
the Clearfield and Somerset stores.

Trumpeter 1963 Nova Update! According to the Hobby Heaven message board, the Pontiac Bonneville kits are still in tooling, due hopefully, mid-year. Much delayed, but a lot of it was GM approval problems, and the rest just plain old tooling problems. Good news: The 1963 Nova convertible and *hardtop* are in with GM for product approval. The incredible resin masters were received in early January, and sent right off. Updates when available....**Sorry** to see you go! As of December 27th, *Patrick Mulligan* left his post as Managing Editor of Scale Auto (no Enthusiast) magazine.... High-priced Buicks! GM says as new car models push Cadillac more upscale, Buick's new cars will be more expensive, filling the void Cadillac leaves behind, at least, according to GM guru Robert Lutz. This may start with the 2005 Buick LeSabre and Regal.... Mopar to Ya! Dodge has got some 'interesting' concepts currently making the rounds. The **Dodge Avenger** is a five-door hatchback styled with a European rally coupe flair; the **Dodge Ka***huna* is a lighthearted example of how Dodge could approach the youth-oriented cargo-hauler segment with a six-seater (read: minivan) that has a surfing theme; the **Dodge Durango RT**, a full-sized SUV, with styling cues from the earlier Power Wagon and Power Box concept cars; and finally, the Magnum SRT-8, a rear-wheel drive car, with a 20 inch wheel

and tire package. Let's see what actually makes it to the streets; and finally, let's not forget the **Dodge Tomahawk**, a motorcycle type vehicle that's little more than **wheels** and a **seat** hung off a **9.0-liter**, **500-horsepower V-10 from**

the Dodge Viper SRT-10. The concept was rolled out at the Detroit auto show. It can accelerate from 0-60 in 2.9 seconds, with a top speed

estimated near 300 mph, although the concept has been run up to only 100 mph. Apparently, Chrysler is considering building several hundred copies, for a cool **\$250,000** per. Refer to the article on the North American International Auto Show on page 8 for pics.....Baby Bull! Lamborghini will name its so-called baby Lamborghini—Gallardo (pronounced "gayardo") after a famous fighting bull breed created in the 18th century by Francisco Gallardo. The mid-engined, 500-hp 5.0-liter V10-powered (mated to a sixspeed manual transmission with a traditional shifter or steering wheel shift paddles) all-wheeldrive car should debut this Spring....Another new Shelby! Spotted at the Los Angeles auto show, the CSX8000 Shelby 289 Cobra, a.k.a. the 289 Street Car.

The display car was powered by a 345-horsepower, 302-cid Ford Motorsport GT40 engine, good for 0 to 60 mph in approximately 4.6

seconds and quarter-mile in 12.8 seconds at 106 mph, the builder says. The car will be produced in limited numbers by Shelby American Inc. and can be purchased in kit form or assembled by 15 authorized independent shops

super truck racing formula (as seen on Speed Channel) will begin competition here in the U.S. in 2003. The new American racing series uses Class 8 trucks weighing in at 10,000 pounds and powered by 1,000 horsepower engines. The series runs a single approved rolling chassis, which can accommodate different bodies and engine types. The executive director of the suburban Columbus, Ohio-based racing organization is Brian Till, a former Indy car driver, Toyota Atlantic champion and now TV racing commentator. They will be in action at Elkhart Lake's Road America on August 21st to 24th, as part of the ALMS/ Trans Am weekend. Bigger is better! Thanks to the Hobby Heaven board....Twice-powered cars from 'The General.' According to a recent Washington Times arti-

cle, GM is ready to debut several *hy-brid cars* over the next few years. First up will be *Silverado* and *Sierra*

This will be followed by a *full-sized Nissan SUV*, based on the big pickup, and the 350Z roadster later in the year. 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
Top 30 Signs That You Suffer from Road Rage

Standard equipment includes ceramic coated exhaust system, RevTech solid front wheel with Russel rotors, single seat, 7" Headwinds headlight, Kuryakyn mirrors and handlebar grips, chrome rear fender mount, torque plate and axle eccentrics, front swing arm covers, shock tower cones, mufflers, header knee heat deflector, footboard mount, brake pedal/pushrod, master cylinder and reservoir w/cover, crashbar, fuel pump block off plate, water reservoir, alternator/mount, and

For a V10, check out the Dodge Tomahawk in this issue.

Need more? Check out Jav Leno's gas turbine -powered motorcvcle! It uses a reconditioned Bell Jet Ranger helicopter engine (!) After one of these hits the limited number of operational hours set by the FAA, it has to be completely rebuilt/recertified, costing around 80 large. The engines weigh only 130 pounds each, and produce 320 to 350 hp, in a bike weighing about 450 pounds. You do the math! Cost? \$150,000! A truck is also available, costing a lot less. Tire Detailing Made Easy!

flat spot it slightly Rims

Here are some tips from *Nor*man Veber's Tire and Rim Detailing seminar presented at the January meeting (Thanks, Matt!).

Tires

- For an "aged" whitewall look, use Floquil Antique White
- When painting vinyl (kit) tires, use only lacquer or acrylic paints as enamels will not cure
- To reduce the gloss on tire sidewalls, use Testor's Flat Clear (lacquer). Floquil Weathered Black will provide a nice "used" look, too
- On the tread area, use earth tones to replicate wear and dirt
- To give the tire a more realistic stance, use sandpaper to

Create a black "wash" using a few drops of Polly Scale Oily

Black and water. Add a very small drop of dishwashing liquid, which helps break the surface tension and improve flow. Applying the wash to the rim will dull

the painted finish and the black will settle into the seams to provide an illusion of depth

- Paint lug nuts with metallic gray, and then dry brush with rust paint to enhance the used look
- Valve stems can be added by

using a piece of thin wire painted black, or Replicas and Miniatures Company of Maryland valve stems

To add color to trim rings,

hubcaps and wheel covers, use acrylic paints that will not attack the chrome plating. When using Testor's or Polly Scale acrylic paints, use a soft cloth or Q-tip moistened with water to wipe away excess

paint once dry. When using Tamiya or Gunze Sangyo acrylics, use denatured alcohol. Make sure to make only one swipe over the painted area to ensure you don't remove too much paint or affect the chrome

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
Model Buffet





Directions

From the Baltimore Beltway RT 695): Take Exit 7, Route 295 (Baltimore-Washington Parkway) south towards Washington approx. 18 miles to Route 193 (Greenbelt Road), and exit. When on the offramp, stay to the right and merge right onto Southway (see below).

From the Washington Beltway (RT 495): Take Exit 22 north, towards Baltimore. Stay in the right lane and take the first exit onto Route 193 (Greenbelt Road). When on the off-ramp, bear to the right and take Greenbelt road west, towards College Park. Stay in the right lane and immediately after passing over the Parkway, make a right (at the light) onto Southway (read on!)



Once on Southway: Go straight to the second (2nd) STOP sign. Make a left onto Crescent road. Go to the STOP sign and make a right into the parking lot behind the Greenbelt Library. Once in parking lot, look to the right. The large, white building is the Greenbelt Community Center. Enter building using the doors near fenced tot lot. The multi-purpose room is on the second floor. There is an elevator to the left of the entrance.
