*Racing Limos (http://www.racinglimos.com/)!


The business, founded in 2002, offers limousines designed to look like stock car racing cars (and trucks). Their first limo was based on a Grand Prix.

Dodge Charger R/T

[Testors Lincoln Mint Ultra Detail kit, 1/24th scale; 152 pieces, Skill Level 3]

I'm intending this to be a mini-review, but this kit is so impressive, I hardly know where to begin. Okay, let's start with the box. Huh? Well, the box opens from the end panel because the parts trees are stacked from the end. Each parts tree is sealed in clear plastic bags AND tiewrapped to a piece of heavy cardboard. There is also a larger piece of cardboard, to firm up the box, and hold the 12 page instruction booklet.

The engine consists of 35 parts, including eight separate rockers, fuel injection runners and a **SEPARATE OIL DIPSTICK!**The transmission is built up from three pieces. True to the 1:1 car, most of these wonderful details will be hidden by the top engine cover. Ten more items fill the underhood area.

The chassis is assembled from 25 highly detailed parts. From the looks of the instruction booklet and the parts themselves, this kit

appears to have been tooled from the actual blueprints from the real car. After this model is built, it definitely needs to

be displayed on a mirrored base so all these details are not missed.

The interior builds up from the floor pan. The dash is made up from 5 parts. The center console *ALSO* is built up from 5 separate parts. The two-piece front bucket seats receive *SEPARATE SEAT BELT LATCHES AND SEAT ADJUSTMENT LEVERS!*

Chromed door handles are added to the highly engraved door panels. There are two interior door post covers, a separate headliner piece and two sun visors!

Twenty-seven items are added to the one-piece body, including all of the "glass" which mounts

from the outside. The head and taillights chromed reflectors receive clear plastic covers. The taillight covers will need to be tinted with clear red paint.



(Obviously, the kit instructions recommend Testors Stoplight Red, but Tamiya clear red would be much more convincing) Sure, there are separate mirrors and wiper arms but are you ready for a SEPARATE GAS FILLER DOOR?

The chromed stock wheels are very nicely engraved and mount tires with very good tread detail. Unfortunately, due to the current trend of corporate greed, there isn't any sidewall detail, such as tire brand names.

I haven't assembled the kit, but from visual inspection and test fitting many of the parts, this kit is certainly as good, or better, than recent offerings from Trumpeter *AND* it doesn't appear that the builder has to correct any major errors. It is also sold at a lower cost then Trumpeter kits, at least it is if you buy it from Ron Bradley.

I've just touched on the highlights of this kit. To say it is an impressive offering from Testors could be the understatement of the new year. If Tamiya kits are your benchmark, I think you'll now have another one.






Lane home.


Godspeed to all of you...Justice is
Served! An auto racing promoter was convicted recently in the slayings of racing legend Mickey
Thompson and his wife, who were shot to death in 1988 while leaving their gated home for work. Michael

Goodwin was a former business partner of Thompson, a motorsports figure who pursued landspeed records in Utah and

drove everything from dragsters

and funny cars to midgets. Goodwin, 61, was accused of sending hit men to kill the couple as revenge for a business deal that went sour and led to a legal judgment of more than \$700,000 against Goodwin. When the verdict was read, Goodwin



only shook his head slightly back and forth. He could get up to life in prison. Two unknown assailants on bicycles entered Thompson's gated home on March 16, 1988, and shot him and his wife as they left for work. The attackers then escaped through woods where a car could not have traveled... SS to Pontiac?! GM is expected to expand Pontiac's U.S. product line with another rebadged reardrive Australian sedan. The Holden Commodore SS will be called the Pontiac G8 and priced around \$25,000, according to the Herald

Sun in Melbourne, Australia. An official announcement has not yet been made by GM honcho Bob Lutz, but it is rumored that

much more will be revealed at the Chicago auto show... And Speakin' of Pontiac! For the first time since it debuted in late 1989, Mazda's MX-5 Miata is not America's favorite budget two-seat sports car. That honor now belongs to the Pontiac Solstice. Heading into the final weeks of the year, the swoopy \$20,000 Pontiac sports car had a commanding sales lead over the venerable Miata. And there are no asterisks, either: Both cars came

out in 2005, so this is their first full year of head-to-head competition. Through November, Pontiac sold 18,361 Solstices, compared with 15,873 Miatas. Pontiac padded its lead in November, chalking up sales of 1,305, compared with just 995 Miatas. This race could be even more interesting next year. Expect greater availability of the high-performance *Solstice GXP*. And Mazda will offer a *Miata* with a *folding metal roof...Expensive*



Oops! The nephew of fashion designer *Carla Zampatti* has been charged with driving three times over the legal alcohol limit after his \$300,000 Ferrari recently slammed into a traffic light in Perth. The Ferrari 360 Spider was purchased by Colin Zampatti just last month, and collided with the traffic pole about 8 p.m. outside the Windsor Hotel in south Perth. Many onlookers at the pub. on the intersection of Mill Point Road and Mends Street, started taking photos of the car after the incident and the images have been circulated around the world. A West Australian police spokesman said Zampatti, who celebrated his 42nd birthday the day after the

crash, has been charged with driving under the influence. The blood alcohol level Zampatti returned in a breath test was not clear, although he had to have blown at

least 0.15—three times over the limit—to be charged with that offence... *Funny Impala SS?!* No, not Ha! Ha! funny. Apparently, the *NHRA* hass approved the '07 Impala SS for competition. The new Impala SS funny car, which

has been over a year in the making, is the first GM drag race body devised and developed utilizing a 3-D computer-aided-design process, something GM Drag Racing Group Manager Dan Engel has wanted to do for a long time. "There was no physical model that we were working from,"

said Engel. "It was all done on a computer. Once it was designed and a CAD file created, the file was sent to a CNC machine, and it cut out the shape as it was designed on the computer screen." Working within an extensive list of parameters established by NHRA, GM engineers first had to accumulate mathematical data on the production Impala and then design the new race car conforming to the tolerances

established by the sanctioning body. Look for its debut at the CARQUEST Auto Parts Winternats in



Pomona, CA, on Feb/. 8th—
11th... What?
No SS?! Chevrolet will show off the new
Equinox Sport at the North
American International Auto
Show this

month. Chevy adds a 3.6-liter 263-hp V6 and a performance exhaust system to the Equinox for a whopping 42-percent power jump over the previous range topping LT version. Sport also gets a new six-speed automatic with Tap Shift. Ride height is lower and suspension tuning stiffened for increase handling responsiveness. Styling features include exclusive body-colored front and rear fascias and 18-inch wheels. Chevy also chops off the roof rails and rack for a sleeker look on the Sport. Equinox Sport goes on sale in the third-quarter of 2007 as a 2008 model. Front- and all-wheel drive will be offered. Surprisingly, Chevrolet opted not to slap an SS badge on this sportier Equinox officials say they plan to be more discriminating with their use of the division's Super Sport designation in the future. It's about time, don't ya think? (Thanks to the Washington Times, autoweek.com, and other Internet sources for this insanity! Ya just can't make some of this up!!

Model Buffet

Okay gang, it's been a little while. This month's column is gonna highlight another apparent homerun hit by MAMA's Boy, *Harold Bradford* of *Historic Racing Miniatures*.

We're gonna take a peek at his latest creation, the *Cheetah*. The kit lives up to Harold's high standards, both in parts count (a.k.a. 'fiddly bits,' as he calls 'em), and quality of fit and finish.

From what I'm told, the parts count of the kit is approx. 120—125 pieces (not quite the 170 or so fiddly bits included in H\$M's Cobra Daytona Coupe). As in

other kits, it's molded cleanly in white resin, and includes the unique clear windshield.

built the model
pictured here, which
debuted at last
month's club meeting
to raves. As in the
Cobra Daytona, the
price of admission

ain't cheap at \$175, but if a picture tells a thousand words, there's about 5,000 words as to why you should buy this kit if you are into Cheetahs! Great job Brad and Gordon! If interested, it is my



belief that you can get 'em not only from Brad (14008 Adkins Rd, Lauerel, MD 20708), but Replicas & Miniatures Company of MD (317 Roosevelt Ave SW, Glen Burnie, MD 21061), too.









AACA Hijinks!

Norman, Dave and I made our annual Post-Christmas museum trek, this year we chose the *Antique Automobile Club of America* (AACA) *Museum*

(www.aacamuseum.org) located in Hershey, PA, about an hour and a half from Baltimore.

The Museum not only has a permanent collection of vehicles from the inception of motorized transportation, but also features some incredible cars from private collections you won't have an opportunity to see under one roof.

The museum has a rotating exhibit schedule. In addition to permanent collection vehicles that were used in the new Robert DeNiro/Matt Damon movie "The Good Shepherd," they currently have the "Top Brass: Horseless Carriages 1890-1915" exhibition open until May 31, 2007. If you are interested in what was available to the public from the emerging automobile industry, you've got to check out this display. We were particularly awed by the size of one particular Touring Car, which we discovered is an Oldsmobile. That thing is *HUGE*! Check out the website to see what's up next for the rotating exhibition (unfortunately, we missed the American muscle car display

that ended in October).

Downstairs, in the "Museum of Bus Transportation", they have a completely restored vintage Valentine Diner brought in from Wichita, Kansas that you can enter to see how small these really were back in the day. This one, The Flo-Inn was open from 1948 to 1983.



One of my personal faves on display is the black (one of the three colors offered that year) 1954 Corvette with 87 actual miles on the clock displayed near the re-created vintage gas station. You can also try, as I did, to jam you big backside in an Austin Bantam. I thought the Miata was small!



A special event of interest to modelers is the "Inside Out" weekend scheduled for May 26th through 28th, 2007. The museum will have door, hoods, and trunks open on all the vehicles on display. It's a rare opportunity to get a look inside these great cars.



We spent about three hours touring the museum, which makes this an excellent choice for a day trip. Or, schedule a night at the Marriott SpringHill Suites hotel, a few yards walk away, and take the kids to Hershey Park, too.



Since we had a little time to spare, we stopped at *Kranzel's R/C Raceway & Hobbies*(www.kranzelsr chobbies.com) in Lemoyne, just across the river from Harrisburg. They recently replaced their indoor oval R/C dirt track with a large carpeted platform that allows them to create an endless array of track layouts. They carries a nice selection of model kits and building supplies and is well worth a stop.

Finally, since we were enjoying the World Tour of South Central PA, we made an emergency candy toasted peanut stop at Brown's Orchard & Market in Loganville (right off RT 83) before disembarking at the Norman Veber Park n' Ride lot in the Hereford Zone. A fun day!



Directions

From the Baltimore Beltway (RT 695): Take Exit 7, Route 295 (Baltimore-Washington Parkway) south towards Washington approx. 18 miles to Route 193 (Greenbelt Road), and exit. When on the offramp, stay to the right and merge right onto Southway (see below).

From the Washington Beltway (RT 495/95): Take Exit 22 north, towards Baltimore. Stay in the right lane and take the first exit onto Route 193 (Greenbelt Road). When on the off-ramp, bear to the right and take Greenbelt road west, towards College Park. Stay in the right lane and immediately after passing over the Parkway, make a right (at the light) onto Southway (read on!)



Once on Southway: Go straight to the second (2nd) STOP sign. Make a left onto Crescent road. Go to the STOP sign and make a right into the parking lot behind the Greenbelt Library. Once in parking lot, look to the right. The large, white building is the Greenbelt Community Center. Enter building using the doors near fenced tot lot. The multi-purpose room is on the second floor. There is an elevator to the left of the entrance.
