

History Lesson!

Franklin Mint is announcing the release of the star of the Great Race, the 1907 Thomas flyer in 1/24th scale. After *13,341 mostly* unpaved miles, and 171 cold winter days, and hot summer days. this car crossed the finish line to win The Great Race (which was sponsored by a FRENCH newspaper, Matt!). It started in New York, and ended in Paris, by way of China and Russia. Three French cars, a German car, and an Italian car joined the Thomas Flyer on the starting line on Lincoln's Birthday (February 12th). The brochure provides an interesting history lesson.

As soon as the starter's gun went off, calamity struck the French team with a cracked rear axle ring gear, while a blizzard raged. The German's engine gave out in Utah, and they shipped their car to Seattle by train, without being disqualified. The cars crossed the Pacific ocean by ship, with the Thomas Flyer landing in Kobe, Japan. This car then went on to become the first motorized vehicle to cross the island. The Germans avoided Japan by shipping their (repaired) car directly to Vladivostok. The Flyer caught up to the Germans, hopelessly stuck in deep mud, and promptly pulled them out to continue the race, despite the Germans flaunting of the rules. The Germans actually reached the finish line first, but because they had only traveled 10,295 miles by car, compared to 13,341 miles by the Thomas Flyer, they were disqualified, declaring the Thomas Flyer

the winner! The Flyer was even ticketed by the French Police approaching the finish line, for driving without headlights!! Authentic features include: 45-star American flag, spinning wheels, operable steering, five spare tires, opening hood, turning starter crank, detailed 4-cylinder, 70 hp. engine (good for 60 mph!), contained in deluxe packaging ("preferred by knowledgeable collectors", to quote the brochure!). "Show off your passion for speed," as the brochure puts it, by ordering one of only 3,500 precision replicas of the Callaway C12 in 1/24th scale, to be produced by, you guessed it, the Franklin Mint! Included in the asking price for this one is a custom-designed display case with special C12 graphics, commemorative Callaway key chain and key, authentic Callaway dashboard plaque, literature and schematics of the C12, and a certificate of authenticity handsigned by Reeves Callaway himself, and numbered to match your individual model. As far as the model is concerned, it features opening doors, hood, and trunk, operable steering wheel and road wheels, and operable suspension. It also appears to include an up convertible top. And a Franklin Mint first – simulated carbon fiber detailing on the twin engine covers! Reeves Callaway will even autograph the rear deck of your car. All this 'exclusivity' doesn't come cheap, though. This one'll

set you back five monthly installments of \$99 (with shipping and handling on top of that, I assume). Contact 'em at Franklin Mint Precision Models, Franklin Center, PA 19091-0001.

The PT Cabrio (as it will be known in Europe) follows **GT Cruiser**, panel van, and pickup concepts of this wildly popular little vehicle. In 1998, the Guiness Book of World Records honored his Volvo as the vehicle with "the highest certified mile- 10th & 31st, September 14th & age driven by the original owner in 28th, so check 'em out!

Indians!!

The *Indian Motorcycle Corp*. recently debuted the *first new Indian engine in decades*. The new engine debuted on Feb. 15th, being installed in a newly framed *Chief* as a 2002 model.

The company, started in 1901 by bicycle maker Oscar Hedstrom and entrepreneur George Hendee, played a key role in the advance of two-wheeled transportation.


Indian introduced the first motorcycle with an electric starter and complete electrical system in 1913. Before World War I, the company was the *largest motorcy-cle maker in the world*, producing *more than 20,000 bikes a year*.

While Indian was founded two years before Harley-Davidson, the company actually went broke almost 50 years ago, when it lost its battle for the nation's motorcycling dollar to the 'Hogs.' In the decades since the doors closed on Indian's Springfield, Mass., factory, several groups tried to revive the brand. In 1998, a judge awarded the brand name to a group including Canadian investors and Gilroy-based California Motorcycle Co., a maker of Harley "clones"—bikes that mimic Harleys, with HD lookalike engines made by outside companies.

While the 100-cubic-inch, air-cooled engine breaks no new ground, it does offer some styling cues from Indian history, with *rounded cylinders* and *carburetor* mounted on the *left* rather than the right, unlike *Harley-Davidson*.

The engine is being assembled by Performance Assembly Solutions in Livonia, Mich., then shipped to the former grocery warehouse that houses Indian's assembly line.

The list price of the *Chief* will range from \$20,495 to \$22,995. Indian also sells the sporty *Scout* and the midlevel *Spirit*, which will continue to use the *S&S* engine for now. The CEO, Mr. O'Connell, said he expects the factory to produce about 3,000 *Chiefs* this year. That's about half the factory's planned production of 6,000 bikes overall. This compares with about 1,100 bikes in 1999.



Directions

From the Baltimore Beltway (RT

695): Take Exit 7, Route 295 (Baltimore-Washington Parkway) south towards Washington approx. 18 miles to Route 193 (Greenbelt Road), and exit. When on the offramp, stay to the right and merge right onto Southway (see below).

From the Washington Beltway (RT 495): Take Exit 22 north, towards Baltimore. Stay in the right lane and take the first exit onto Route 193 (Greenbelt Road). When on the off-ramp, bear to the right and take Greenbelt road west, towards College Park. Stay in the right lane and immediately after passing over the Parkway, make a right (at the light) onto Southway (read on!)
