Chinese Connection

Revell-Monogram is moving to a 200,000square-foot facility in nearby Northbrook by Jan. 1. Its domestic manufacturing operations are also being phased out early 2004 and relocated to China, making it the

last major plastic-model maker to move manufacturing overseas.

Revell-Monogram's current-tooling will move overseas About 150 tools will be moved to a facility near Hong Kong, where the company has

an office. Unused tools will be stored at the new facility.

Revell-Monogram will also expand their line with Tiger slot-car accessories, a Monogram line from the 1960s. It will debut in March and feature driver, crew, and officials figure sets.

New Diecast goodies! Apparently, our own MAMA's Boy Bill Geary just got his new Exoto catalog, and couldn't wait to share! Watch out for: 1954/55 Mercedes Benz W196 Streamlined, 1964/66 Ferrari 275 GTB and GT/4, 1960/61 Ferrari 250 GT SWB Berlinetta, 1959/61 Maserati Tipo 60 and 61 Birdcage, 1956 Lincoln Continental Mark **II** (all 1/18th scale), and a **1959** Aston Martin DBR1 (late 2004, no scale listed). He also listed a host of *superdetailed 1/43rd scale* cars, such as: 1965 Cobra 427, 1955-1957 Jaguar D-type, 1959 Ferrari 250 TR59, 1960-1963 Aston Martin DB4GT Zagato, 1962-1964 Ferrari Lusso. Thanks Bill... Four-Wheel Drive GTO?! *Holden* is reportedly gonna offer permanent four-wheel drive in the *Monaro*, the right-hand-drive equivalent of the reborn Pontiac GTO. The two-door revealed at the recent Sydney motor show also gets a host of exterior styling changes. The car goes on sale in Australia next June, but it is doubtful the four-wheel-drive system will make its way to the U.S. due to problems with fitting lefthand drive and the four-wheeldrive system into the car. They are already working on a solution for left-hand-drive cars, which it hopes to adopt in time for the next-generation Monaro/Pontiac GTO due out in 2007..."Here Come de Judge?!!" The 2004 GTO has yet to arrive on these shores, but I'm already hearing

rumors about the return of Pontiac's spoof of the psychedelic decade! Rumor has it that it will be done not by Pontiac, but by Ed Hamburger, a.k.a. *SLP Perform*-

ance! It is reported to have a horsepower rating of 421 hp.! Imagine, bringing that famous number back from Pontiac's past to power a special GTO...No more

Pontiac in Nextel Cup series?! Following the end of the 2003 NASCAR season, GM will consolidate its resources in NASCAR to exclusively support the *Chevro*let Monte Carlo and further advance and solidify the dominant position enjoyed by Chevrolet in this series. "GM Racing will focus its 2004 NASCAR program on the Chevrolet Monte Carlo, and will no longer race or support the Pontiac Grand Prix race car," said Doug Duchardt, director of GM Racing. "This transition will enable GM Racing to strengthen its Chevy Nextel Cup program and,

at the same time, work with Pontiac on its future racing plans."
Thanks to Jayski.com, for the bad news..."Pumped Up" Silverado SS pickup?
Not surprisingly, Sport Chevrolet, in nearby Silver Spring, is pushing an 'exclusive' Supercharged Sil-

verado SS pickup called the SS-500. It is supercharged to produce over 500 horsepower, and also includes a race-inspired heavy-

duty brake system, and dual catback exhaust. Wonder how much that adds to the *forty-large bottom line*...*Hot Rod SSR!* That partnership between Michigan's spe-

cialty car developer

bears its first fruit at

the form of the West

Coast edition of the

Chevrolet Super Sport Roadster. Already fitted with an ASCdeveloped retractable hardtop, the West Coast SSR is lowered four inches in the front and six inches in the rear, and adds running boards, a louvered hood and decklid. But the best part is under the hood, where a supercharger boosts the SSR's 5.3-liter V8 by 120 hp to 420 hp... Tuckered out. Preston Tucker Jr., son of the automaker, died Oct. 12 in his home in Scottsdale, Arizona. He was 78... GT Cruiser Coupe? Unveiled at the SEMA show, Chrysler suggested this PT Cruiser fol-

low-up possibility. It is built from a two-door PT convertible. With suspension and drivetrain borrowed from the Dodge SRT-4, it is powered by a 255-hp, 2.4-liter turbo four linked to a five-speed manual transmission driving 19-inch wheels. Don't look for the

coupe—or its 900-watt, 18speaker sound system—to make production....New Bugatti Boss!

VW has appointed a former investment banker, Thomas Bscher, to head up its troubled Bugatti division. The German takes over from Karl-Heinz Neumann, who plans to retire at the end of 2003 after a 38-year career with Volkswagen. Bscher is best known for his exploits behind the wheel of the McLaren F1 GTR. in which he won the 1995 FIA Global Endurance Championship and finished fourth at Le Mans in 1996. Bscher's priority is to get the delayed Bugatti Veyron supercar to customers by April...Chevy 'Toons.' The new Chevy Colorado Sport (formerly known as the

Xtreme?) comes with Bilstein shocks, lowered sport-ratio coil springs, quick-ratio

steering, 17-inch low-profile allseason tires and aluminum wheels, fog lamps, wheel flares, grille surround, center bar and bumpers. It is only available in *red*, *black*, white and vellow. It comes with either a 2.8-liter, 175 hp fourcylinder engine, or a 3.5-liter, 220 hp inline-five. Both have a fivespeed manual transmission...

Crossfire misses the mark? The Chrysler brand casts the flashy Crossfire as a halo car to get upscale customers into showrooms. But after four months of sales, the \$35,000 sports car is off to a modest start. Dealers report the car is selling at sticker, and waiting lists of eager buyers have not materialized... Global Volvo. Volvo and **Pininfarina** have formed a joint venture to design and build the next generation Volvo convertible. It will be the first time Pininfarina


has built a car outside Italy. The new venture, called Pininfarina Sverige AB, will manage Volvo's factory in Uddevalla,

Sweden. Pininfarina will own 60 percent of the joint venture. The firm will be managed by a combination of Pininfarina and Volvo execs...New 'moons' for Saturn?! Saturn's lineup will double to six-vehicles within the next three years. They have announced plans to add the *Relay minivan* next year. The other two slots could be filled with something

> similar to the Sky concept roadster unveiled in 2001, and a sport wagon for the 2007 model

year...Morgan returns to U.S.! The new *Aero 8 GTN* should race in the Daytona and Sebring enduros early next year. Not only is it planning to use the races to prepare for an attack on Le Mans, but the Aero 8 road car will be launched in the U.S. market early in 2004. Morgan team manager David Dowse said: "Doing Daytona and Sebring will tie in with the Aero 8 going on sale in America, but it will also help our Le

Mans program. Our long-term goal is to do Le Mans, and we will do as many races as possible to help us get




company owner David Saville Peck was out to prove the Super7, which evolved from the 1950s Lotus Super7 roadster, is the fastest production

road-legal car built in Canada. The current evolution of the car is built in Chemainus and is powered by a 185 horsepower, 1,300 cc Suzuki motorcycle engine. The event, co- sponsored by Nanaimo Flying Club, attracted a large crowd of spectators and media. "I was amazed at the number of people that turned up," said Peck. "I didn't really think it would be much of a public event because how interesting can it be to see some car going backwards and forwards down a runway." Ladysmith RCMP and Speedwatch volunteers came out to clock the car on radar as Peck attempted to set new acceleration, breaking and top-speed records. "We shattered every Canadian record known to man," said Peck. Times clocked included a 0-100 km/h time of 3.78 seconds, and a standing quarter mile time 12.4 seconds at 174.6 km/h. The car was run in various configurations from full road trim to stripped for racing. The highlight of the event was the

> fastest top speed in reverse attempt. The car was clocked at 164.47 km/h, just shy of the world rec-



ord of 165.08 km/h. It was extremely difficult to control in reverse at those speeds. "The most difficult thing was trying to stop," he says. "And actually, I spun out every time I tried to stop"... Last **Beetle!** Production finally stopped June 30th after 21.5 million VW **Beetles** came off the line. Of this number, only the final 3000 came in what VW de Mexico calls the *Ultimo Edition*. This meant chrome bumpers and trim, whitewall tires, and a CD player. Otherwise they're not a lot different than the millions of other Beetles still circling the planet. (Thanks to autoweek.com, as well as other Internet sources for this insanity!)

Reference

A new magazine hit the newsstand recently, *Hemmings Muscle* **Machines**. The second issue, November 2003, is out now and it's a winner (the premiere issue is still available through Hemmings). The goal of this new arrival is to display American muscle cars of the 1950's through the 1980's. If you wonder what a 1950's or 1980's muscle car would be, check it out.

They promise none of the standard Camaros and Mustangs found elsewhere. Prominently featured in Issue #2 is the cover car. an Australian 1975 Ford Falcon, the basis for the Interceptor used in the *Mad Max* movies. If

you're thinking "Falcon, what the heck does that have to do with performance?" you need to look closer.

Also included in this issue is a Tri-Power 1960 Pontiac Ventura *hardtop*, a head to head test of a 1966 Buick Wildcat vs a 1970 AMC Rebel Machine, and much more (Ed. Note: Don't forget the 1962 413 Dodge Savoy, or the vintage drag racing and Trans Am Javelin photos Matt!).



Directions

From the Baltimore Beltway (RT 695): Take Exit 7, Route 295 (Baltimore-Washington Parkway) south towards Washington approx. 18 miles to Route 193 (Greenbelt Road), and exit. When on the offramp, stay to the right and merge right onto Southway (see below).

From the Washington Beltway (RT 495/95): Take Exit 22 north, towards Baltimore. Stay in the right lane and take the first exit onto Route 193 (Greenbelt Road). When on the off-ramp, bear to the right and take Greenbelt road west, towards College Park. Stay in the right lane and immediately after passing over the Parkway, make a right (at the light) onto Southway (read on!)



Once on Southway: Go straight to the second (2nd) STOP sign. Make a left onto Crescent road. Go to the STOP sign and make a right into the parking lot behind the Greenbelt Library. Once in parking lot, look to the right. The large, white building is the Greenbelt Community Center. Enter building using the doors near fenced tot lot. The multi-purpose room is on the second floor. There is an elevator to the left of the entrance.
