New Bimmer Concept

BMW is not very different than most car manufacturers lately. They, like most others, have reached deep within their past to draw forth a new concept known as the BMW Concept Coupe Mille Miglia

The car draws upon one of BMW's mostr famous race cars, the BMW 328 coupe. It melds this heritage styl-

ing with underpinnings from today's BMW Z4 M Coupe.

The car is powered by a modified version of BMW's inline six that powers the Z4 M Coupe. Mods have been made to the inlet and exhaust systems of the 343 hp engine to give the concept more of a growl. Meanwhile, the suspension rides on 20-inch alloys shod with 245/40 R tires.

The car was produced to celebrate BMW's participation in one of the world's great motor races, the Mille Miglia, which was resurrected in 1977 as an annual rally. All vehicle models that competed in the original races between 1927 and 1957 are permitted an entry. This year, 22

"Mount 'n Goat" Commando Jeep—Wild Commando off-road Jeep with oversided (?), rugged terrain tires, roll bar, brush guard, domed hood, off-road suspenson, & removable top. Features detailed V6 engine & colorful graphics; 1937 Chevy Coupe—Build as the "Hubbard Engineering" gasser

with blown 454 V8 engine, or factory stock version with Stovebolt Six engine. Options include wide rubber tires, custom interior, hood, grille, and bumpers; Li'l Yeller Custom School **Bus**—The scholar hauler with soul. Features custom school bus body design, blown 427 Ford engine, raked frame, chrome wheels, tandem slicks & super wide low profile tires; Li'l Mixer Custom Cement Truck—The Li'l Mixer is an authentic vehicle attraction. Features custom

cab with mixer drum, delivery chute, tandem slicks, ultra low profile front tires, mag wheels, blown 427 Ford engine with exhaust dumps and full color decals. All of these kits will be molded in white, while the latter two were originally release in 1970 Save yer money... *Plenty 'O Prancing*

Horses! The gang at GMP are set to release (in limited quantities, natch!) a 1/6th scale 3.0-litre V-12 250 Ferrari GTO engine. It is even more unique in that it will feature a starter button and working 5-speed allowing both upshifting and downshifting, with a realistic Ferrari engine sound! It will also include a case and glass cover to protect your investment. It'll cost ya only \$499.95 (U.S. funds only), and will be available in August. Check out their website http://www.gmpdiecast.com/... Nova Too Late! While on the

subject, GMP is also releasing not one, but **TWO** different versions of a 1971 *Rally Nova*—in your choice of either black w/white stripes, or Orange w/black stripes. Only 500 copies of each will be produced, and they'll set ya back only **\$64.95**. They are also gonna release a 2006 GTO in two more colors—Cvclone Gray Metallic, and Brazen Orange *Metallic*. These will be a bit more readily available, with 750 of each color produced, and will cost ya

\$99.95 a pop. . If, for some strange reason, you don't have access o a computer, you can reach 'em at 1-800-536-1637... Challenger to Bow in 2008! It was announced on the Pepsi 400 NASCAR broadcast on the Fourth of July weekend that Dodge would bring the Challenger to

market as a 2008 model. So, if tis one floats yer boat Mopar fans (both of you—Ha! Ha!), save yer money! And if it does actually get the go-ahead, can an R/T version be far behind?! And while on the subjet of Dodge, looks as though the Caliber, the Neon replacement, is a definite hit. Dealers are selling the cars as fast as they can get their hands on them. Some dealers have as many as 60 backorders for the Caliber, while some dealers have as much as a 142-day supply of Dodge's larger SUV, the Durango, in stock, not moving. On average, a Caliber takes 10 days to leave the dealer's lot, even though they've been on sale for five months now. The average transaction price (minus cash rebate), is sitting at \$18,100 right now, compared to a 2% drop in price for the 300. Guess it's the right car at the right time for Dodge, eh?...SMART Choice? After years of flipflopping more than a politican chasing votes, DaimlerChrysler has finally made it official—it will launch the successor to its twoseat Smart minicar in the U.S. in 2008. They announced the successor to the Fortwo will be available in U.S. markets in three model configurations. In addition, the vehicles will be distributed in the U.S. and Puerto Rico through a dealer network assembled by UnitedAuto Group, Inc., a company chaired by Roger Penske. DCX is hoping to sell an estimated 20,000 Smarts a year in the U.S. and expects most of its sales to come from urban centers along the east and west coasts. Bringing the subcompact to market is seen

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as an effort to capitalize on higher U.S. gas prices as well as providing an alternative to BMW's Mini venture. According to DCX, the initial rollout of retail outlets is expected to start in mid-2007, with the official launch of the brand planned for later that year. The vehicle is expected to be sold beginning in early 2008. Yet more Chrysler news. The Chrysler group will need to blow its horn more often on the subject of fuel economy, says company sources. For example, the Chrysler 300 is rated at 21 mpg city and 28 mpg highway with its base 2.7-liter V-6 engine, compared to the (in) famous 6.1-liter Hemi V-8, rated at 14 mpg city and 20 mpg highway, according to government figures. Chrysler is emphasizing new technologies that improve fuel economy, such as the continuously variable transmission, available on the Dodge Caliber small car; and cylinder deactivation, which Chrysler refers to as multidisplacement, available on all versions of Chrysler's 5.7-liter V-8 Hemi engines. The system reduces fuel consumption by shutting off four cylinders when the engine is running at cruising speeds, allowing the car to run on four cylinders...New Miata hardtop? New for 2007, Mazda is engineering an

optional folding hardtop for its popular Miata convertible. The MX-5 Power Retractable Hard **Top** makes its global debut July 18th at the 2006 British International Motor Show in London. The car goes on sale in August or September in the U.S. Mazda correctly notes that a removable hardtop has been an option on the MX-5 since its launch in 1990, with a cloth convertible top standard. Along with the global debut of the MX-5 Power Retractable Hard Top, the *Mazda Sassou* and *Ka*bura concept vehicles will also be shown. Mazda MX-5 with a power retractable hard top roof will be known by different names around the world: In North America, the Mazda MX-5 Power Retractable Hard Top; in Europe, the Mazda MX-5 Roadster Coupe; and in Japan, the Mazda Roadster Power Retractable Hard Top. Better start savin' yer money now, Walt...New Lotus CEO Now, Esprit Replacement in 2008! Lotus named a new CEO and con-

firmed the Esprit replacement goes on sale in spring 2008. Lotus vet Mike Kimberley, who took over as interim chief exec May 11th, announced the Esprit plans and named Bob Braner as chairman of Lotus Cars USA. Braner was previously boss of Lamborghini in the U.S. when he worked with Kimberley. It will continue with a mid-mounted engine, possibly from BMW, and a bondedaluminum chassis. Lotus hopes to sell up to 2500 per year (Thanks to the Washington Times, autoweek.com. and other Internet sources for this insanity! Ya just can't make some of this up!! Thanks also to those of you in the 'Peanut Gallery' who have attempted to help me entertain y'all by sending along items for publication—I 'preciate it! As soon as word spread of Tamiya's announced future release of a *1/24th scale Mercedes-Benz SLR McLaren*, finishes were already being arranged for it in giddy anticipation.

available July 1st, 2006. Speculation is that eventually the SLR could become available in any of Mercedes' factory colors. Watch for many more Mercedes-Benz factory finishes to be added to their catalog if that happens. *Note*: At least one SLR was painted a white pearl finish for a member of the Kuwaiti Royal Family. This finish may be Antigua White **Pearl**. a tricoat finish listed in Mercedes' 2006 formula database which does not appear to be available on any Mercedes-Benz production vehicle. Antigua White Pearl will be added to the catalog immediately upon verification that it is the exact match for the white pearl SLR. So far, no known sources can confirm this.

Currently available, but previously unannounced, are *two new Lamborghini finishes* including the official *Italian State Police Azzurro Polizia blue* finish accurate for use on all modern Italian State police

vehicles including the Gallardo. New Lamborghini finishes currently available are: *Azzurro Polizia* (2004-06), and *Bianco Isis* (2001-06). Additionally, the range of all-new colors, among which include the commonly seen Verde Picus and Celeste Phoebe pastel colors, is expected to be included in 2007 manufacturer paint formula databases.

The missing link color for

Porsche's Carrera GT will also be available July 1st - Fayence Yellow. This rare Porsche bright yellow solid finish

is exclusive to the Carrera GT.

Back to this side of the pond, *Viper Slate Crystal Pearl* will also be included in their July 1st up-

date to complete the range of available **2006 Viper** colors. Other news from **Dodge**—

besides the recent production run of *Charger R/T's* painted in allnew *TorRed*, future R/T's are expected to include *Plum Crazy* and *Sublime* limited editions.

Chevrolet will be dropping **Daytona Sunset Orange Metallic** for the 2007 Corvette and replacing it with **Atomic Orange Metal-**

lic which is also confirmed to be a color option available for the Z06.

Six of GM's hottest shades for the awesome *LS2 powered Pontiac GTO* are also now available. Strip your pre-painted Polar Lights kit, or start from ground zero with AMT's unpainted kit and decorate it with one of their authentic GTO factory formula finishes, as follows: *Brazen Orange Metallic*, *Spice Red Metallic* (both 2006), *Impulse Blue Metallic* (2004-05), *Cosmos Purple Metallic* (2004), and *Barbados Blue Metallic* (2004).

Aston Martin's own DBR9 Racing Green Metallic, a factory formula reserved exclusively for the DBR9, is now available in their newly added "Foreign Factory Colors - Aston Martin" section of the online store.

All of these finishes will be added to their catalog as soon as the formulas for them become

available. Thanks to Leon for keeping his lineup current! We 'preciate it, Leon! I gotta get some of that Goat paint!!

"World's Most Expensive Lemon?!?"

The US owner of an exotic, 12-cylinder Mercedes has sued its maker for a \$2.3 million refund on :The world's most expensive lemon."

Mark Johnston bought the Mercedes-Benz AMG CLK-GTR roadster, one of only five produced and the one in North America, for \$2.3 million in 2003.

The Guinness Book of World Records lists the car as the most expensive production vehicle ever.

"The car turned out to be exotic in the worst possible way," said Johnston, a former Ferrari mechanic. "It just doesn't run."



The 6.9 litre, 12 cylinder engine can rocket the car from 0 to 200kmh in 9.9 seconds, with a top speed of 320kmh.

In theory.

But this car could not even make it 10 blocks, said Johnston.

Johnson, who owns Grand Prix Motors in Los Angeles, took it out for a test drive with a potential buyer.

Then, he claims, the oil gauge lit up, and the transmission failed. The car promptly broke down on a Beverly Hills street and was towed back to the showroom.

The roadster is made of carbon fibre, has a steel roll cage and an energy-absorbing crash box.

"The car is truly a work of art," said Johnston.

"It just happens to be a work or art that won't work."

Johnston expected to resell the car for between \$3.4 million and \$4 million, and believes it could someday fetch up to \$6.8 million.


New Bimmer (contd)


Condolences




Thas' All Folks! Directions





From the Baltimore Beltway (RT 695): Take Exit 7, Route 295 (Baltimore-Washington Parkway) south towards Washington approx. 18 miles to Route 193 (Greenbelt Road), and exit. When on the offramp, stay to the right and merge right onto Southway (see below).

From the Washington Beltway (RT 495/95): Take Exit 22 north, towards Baltimore. Stay in the right lane and take the first exit onto Route 193 (Greenbelt Road). When on the off-ramp, bear to the right and take Greenbelt road west, towards College Park. Stay in the right lane and immediately after passing over the Parkway, make a right (at the light) onto Southway (read on!)



Once on Southway: Go straight to the second (2nd) STOP sign. Make a left onto Crescent road. Go to the STOP sign and make a right into the parking lot behind the Greenbelt Library. Once in parking lot, look to the right. The large, white building is the Greenbelt Community Center. Enter building using the doors near fenced tot lot. The multi-purpose room is on the second floor. There is an elevator to the left of the entrance.
