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### 1959 Rambler Curbside Custom Cruiser Wagon

A recent post on the Hobby Heaven message board included information about the upcoming release of this JoHan kit.

Unlike most companies, Johan packs as much information as possible in the box so you know what you are in for. The side has a color chip chart. (Not 100% accurate, but none are. The point is to give the builder a general idea of correct colors). The bottom of the box shows a drawing of the kit so that those unfamiliar with old technology will not expect a super detailed model. The side of the bottom shows how to convert the wagon to a delivery man pickup.

The 1959 Rambler Custom series 4-door wagon is from the original tool. The exterior is unchanged. The inside has had the huge "poles" removed that formerly served as oversized locators for the window glass. Pilot holes have been added in the roof for the taxi sign and police/ambulance light. Pilot holes have also been added to the cowl and doors for spot lights and mirrors.

The chassis is plain, flat, and undetailed *(curbside)*.

The first styrene interior ever available for this car makes its debut! As you may know, the 1959 interior was updated to the 1960 version, which was updated to the 1961 version. The kit has a 1961 seat pattern, but it is so lightly engraved that decals depicting "stock" seat and door patterns can be added after light sanding. The dash and steering wheel are from

the original 1959 tool. Decals are also added for steering wheel center, radio, clock, speedometer, gauges and Rambler dash script.

The stock chrome original bumper/grille assembly, rear bumper, 4 wheel covers and roof rack are back.


Optional parts will include items such as: taxi sign and decals; police siren, light, and decals for three different agencies; ambulance decals, stock Rambler decals, flames, full side custom woodgrain, and Ambassador decals provide a multitude of options. Custom accessories will include: two surfboards from the "Heavenly Hearse", luggage, bowling ball bag, spare tire cover and picnic cooler from the 1964-1966 Rambler American kits: lake pipes from the 1966 Rambler American, spot lights, antennae, fender mirrors, rear view mirror, steering column mounted tach, and under dash gauge cluster from the 1963 Plymouth kit; Moon discs from the 1960 annuals, and fender skirts from an unknown source (Stude maybe?).

In addition to interior decals mentioned above, the stock decals include three different stock side spears in red, black or wood grain, "Cross Country" and "Rambler" lettering for the tailgate, era correct 1959 license plates, "Rebel V8" logos for 8 cylinder cars, "Air conditioned" logos for cars so equipped, "R" decals for wheel centers. An optional set of interior and exterior Ambassador decals

are included. Commercial decals include complete sets for the Covington police, Dodge City police, and Branch County sheriff, including door markings and correct license plates; a

"Rambulance" red cross, quarter window lines, and St. Elmo's Hospital decals. The Taxi includes the roof sign, door markings and tags. Custom decals include a set of flames, a full side woodgrain decal as well as a correct Hansen surfboard and generic surfboard decals are included. Bogus Covington Beach Surf Shop and bummer Surf Shop are in it for fun. Also included are two "Ramblin' Rose" scripts complete with red roses, and a variety of vanity plates.

Miscellaneous decals will include: Whitewall, correct Frostie Root Beer, and Hansen surfboard decals for authenticity. The instructions include a factory paint guide and conversion tips. So, where are the kits?!

U.S. The car uses carbon fiber. monocoque construction, and a three-wheel design. After the Gravity Car Derby Festival in late-August in Irvine, California, the car will hit ebay, with the proceeds earmarked to go to America Works for Kids, a charity dedicated to helping foster children... Bolt of Lightning! GM is prepping a world sports car chassis for production versions of the Pontiac Solstice concept shown at the 2002 Detroit auto show (having progressed to the prototype stage, and currently under evaluation at GMs' proving grounds) and Vauxhall VX Lightning concept unveiled in England by GM's British subsidiary. The next Opel Speedster will also share the same setup. Like the Solstice, the VX Lightning concept is powered by a supercharged 240-hp version of GM's 2.2-liter EcoTec four-cylinder engine. The Lightning also sports a six-speed manual transmission, four-wheel independent suspension (all aluminum in the rear to help produce a 50-50 weight distribution) and rack-and-pinion steering...HHR Revisited. Looks as though the gang at Chevrolet are expecting to *sell* at least 100,000 of the retro-wagon HHR vehicles when they come out in 2006, at a price close to \$23,000. Sounds optimistic to me, since the PT Cruiser has most likely 'scratched that itch'...D-C liked it so much, they bought the

company! Rumor has it the Daimler-Chrysler brand is about to assume 100 percent ownership of *Ilmor*, which is expected to be renamed, and operations in Stuttgart will then be disbanded. Mercedes-Benz Motorsport plans to house its F1 engine program under one roof at Ilmor Engineering in Brixworth, U.K.... More power, Argh! Argh! Argh! Mercedes-Benz promised its SLR will pack a potent punch (an estimated 600 hp.) when it arrives this year. Well, M-B announced that the car will actually have 616 hp., able to rocket it from a standstill to 62 mph in just 3.8 seconds, with a provisional top speed of 207.5 mph, though this may change before production, based on gear ratios for the SLR's standard five-speed automatic transmission. Just what we need on the beltway for those early morning commutes...Shelby back home at Ford? Ford and Carroll Shelby are taking the next step in a relationship that began with Shelby serving as an adviser on the Ford GT. Ford officials say Shelby is back in the fold as part of a program to build a Ford/ Shelby concept car in time for the 2004 Detroit auto show in January. No one is talking about the concept or whether it might lead to a production car, but rumors of a Ford-backed Daytona Coupe offspring might be in the cards. That might explain why Shelby has been back in the news recently, fighting the importation of the Brock Coupe, a Superformance replica of Shelby's Daytona of old... Foreigner on track! The NASCAR Craftsman Truck

Series Toyota Tundra race truck, which will make its racing debut in February 2004 at Daytona, ran its initial test recently at Caraway Speedway in Asheboro, N.C. The historic session was the first for the manufacturer since it officially submitted the truck to NASCAR in July. Veteran racer Joe Ruttman handled driving duties at the 0.455-mile oval. The test was conducted to learn the Tundra race truck's basic characteristics. evaluate systems, and gain first impressions on down force and balance. It will continue testing throughout the fall in preparation for the 2004 season...New Subaru Rally drivers. Subaru Rally Team USA recently announced its new driver pairing for the team's second vehicle entry in the final two rounds of the 2003 SCCA ProRally series. Pasi Hagstrom and co-driver Marko Taskinen made their US ProRally debut at the Wild West Rally in Olympia, Wash. The driver lineup comes after the tragic loss of Mark Lovell and Roger Freeman at the Oregon Trail ProRally earlier this year... Hot rod Brits! A Welsh race-car driver claimed the first milk van speed record recently following a 73 mph run in a souped-up electric machine. Electric milk vans, called "floats," are a standard feature of British life, designed decades ago for quiet running, to avoid waking slumbering citizens when the milkman drops off milk at dawn. They are not known for speed, at least until Formula 3 racer Richard Rozhon got behind the wheel

## RC2 NASCAR Monte Carlo

The new breed of RC2 (the company formerly known as AMT/ ERTL) stock cars are here. Let's take a quick look.

Body: The body is molded with separate hood and trunk. The hood is missing the newly mandated tiedowns, whether molded-in detail or decals. The grille opening features a strange, seemingly oversized chicken wire mesh pattern. The trunk features a separate spoiler, with pins to securely attach it. The gas overflow tube is missing. In the trunk, the clear fuel inlet tube and overflow tubes are still present from the earlier release.

**Interior/Chassis**: The basic chassis/roll cage appears consis-

tent with the earlier release. The shifter is again two pieces, and the seat appears the same, with the apparent exception of the removal of the shoulder belts.

Engine: No SB2 here, folks. In fact, the kit actually includes the same type of tape-wrapped headers as in the first version, with one exception—they are chrome!

Wheels/Tires: New or modified tires that appear to be devoid of sidewall markings, and seam in the tread area. These mount open slotted rims, w/4-wheel disc brakes.

**Decals**: The smaller associate decals appear to be grouped on the larger main sponsor panels, a move that will speed application

time. Grille and airdam openings, head/tail lights, tire markings, and even tread labels are some of the items included on the sheet. Sadly, no gauge face decals are present.

**Chrome**: Yes, chrome! They spent extra money to include a chrome air cleaner, and headers.

Pick yer poison—RC2, or Rev-



ell. 1/25th, or 1/24th. With all the decals available, nearly any team is possible (even if not currently produced by RC2 or Revell).

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## Model Buffet



## Directions

From the Baltimore Beltway (RT 695): Take Exit 7, Route 295 (Baltimore-Washington Parkway) south towards Washington approx. 18 miles to Route 193 (Greenbelt Road), and exit. When on the offramp, stay to the right and merge right onto Southway (see below).

From the Washington Beltway (RT 495/95): Take Exit 22 north, towards Baltimore. Stay in the right lane and take the first exit onto Route 193 (Greenbelt Road). When on the off-ramp, bear to the right and take Greenbelt road west, towards College Park. Stay in the right lane and immediately after passing over the Parkway, make a right (at the light) onto Southway (read on!)



Once on Southway: Go straight to the second (2nd) STOP sign. Make a left onto Crescent road. Go to the STOP sign and make a right into the parking lot behind the Greenbelt Library. Once in parking lot, look to the right. The large, white building is the Greenbelt Community Center. Enter building using the doors near fenced tot lot. The multi-purpose room is on the second floor. There is an elevator to the left of the entrance.
