## Resin Review: Dart Swinger

While perusing the *Hobby* Heaven Model Message Board recently, I discovered a company that produces a resin transkit to convert Revell's 1968-1969 Dart into a 1970 Dart Swinger Hardtop (Kit # SCW-TK03, \$35.00, plus shipping and handling). There was a link to *Scale Coach*works (www.scalecoachworks. *com*), which I believe is run by **Dan Janssen**, one of the modelers on the board. The Dart Swinger is a model I have been looking to add to my collection, so I placed an order for one.

Within a week, I received a package. Inside was what I consider to be a nice rendition of the aforementioned Swinger. The kit consists of the following pieces:

- Body
- Front bumper/grille

## New Stuff!

The parts were cleanly cast in a beige polyurethane resin, similar in feel to a Modelhaus offering. The flash had to be cleaned up from the edges and window cavities, and the body should be soaked in a solution (whitewall tire cleaner, i.e. Westley's Bleache White) to remove the mold release. Bumpers should be chromed, as they are not in the kit.

Once prepped, this transkit should blend with one of the available Revell Dart kits (interior tub, chassis and running gear) to make a convincing rendition of a Swinger.

Caddy (licensing), 1964 Ford (incomplete tool), and 1971 Roadrunner (incomplete tool and non-cooperative licensor) kits have been dropped.

For the model to be truly accurate, the seat upholstery patterns of the Revell kit have to be modified to match the actual interior, as well as sourcing a Mopar 340 V8, and Mopar rally wheels (AMT) 1971 Plymouth Duster 340), or any other powertrain/wheel combo of your choice (slant-six, steel wheels/dog dish hubcaps from the Lindberg 64 Dodge 330? Hey, Guilfoyle!!). With a little work, you too can have a Swinger on your shelf. Am I impressed with this kit? You bet. This is a very good value for the money. and I recommend it to anyone who loves these cars.

## XS Tuning Wheels

I first heard about XS Tuning from our fine newsletter editor (Aw shucks, Walt!). I quickly checked out their website, www. xstuning.com. They sent a sample set out in response to a brief e-mail.

A letter came with the package explaining XS's plan to satisfy newer, younger builders with subject matter that is closer to the 1:1 cars that are running rampant on the street scene today. Like it or not, tuners are the hotrods of twenty-somethings today. The presentation of the product was professional, similar to what you get with kits from the major Japanese manufacturers.

Packaging is one of the most secure I've seen. They are shipped in a 3"x3"x1" box with a tab on top for displaying on the store's pegboard. Clear information is provided on top listing the style, size, finish, and a nice graphic of the enclosed tread pattern. My example was the Street S17 style, 17-inch, aluminum finish, with a gatorback-style tread pattern. Opening the box reveals two stacked, interlocked trees. One holds eight rotors with calipers molded on and four adapters. The other tree holds the wheels already shod with rubber. The trees have standoffs molded into them that keep the important stuff from rubbing the packaging. It would take a major shipping accident to mar the excellent finish of the product. The packaging places the wheels in a TV-like 2.25" square window

so they are viewable in all their glory. Clearly "what you see is what you get."



The instructions are clear and well thought out with specific in

thought out, with specific instructions for *Revell/Monogram*, *Tamiya*, *Hasegawa*, and *Fujimi*. Four of the rotors are made specifically to fit Revell/Monogram tuner kits and the other four are for Tamiya applications. The Fujimi builder gets left out on using the beautifully molded rotors out of the box and must use the original kit rotors *(too bad)*.

The rotors are cross-drilled spiral pattern with a ring of bolts on the hub that appear to mount the rotor to the hub. The calipers look like Wilwood four piston units without the brand name molded in. A little black wash for the cross-drill holes and some paint on the calipers is all that's needed to make these stand out.

The wheels are excellently molded examples of those seen on tuners with eight lug holes and hexagonal center caps, but lacking valve stem detail. There is no flash or cleanup necessary. The only thing to do is cut them from



the tree!

The tires are perfect examples of what appear to 40-series tires with Goodyear gatorback tread patterns. All mold lines appear to be on the inside of the tire, where it comes in contact with the rim. The finish on the tires is a bit on the shiny side (kinda looks like a fresh coat of Meguiar's Endurance high gloss). Leave it alone to make the car look NOPI showready, or scuff the tread and use vour favorite abrasive scrub to remove some of the sheen from the sidewall. The only drawback to the tires is the lack of sidewall detail to mention at all.

My test subject is a *Fujimi Honda Civic Type R* to be built as a *JDM* (*Japanese Domestic Market*) spec car with a few extra tuning goodies. Being that this kit is of a Japan–only Civic, and the fact that they offer a left-hand drive dash in the kit will make this effort a breeze. Some dry fitting makes this tire/wheel combo look like they will fit perfectly within the wheel wells and also prove that the adapters have been engineered for a fit that is comparable to the original kit wheels.

XS Tuning offersfour different wheel styles with three different finishes (chrome, matte aluminum, and white) in the first run. I highly recommend that you try these on a future tuner project. With an MSRP of \$8.99, they are a good value for the money. I don't think anyone will be disappointed. I just hope I can find an exhaust tip large enough to do these wheels justice!

Toyota Motor Sales, U.S.A. recently announced plans to begin participation in the NASCAR Craftsman Truck Series in 2004 (see story on page 7). Can the new Nissan Titan be far

There will be a NASCAR IMAX movie to be released by

Reynolds is considering pulling out as the title sponsor of what is now the Winston Cup series. The company has five years remaining on its contract with NASCAR but could withdraw if a replacement is found. Time will tell...And NASCAR taketh away! Looks like NASCAR is trying to 'realign' (read: get more money!) their schedule to add new tracks. and steal dates from tracks currently with two dates in their schedules. Charlotte, Atlanta, Darlington, and Rockingham could lose one of their two dates to either larger markets or new tracks (that'll make Bruton Smith

REAL happy!)... Unocal calls it

ConocoPhillips, owner of the 76 gasoline brand, told NASCAR that they would end their 50+ year sponsorship as the "Official Fuel of NASCAR"... Return of the SS? The Chevrolet Impala and Monte Carlo will get V8s when re-

quits!

styled versions come out for the 2006 model year, dealers were told. You'll have to make do with

optional supercharged V6 engines for 2004... Mercury will revive the Montego nameplate, a nameplate dormant for 25+ years, for its new sedan. It will be built at Ford's Chicago assembly plant along with the new Ford Five Hundred sedan and Freestyle sport wagon, and will hit showrooms in late 2004... Hummer will introduce the H2 SUT (Sport Utility Truck) in spring 2004. Think of it as a Hummer with a pickup bed...In 2004, Chevrolet will sell two inexpensive versions of the Aveo (the subcompact Daewoo Kalos, a vehicle sold in Europe and Asia). Two models, a four-door sedan and a five-door hatchback, are expected to fill the hole left when the Chevrolet *Metro* was discontinued in 2001. "They are all-new vehicles, never

been sold here before," said an unidentified industry source. "Some of them were introduced a short time ago in other markets." In a recent interview, Gary Cowger, president of GM North America, said only one GM brand in the United States will

scheduled to arrive in 2004...Z car goes topless! Less than a year after the 350Z hit the market, Z buyers get an open-top option. The convertible Z, called the 350Z **Roadster**, debuts at the New York auto show in April and hits showrooms this summer. It has a power-operated cloth top with glass rear window. Price wasn't immediately available...The Pathfinder Armada goes on sale this fall as a 2004 model, and will use the same platform as the Nissan Titan full-sized pickup. Nissan will produce another version of the full-sized SUV for its Infiniti luxury division... Deep sea Volvos! Volvo took the biggest hit to its already tight supply of *North* American Truck of the Year XC90 sport/utility vehicles-when a Norwegian-registered car-carrier sunk on December 14th in the English Channel, after colliding with another ship. Of the 2,862 vehicles aboard the vessel, 2,014 were Volvos, including 358 XC90s, 637 S60s, 173 V70s, 314 XC70s, 274 S80s, 119 S40s, 46 V40s, 67 C70s, and the remainder in miscellaneous customer-owned Volvos. *Saab* lost more than 500 cars, mostly 9-3s, while **BMW** lost 335 3, 5 and 7 Series models. A

Volvo spokesman said all lost vehicles will be scrapped (duh!). As

a result, deliveries of XC90s (sold out through May) will be delayed by a few weeks'...

Saturn (cheaper) will get minivans in 2004, General Motors VP John Middlebrook said... Daimler Chrysler 'Smart'?! Word is that Smart cars will arrive in the U.S. before the end of 2004. Official press material lists 2005 as Smart's U.S. entry date, but word is that the company will launch its U.S.-spec, Brazilian-built hatchback—called "Forfour"—by December 2004... Jeep Peekup! Jeep

will sell a pickup derivative of the *Wrangler* in 2004. The *Scrambler*, developed initially for military use overseas, goes on sale as a 2005 model in mid-July

2004...Studebaker returns?!?
The Avanti Motor Corporation
(www.avantimotors.com) premiered the Studebaker XUV at the Chicago Auto Show. The first
Studebaker produced in 37 years, has a starting price of \$75,000 and includes many luxury features.
The Studebaker XUV (which stands for "Xtreme Utility Vehicle") is 215.5" long, 80" wide, and 79.6" tall with 5-speed automatic transmission, and comes with a choice of a V8 Turbo Die-



sel or V10 (unleaded gasoline) engine. Built on a Ford truck platform, it has a 12-inch longer wheelbase, two more inches of ground clearance and can tow nearly twice the weight of an H2. It is also the first vehicle of its kind to offer rear sliding doors, and comes standard with a retractable rear top that completely opens up the back of the vehicle. Chairman of the Avanti Motor Corporation Michael E. Kelly says, "The Studebaker name is

timeless and it represents one of the best auto makers in the history of the automobile." (Ed. Note: That's why they are still around, eh?) Keeping with

the Avanti tradition, owners can choose any exterior color (Whoa! Whatta concept!), as well as every interior detail including the trim and color of their custom leather seats (another novel idea!). During the first model year, they expect to produce approximately 150 vehicles. Standard safety features include anti-lock brakes, driver/passenger airbags, side door beams, and built-in rear view camera. Development is also

## Toy(ota)s in NASCAR!?!

While it's years from an official announcement, word is that an agreement has been reached between *Toyota* and *NASCAR* for *Toyota to race in Winston Cup in* 2007 (three years after it starts in the Craftsman Truck series in 2004).

In a related development, Toyota Motor Sales, U.S.A. recently announced historic plans to par-

ticipate in the NASCAR Craftsman Truck Series. Toyota Tundras will make their debut at Daytona International Speedway in February

2004. Toyota has assembled the full-size Tundra exclusively at its Princeton, Ind., plant since its debut in 1999. "Everyone at NASCAR is looking forward to Toyota's participation in the NAS-

CAR Craftsman Truck Series," said *Mike* 

"Gimme Money" Helton, president (and chief whore) of NAS-CAR. "We feel their integrated approach to this series is going to provide our drivers, teams, tracks and fans many benefits. There are

many NASCAR fans working in Toyota facilities, manufacturing plants and dealerships throughout America. We know they're thrilled at

the prospect of a Tundra showing up in NASCAR Victory Lane (?!) in 2004." Beginning with the season-opening NASCAR Craftsman Truck Series race at Daytona, as many as six Toyota Tundra race

trucks may be entered for competition. Team affiliations will determined at a later date. Toyota Racing Development (TRD), U.S. A. will design, develop, and build the Craftsman Truck Tundra V8 to NAS-

CAR specs in its Costa Mesa, Calif., facility.

Toyota engineers are working on the carbureted V8. It's still on the computer at this point. One problem with the engine is casting it in iron. Most Toyota blocks are aluminum alloy, but engineers found a Toyota facility in Japan that still casts in iron. The *Craftsman entry* will feature a *Tundra* body and the *Winston Cup car* will be a *Camry*, "whatever the Camry will look like then," Toyota sources said.

The four-cylinder *Daytona Dash series* will reportedly be disbanded after this year. Toyota has won there as well, with the Celica model.






#### **Directions**

From the Baltimore Beltway

(RT 695): Take Exit 7, Route 295 (Baltimore-Washington Parkway) south towards Washington approx. 18 miles to Route 193 (Greenbelt Road), and exit. When on the offramp, stay to the right and merge right onto Southway (see below).

From the Washington Beltway

(RT 495): Take Exit 22 north, towards Baltimore. Stay in the right lane and take the first exit onto Route 193 (Greenbelt Road). When on the off-ramp, bear to the right and take Greenbelt road west, towards College Park. Stay in the right lane and immediately after passing over the Parkway, make a right (at the light) onto Southway (read on!)



Once on Southway: Go straight to the second (2nd) STOP sign.

Make a left onto Crescent road. Go to the STOP sign and make a right into the parking lot behind the Greenbelt Library. Once in parking lot, look to the right. The large, white building is the Greenbelt Community Center. Enter building using the doors near fenced tot lot. The multi-purpose room is on the second floor. There is an elevator to the left of the entrance.
