# It's De sale of De Century!

Though *DeSotos* were never as popular as Fords or Chevys, hundreds or even thousands of devoted DeSoto fans and collectors were expected in Spencer, Iowa recently for what one Iowa collector sees as "history in the making"—the auction of more than 50 cars, at least one from each year of production, from '28

to '61, and several other collectible cars.

In his 20 years with the *National DeSoto Club*, Lee Exline of Grimes, Iowa, says he's always wanted to attend a national convention that featured a DeSoto from each model year.

"It's never happened. Nobody has ever been able to put it together," Exline says. "Now we find that one guy did it all by himself. And he (Chris Binder, who farmed southwest of Spencer) was very quiet about it. He didn't tell people he had such a collection."

While Binder was seen driving his yellow '28-'29 DeSoto Roadster around the area, he only registered one car as a

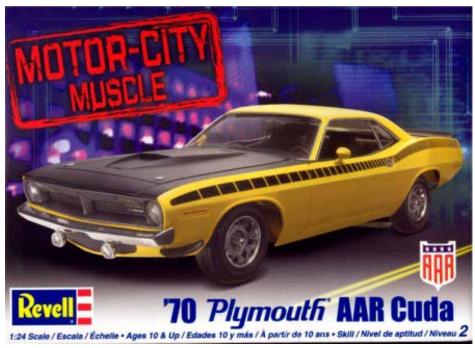

#### '70 AAR Cuda

[Revell #2875, 1/24th scale modified reissue]

I have been building model cars about 45 years, and I have never seen a kit so maligned before it was released for sale as this one. With the advent of the Internet, there were numerous negative opinions vented on the various model message boards, as well as word of mouth at several model club meetings around the world. A lot of the opinions were based on a test shot of the kit at the NNL East this past March, which was displayed with other upcoming kits from this manufacturer. Revell promised us a "newly tooled" body for this kit, and we were waiting with baited breath. Revell did do a new body, but they did not take the route that most of us had hoped they would. I did not see the model in person until I bought this kit, but I did see photos taken at NNL East. From the various photos I saw, I too thought this kit looked a little "cartoonish" as compared to the real car. Part of my bias came from the first iteration of this kit from this manufacturer. We were promised a state of the art new tool of this automobile, and what we got was...well, needless to say I was quite disappointed in what I saw when I opened this kit. It was one of the few kits I bought, that I gave away soon after I bought it, it was that bad. One of modelers who was present at NNL East had a conversation with one of the officials from Revell, who told him, and I am paraphrasing what I read, basically, what you see here, is



what you're going to get in the new kit. Honestly, I was not expecting much from this kit, but I thought I would give it a fair shot in a review.

First of all, I took the body out of the box, and made comparisons of it with a couple of other '70 Cudas I have in scale. The first is an original MPC '70 Cuda that I have, as well as a Franklin Mint '70 Cuda Convertible. I am basing my opinions using the two aforementioned models as a guide, as well as several photographs of the real car from the book

"Challenger and Cuda - Mopar's Factory Muscle Cars," by Robert Genat. This is the best book about these cars I have ever seen, and is a valuable resource for researching these cars. In looking this kit over, it is not too bad proportionwise. While there are some problems with the rear quarter panels, this one is far better than the aforementioned '70 Plymouth AAR Cuda offering, and it looks better to me that any of the '71 Cuda iterations from this manu-

facturer. In my opinion, there is too much of an arch on the upper rear quarter panel and the bottom looks to be about 1/8" too short. Along with that, the sail panels look a little shallow, effectively shortening the roof. These three items give the car a "hiked up" look in the back end, as well as making the deck area appear too long. While these aspects of the body proportioning are unacceptable to some modelers, it will not deter other modelers from building an outstanding example from this kit. I did not compare this model with the Monogram '71 Cuda, because in my opinion, that kit has its own issues with certain proportions in its body, which affects it's appearance.

It is obvious that Revell based this kit on the '70 Challenger T/A tool, instead of the '71 Cuda tool, so some proportion problems would obviously be evident. First of all, the Challenger has a wheelbase 2" longer on the real car, but about 1/16" in 1/24th scale. Looks

#### **Scarab Road Racer**

[Revell/Monogram #0124, 41pieces; straight reissue; metallic blue, black, clear, chrome & plastic, MSRP \$11.50]

**Pros**: A very obscure subject for the average man to remember, so a welcome reissue. Parts for you old slot car guys!

Cons: Body doesn't fit display chassis very well, shifter is out of sight when model is finished.

The Car: Seems this kit also represents a car with a very illustrious history (like the Predicta). It was the last (and only) rear engine racer ever produced by Reventlow Automobiles Inc. It was built for Mr. Reventlow's own use and what a car it was! It was like nothing before with every inch tailored to the "big man's" specs. It was pure "business." Total weight was around 1500 lbs (!) and after the change from Olds to Chevy power, it's final bhp came in at 425 horses (not bad for a 327!)! With this combo, many

victories were achieved

in '63 & '64.

The Model: It is a throwback that yours truly knew nothing about until

'97 when it was reissued. Unfortunately, the kit suffered water damage, making it a builder, which brings us to the kit at hand.

**Engine**: MIA, but the more skilled among us could surely fabricate some sort of detailed engine/chassis combo for this one. Otherwise, it is a curbside at best.

Wheels/tires: Three pieces each, with a chrome rim, black "rubber" tire and body colored wheel back. I gave the wheel backs a flat black paint job and black washed the chrome rims.

**Chassis**: The display model's "pan" is one piece w/two plastic axles for the wheel/tire combos.

**Interior**: This unit consists of three pieces; the "tub," roll bar and the shifter. I also brought this to life with a little detail painting.



**Body**: The finished body consists of twelve pieces (I combined parts from both slot car & display versions); it was not painted but waxed out with some Novus #2.

**Decals**: Decals include the appropriate original markings. Mine were lost to water damage, so I raided my decal collection.

Final Assembly/thoughts: This kit helped get me out of a rut and didn't turn out too bad. The box art and instruction sheet were both beautifully reproduced and highly educational. BTW, A.J. Foyt drove this very car to a second at Laguna Seca in '63. This is what caused the change from Olds to Chevy power. Those of you building a collection of this man's cars may want to consider this kit. Oh and did I also mention, parts for you old slot car folks?!

I give this model 4 paint bottles (out of a possible 5). Recommended.

to me that the extra wheelbase was hidden, as the wheelbase on this car matches my Franklin Mint model perfectly. The wheel openings are a little larger on the kit than the Franklin Mint, and the rear fender issues were based on the comparison with the same car. Other than that, the car looks spot-on to me. These cars had short roofs, and the narrow sail panels really accentuate that fact, so the kit may not be off too

much in that respect.

Now, Revell did make one glaring omission in this kit, that can be easily corrected. The Challenger T/A and the AAR Cuda had tires on the rear of the car that were two sizes larger than the fronts, and this feature was omitted from my kit. My Challenger T/A kit had the staggered tires, but not this kit.

I looked the rest of the kit over, and it should go together quite easily. I'm a little picky, so I am going to correct the rear quarters to what I think they should be, get the right rear tires from my parts box, and build my interpretation of a '70 AAR Cuda. I will be buying more to build other variations of a '70 Plymouth Barracuda, with a little kit bashing, parts box raiding, and scratch-building skills. I'm sure the aftermarket will make items for this kit, as a lot of the Model Car Garage's '71 Hemi Cuda photoetch set will work with this kit.

Have an open mind about this kit. No model kit is perfect, and this one came out as a pleasant surprise. I recommend it.

#### **New Stuff!**

Well gang, the big *iHobby trade show* was held in late October, and it yielded some pleasant surprises. Read on for the details, and make plans for what you want.

#### **Accurate Miniatures**

Accurate Miniatures related some sad information to me. Their last reissue of the *Corvette Grand Sport Coupe* did not do well, so they are likely not to do the *Grand Sport Roadster* or the *Cobra 289 variant*. All they had on display at the show were aircraft models.

#### Lindberg

Lindberg had a big display, a lot of which was there last year as well. The 1/6 scale 6.1 liter Hemi is out in kit and built up and two variations of a Ford Flathead are coming out, one 1/4 scale and visible. The second one is 1/6 scale and kit or built-up. A Prototype of a Ford Model T engine was also there.

Lots of new *Dodge concept* vehicles box artwork was displayed, including the *Rampage P/U concept*, *Demon concept and Challenger concept*. *Dodge Charger Super Bee*, *Viper SRT-10 coupe* and *convertible* were shown as well. The boxes said 1/24 scale.

For Emergency Vehicle fans, there is the 1/32 American La-France 900 Series Pumper. They had the *Raminator Monster Truck* on display, as it is now out. Also, they're doing a lot of the previous Testors kits like the '37 *Fords*. The Lindberg representative said they actually owned those molds.

In trucks, more variants on the **Dodge L-700** including a **box trailer** and **flatbed** with **crushed autos**. They also had a bunch of the **Weird-Oh's figures** box art on display as well as some of the models.

The *Hawk* side of Lindberg is mostly diecast autos as well as the aforementioned Weird-Oh's.

#### Revell

Revell had the biggest amount of new and reissued kits. In the *Hot wheels snap kits* for '08, there will be a '69 Camaro Z/28, '63 Corvette Sting Ray and Dodge Concept Car.

Of note in the reissue side is the '50 Ford Pickup. The kit now includes corrected Ardun heads. I forget if the exhaust headers were corrected as well and will need to follow up on that.

The '30 Ford Woody now has a '32 grill shell and the sample looked quite nice.

A *new '32 Ford Sedan* is due out with a *new tool flathead* and *Ford small block* options.

Continuing in the theme of redoing diecasts in plastic, the *Up-town Cadillac Escalade* and '58 *Chevy* are due out. Rumor has it that the '58 includes the stock parts.

Finally, from the diecast side, the *Subaru WRX STi* will be released.

From the Revell Germany connection, the *Ferrari 599 GTB Fiorano*, *Audi R8* and *Audi R10* 

are due out. Cheaper prices for the US version, and white plastic bodies.

A '70 Dodge Challenger and an '08 Challenger (1/25th scale) are due out. Revell indicated they are contemplating a production version of the Camaro as well, but did have the Snap version of the Concept on display.

On the Ford side, a '68 Mustang GT, '07 Shelby GT500 and '07 GT350H are coming.

For the GM camp, we get a '57 Chevy 150 (Black Widow) in both stock and racing trim. It will have the FI engine. The racing version will have roll cage and no back seat. I have an outstanding question on whether the six lug wheels depicted in the artwork are there. The artwork was "photoshopped" so it contains some inaccuracies. Revell indicated those inaccuracies are not going to be in the kit.

Also shown, and currently on the cargo ship to the US, is the '55 *Chevy hardtop*. Besides some custom options, you'll also get a *window tray with food and beverage*. How's that for an extra?

Finally, the big surprise is a '69 Nova SS with small block Chevy engine that can be done in stock or drag racing versions. The body looked accurate from my viewpoint and, of course, Revell's very nice big block Chevy can always be substituted. Remember that Model Car Garage already has photoetch for a '69 Nova.

#### **Stevens International**

Steven's International is doing two AMT truck kits, the *Mack Cruise-Liner* and *Autocar A64B Tractor*. As previously stated in

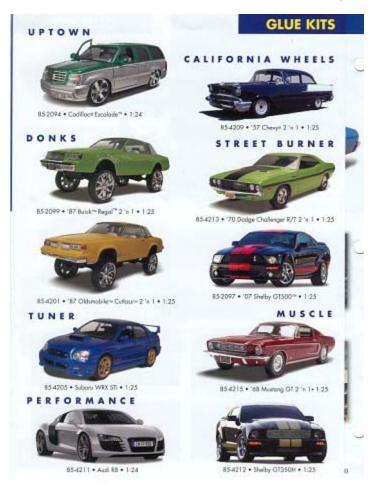

#### This 'n That

Diecast Madness! **Danbury Mint** is releasing a limited run (5,000) **'69 Dover** White Nova SS w/blue top & interior, the "California Kid" '34 Ford 3-window coupe (designed by Pete Chapouris, and on display at last month's meeting!) (produced for calendar year '07 ONLY!), and finally, a Gulf Turquoise '67 GTO convertible an HO 4-speed car yet (Ya just KNEW I hadda get this one in here, now didn't ya?!), your choice, for only \$140.00 plus \$7.80 shipping and service each (4) payments of \$36.95 each). Not to be outdone, the gang over at GMP will release two more 1/24th scale '70 GTO variations (Palladium Silver and Pepper Green, with black interiors), and two 1/18th scale '70 Judges (Cardinal Red and Polar White, both with red interiors). They should be out in December (just in time for Christmas?)... 'Physcho' MAMA **Prez?!?** Didja know that Lyle could predict the future? Seems that way. Remember his 'Bel Camino' '57 Chevy? Well, Danbury Mint just announced their own version!! DM's will be white over black, and include all the working features we've become accustomed to. As usual. it'll set you back the usual \$140 plus \$7.80 shipping and service (payable in four monthly installments of just \$36.95). Coincidentally, R.M. Co. of MD. proprietor Norm Veber discontinued this original item from his line quite some time ago...SuperVette?! Autoweek has

been reporting on a 'Super Corvette' for a few years, and GM had Vette fans salivating at Laguna Seca, when it wheeled out the upcoming *Corvette Blue Devil* for some hot laps during the American Le Mans Series race weekend. The vellow car ran a few laps, then was loaded back onto the hauler. Rumor has it that the new Vette, known so far as Blue Devil, will be called the ZR-1 when it goes on sale sometime next year. Sting Ray and Corvette **SS** are also possible names. Look for the **6.2-liter supercharged V-8** to crank out in the neighborhood of 650 hp. 1500 to 2000 engines a vear will be hand-built at the GM Performance Center outside Detroit and feature an integrated intake manifold intercooler similar to the one GM developed for the Cadillac STS-V. Expect the price to be between \$100,000 and \$125,000... Defunct Mopars? The 'New Chrysler' is effectively killing the slow-selling Chrysler Pacifica, the Dodge Magnum wagon, and the PT Cruiser and Crossfire convertibles. The company also may cut its Jeep Commander. Its sales are down 23 percent this year. Simultaneously, they plan to add the **Dodge Journey crossover** and **Dodge Challenger**, and two hybrid SUVs, the Chrysler Aspen and Dodge Durango. Additionally, Chrysler said it will slash 8,500 to 10,000 hourly jobs before the end of '08. Another 1.000 salaried jobs also are being cut. along with about 37 percent of its contract workers, the company said. Chrysler also will eliminate hourly and salaried overtime. The cuts in the hourly workforce

would equal about 17.5 percent of the company's 57,000 union employees in the US and Canada... The 'Rock' Sold?! According to The Charlotte Observer, Andy *Hillenburg*, owner of a Harrisburg racing school, bought Rockingham's North Carolina Speedway for \$4.4 million at auction recently. The track, which he outbid seven others for, was for sale after it lost its spot on NASCAR's Nextel Cup schedule in '04. The track, which sold for about \$100 million later that year in a legal settlement, has a tax value of \$30 million. Hillenburg said he would move his racing school at "The Rock" and also would hold a race—likely a Hooters Series or Auto Racing Club of America event—there in '08... Close Call! In an incredible coincidence. Prodrive boss Dave **Richards** and his wife, **Karen**, survived a *helicopter crash* just 24 hours after the accident which claimed the life of his former driver, *Colin McRae*. Richards, who mentored McRae to his World Rally Championship in '95, was returning home from the Belgian Formula One Grand Prix when his helicopter suffered a mechanical problem and crashed into a field near the historic North Weald Airfield in Essex in southeast England. He was piloting the helicopter when it crash landed, then tipped on to its side. Both Richards and his wife walked away from the crash and were treated at the scene for shock. Prodrive runs **Subaru's World** Rally Championship operation. developed the FIA GT sports car operation for Aston Martin, oper-

ates the Prodrive V8 Supercar team in Australia and plans to enter the Formula One World Championship in '08. Richards also recently lead the consortium which bought Aston Martin from Ford...WRC Retirement! BP-Ford World Rally Championship driver and series points leader Marcus Grönholm announced that he will retire from driving at season's end. The 39-year-old Finn has been contemplating his future for several months. Grönholm won the WRC title while driving for Peugeot in '00 and '02. After winning the Finnish championship four times, he made the breakthrough into WRC in '99 but did not complete a full season until the following year, when he won his first title. He and codriver Timo Rautiainen have scored 30 career wins so far, second on the all-time pairings list, with five of them coming this season. Rautiainen also announced that he will retire. Ford of Europe President and CEO John Fleming acknowledged Grönholm's contribution to Ford's WRC successes. BP-Ford team director Malcolm Wilson also paid tribute to Grönholm. Both Petter Solberg and Markko Martin have been mentioned as possible replacements for Grönholm. Happy retirement, guys...Disappearing Cars at Christie's? Christie's, the worldfamous auction house, will no longer sell automobiles. The company announced recently that it is shutting down it's International Motor Cars division

Christie's International Motor Cars was established in '72, and in '07 held sales in Paris, Monterey and Greenwich, Connecticut. Since its inception. Christie's International Motor Cars has held sales in London, LA, Monaco, Geneva. New York. Australia. Florida, Vermont and Switzerland. Earlier this year, the company's car auction division was at the center of controversy when it offered for sale a vehicle touted as the '39 Auto Union Type D V12 believed to have won the '39 French Grand Prix. The car was eventually pulled from Christie's Paris auction after it was discovered that the car was not the race winner but actually another Auto Union that finished sixth in the same race. It had been expected to sell in the \$10 to \$15 million dollar range, but didn't meet the minimum once it's origin was established... Mustangs (& Camaros) Corralled?! Remember the item in last month's T 'n T about the trials and tribulations of Unique Performance, in delivering tricked out *Eleanor Shelbys*, and Foose Camaros and Challengers? Well, now the story gets ug-a-lee. The authorities down in Farmers Branch, Texas (home of Unique Performance headquarters) have wrapped up a monthlong investigation into allegations involving improper vehicle ID numbers on cars undergoing makeovers. A Farmers Branch Police spokesman said his department, in concert with Texas State Police and officials from the Texas Department of Transportation, searched five Unique Performance shops in the Dallas area Nov 1st and 2nd No arrests were

made, but authorities did *confis*cate 61 cars displaying improper or illegible VINs. Impounded were 58 Ford Mustangs and three *Chevrolet Camaros*, all in various stages of repair. Further investigation is needed to determine whether charges will be filed against Unique owner Doug Hasty or other company employees. A number of customers reportedly placed sizable deposits for cars no word yet on whether the company or Shelby will honor commitments or refund deposits. Police did not seize any cash or freeze any bank accounts as part of their investigation... **Zoom** Zoom at 40? Felix Wankel was a dreamer. In 1919, at age 17, he dreamed that he invented an engine. It took him 38 more years to produce a working rotary power*plant* and still more to perfect it for production. His first working rotary went into an NSU 50cc motorcycle that claimed a world speed record of almost 120 mph with it. An agreement in '61 allowed *Mazda* to develop a rotary based on his ideas. After working out technical problems in early prototypes (rotor wall wearing, and rough low-speed performance), Mazda launched its first rotary, the *Cosmo Sport*, in '67. That makes this year the 40th anniversary of the Mazda rotary engine. Happy Anniversary Mazda! (Thanks to the Washington Times, autoweek.com, and other Internet sources for this insanity! Ya just can't make some of this up!! Thanks also to those of you in the 'Peanut Gallery' who have attempted to help me entertain y'all by sending stuff along—I 'preciate it!) \\ ₩

First off, the one that got me was their '74 Trans Am. It was

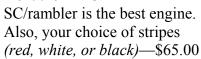
mastered by *Mike Kollver*. He took an original '74 Formula kit & used the origi-

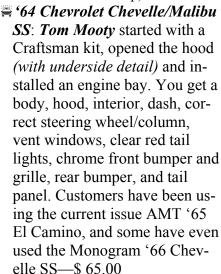

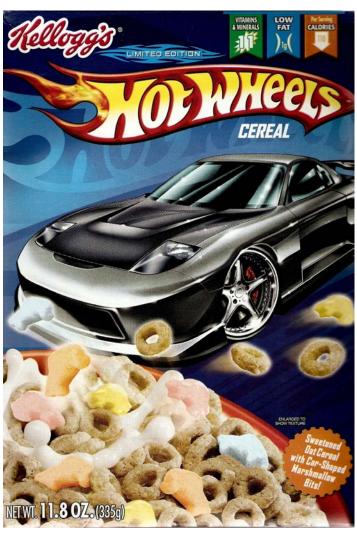

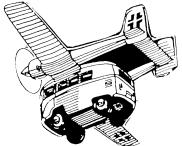

member of the DeSoto club. That was a '38 two-door rumble seat convertible. Binder reportedly loved the styling.

His newest DeSoto, a '61, the last year of production in the U.S., has *only* 6,000 *miles on it*.

The collection was offered at auction recently by the Estate of Constance Binder, Chris's wife who died in '06. Until his death in '94, Chris kept the cars maintained and registered each year so he could drive them. The license plates often indicated the year the car was made.

After bequeathing the Binders' land to neighbors David Killmer and Jackie Killmer and leaving \$5,000 to her brother in Des Moines and her sister in Clarion, Iowa, Constance Binder's Last Will and Testament expressed the "desire that all of the DeSoto collection of antique cars be displayed at either a public or private place in Clay County, Iowa."

But that desire was left to the discretion of the trustee, Central Bank of Storm Lake, Iowa.

"And that wouldn't have been

possible without selling some cars to maintain the museum," auctioneer Yvette VanDerBrink says.

With no practical site for a museum, Binder's will directed the DeSotos be sold at public auction and the proceeds left to Bethlehem Lutheran Church of Royal, Iowa, in memory of the Binders.

The auctioneer says that while she has a total figure in mind, she will make no public estimate on the amount the church might receive from the auction.

Based in Hardwick, Minn., VanDerBrink has been working on the sale for months and says there is worldwide interest in the rare cars, with collectors already placing bids online.

auction, VanDerBrink says
the items that have drawn
the most interest include a
'33 coupe, a '58 ambulance, a '49 "woody"
wagon and a '34 Dodge pick-up,
along with a '56 Firedome con-

vertible with a hemi engine.

Ten days prior to the

VanDerBrink sees the '56 Firedome convertible as the most desirable due to its rarity.

"It could be a six-figure car," she says, adding that, like all of the Chrysler products of the day, it

featured a push-button automatic transmission.

"I can't see the online bids until the sale on that lot begins. So I have no idea where the bids are. But we had one potential buyer, a collector from South Dakota, who offered six figures for the Firedome before the online auction began," she notes.

"This car (the Firedome) will set the market for others like it," as will several others in the auction she says. "The 'book' is irrelevant, because there have been no comparative sales for so many years. More than 550 collectors registered already to bid online during the sale. And many more bidders are flying in from more

than 10 countries"

The auction started with some parts and miscellaneous items selling first, then the cars. The order of sale, to be held indoors,

generally flowed from the newest to the older, rarer DeSotos, with a '34 Dodge pick-up and several other collectors' items mixed in.

#### **Directions**

From the Baltimore Beltway (RT 695): Take Exit 7, Route 295 (Baltimore-Washington Parkway) south towards Washington approx. 18 miles to Route 193 (Greenbelt Road), and exit. When on the off-ramp, stay to the right and merge right onto Southway (see below).

From the Washington Beltway (RT 495/95): Take Exit 22 north, towards Baltimore. Stay in the right lane and take the first exit onto Route 193 (Greenbelt Road). When on the off-ramp, bear to the right and take Greenbelt road west, towards College Park. Stay in the right lane and immediately after passing over the Parkway, make a right (at the light) onto Southway (read on!)
