece floorpan/fender unit. Noticeable mold lines are found on the sides of the cowl and around the taillights. The tops of the grille shell and hood are rather flat compared to the prototype. A two-piece clear plastic and chrome grille assembly joins the quad headlights in the nosepiece. The headlight lenses are completely smooth with no engraving.

Added to the above parts are the separate tailgate, bed cover, box rails, firewall and chromed windshield frame/dash panel unit with individual chrome wipers.

Twenty pieces make up the *chassis* which are all chromed, except the frame rails and the transmission cross member. The front and rear air bag shocks and spring units are nicely engraved. Separate dual exhausts, steering arm and four conventional shocks complete the assembly. The whole assembly "rides" on nicely done chrome re-

verse wheels with the correct center bullets, and mount big and little tires with separate whitewall inserts.

More than 23 parts make up the *engine* depending on which of the three induction systems the builder chooses. The assembled engine appears to be *VERY small* upon first inspection. However, when the built engine is placed in the frame rails with the cab, firewall and radiator in place, it looks to be properly proportioned. Could it be that the original kit's engine was *TOO BIG*? The really odd thing about the new engine is the *lack of chromed parts*.

None of the induction systems parts are chromed and the few parts that *ARE* chromed should be painted flat black (?) according to the instruction sheet.

The valve covers are chromed but unfortunately do not include the "*Dodge Red Ram*" *logo* engraving.

The *interior* is a simple bucket affair as it was on the real Ala Kart with an integral seat. The seat and side panel engraved rolls and pleats are very nicely done. The chromed one-piece windshield/dash panel has a textured surface engraved with eight gauge trim rings. Oddly enough, the textured engraving is also *INSIDE* the trim rings instead of engraved gauge faces. Don't look for the gauge faces on the decal sheet either! The interior is completed with the steering wheel and floor shifter.

The car is completed with various parts, i.e., the chromed hood scoop "teeth", nerf bars, taillight bezels with clear red lenses, fuel

Thanks to the recent success of the Corvette C5-R on the racing circuit, General Motors Racing has begun a program to offer raceready versions of its 'baby' to 'buvers with a passion for performance.' GM is working with partners Pratt & Miller (chassis) and Katech (engines) to produce the cars, at least five of which were to be ready this year. GM Racing said it had received inquiries from private teams seeking the powerful C5-R, that it had taken deposits on several. The C5-R dominated its competition in several races last year, including scoring an overall win at the 24 Hours of Daytona, a double podium finish at the 12 Hours of Sebring, a one-two GTS class finish at the 24 Hours of Lemans, and class wins at American Le Mans series races at Texas Motor Speedway, Sears Point, and Portland. "It will help us communicate our world-class engineering message to sports car enthusiasts everywhere," said Corvette Brand Manager Rick Baldick. "In my view, the C5-R has begun to hit full stride in what is still a voung racing career" said Corvette Program Manager Doug Fehan. Kudos to the General!....It looks as though the Brev brothers (Kevin & Mike) are in the process of building themselves a domain! Name not familiar to newer club members? They run Hobby Works, a hobby shop in Laurel, MD which has, for several years, graciously sponsored a trophy for our Mid-Atlantic NNL, as well as taking care of club members with discounts, and special order items. Business was good enough to allow them to open a second

store on Rockville Pike. Well, in a conversation with Kevin recently, I find that they now have a THIRD location! This one is in the Fair City Mall at the corner of Pickett Road and Rt. 236 (9650-42 Main Street, Fairfax, VA 22031), in nearby Virginia. You can reach 'em by phone at (703) 426-8600. As is usual fare for FM replicas, it will feature opening doors, hood (to show off the 368 cubic inch, 290 hp. V-8, w/plug wires), and trunk. Additionally, it will have steerable front wheels, a swingaway continental kit, folding front seats, and a retractable 'Breezeway ventilation window' just as in the real car. It will be available in the near future for just \$112, payable in four easy monthly installments of only \$28 (plus a total of \$7.80 for shipping and handling). 854-7108 Monday through Friday, 9 a.m. to 5 p.m. Eastern Standard Time....The Dodge Intrepid stock cars have barely hit the shelves as I write this, but there are several decals available (or soon to be) for them, including the "Coors Light Kiss" #40, "Spiderman" #9, and "Levi Garrett" #92. Check 'em out at www.bsrrep.com....New website for the Grand Trouring and Racing Modelers - www. gtrautomodelers.freeservers. com....How many of you bought one of the new BMW Minis? Check out www.mini.com for reference material to build this cute little kit! Thanks to the GTR Auto Modelers!....The soon-to-bereleased Revell '68 Firebird was burning up the Hobby Heaven message board recently. Wellknown modeler Terry Jessee had nothing but good things to say about it, and I quote: "You need one of these. You need three or four of 'em. It says 2 'n 1, but you could actually do three different versions - stock, racing, and mild street. Separate door handles, American Torque Thrusts, crisp detail everywhere, a nice racing engine with lots of little fiddly parts, super chassis and suspension, platform interior with lots of parts (including a roll bar), a BIGGGGG decal sheet, and a box chockful of little white and chrome and clear and transparent red and vinyl parts - and all of it wrapped! filler cap, hood braces, etc.

In many model car kits, the decals are optional decorations. For an Ala Kart replica, the decals are a major part of the picture. The scallops on the decal sheet are usable but they are frankly, not true to the prototype's colors. They should be a deep purple and gold, but instead are medium lavender and school-bus vellow. Also included are decals for the pickup bed sides which are also yellow instead of gold. Virtually *half* of the decal sheet is *incorrect* as it contains what are supposed to be the piping around the rolls and pleats in the interior. The piping on the 1:1 Ala Kart seats and door panels is chrome-silver. The pleats are to be painted black, so the BLACK piping decals are pointless. A correct California license plate is included depicting the original on the show car. Even with the few shortcomings in the execution of this kit, I think adult modelers will want to grab these up in large quantities. Straight from the box and with the addition of a couple coats of pearl white paint, the kit builds into a decent representation of what is, arguably, the most famous show car in history. For those wanting to produce a detailed, exacting replica of the Ala Kart, some work here and there, and some aftermarket help will be needed. The Model Car Garage can provide photoetched Barris emblems and gauge kits. Fred Cady has excellent Ala Kart decals. It's just good to have this old favorite back after 40 years AND it's about \$190 cheaper than an original kit! Thanks, AMT.

Super Charger!

Found these helpful hints on 'accuirizing' the Polar Lights Petty Charger on the Hobby Heaven message board. Sadly, I don't know who to attribute them to!

"Started working on my PL Petty Charger today. I made *four small changes* to the body that IMHO helped it out 100%!

First off, I thinned the A pillars to about the same size as the old MPC Charger body. I just used my X-acto and dragged it down the pillar until it was thinner. This helped a lot, it made the roof look lighter and helped the side window look more correct too. Next, I removed the mold line on the front fender. While I was doing this, I rounded the fender off a little. This helped the look of the whole front fender/hood area. I then did the same thing to the rear fender area. There is a sharp edge at the top of the fender, where the mold line is, that must be rounded off. The plastic is thick here, so don't worry too much about going though the body. I again dragged the X-acto down this edge until it was gone, then used sanding sticks to finish it

The last thing I had to do was trim the deck spoiler to the width of the trunk. There should not be any spoiler on the fender tops. After a light sanding of these areas, and a shot of primer, I was surprised at how much better it looked!

Should we have to do this on an \$18.00 kit? No, but if this looks as good as it appears, I will I build a few more."

So, run out and get yer Chargers, and get started, race fans! ₩

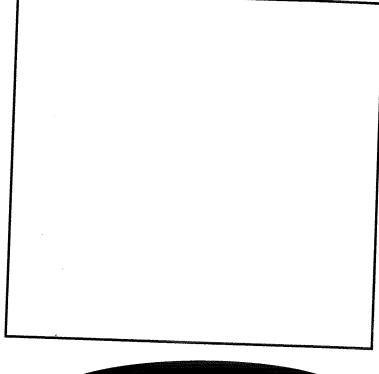

Directions

From the Baltimore Beltway (RT 695): Take Exit 7, Route 295 (Baltimore-Washington Parkway) south towards Washington approx. 18 miles to Route 193 (Greenbelt Road), and exit. When on the offramp, stay to the right and merge right onto Southway (see below).

From the Washington Beltway (RT 495): Take Exit 22 north, towards Baltimore. Stay in the right lane and take the first exit onto Route 193 (Greenbelt Road). When on the off-ramp, bear to the right and take Greenbelt road west, towards College Park.
