GM 'Fire Sale?!'

Sprinkled in among the resto-mods, classic cars and a Ford Tri-Motor airplane that cross the block at the Barrett-Jackson auction in Scottsdale, AZ, this month were some pieces of GMhistory.

GM is sorting through 1,000+ vehicles in its Special Vehicle fleet at its private Heritage Center in suburban Detroit, looking for duplicates and little used vehicles to sell.

GM hasn't finalized

the list of vehicles to be sold, says Tom Freiman, manager of the Heritage Center. A list of sale vehicles posted on the Internet is not accurate, he adds. GM won't get rid of any one of a kind or milestone cars for the company, Freiman says.

Not all the vehicles will be sold next month. GM is also sending some heritage vehicles to Barrett-Jackson's auction in Palm Beach, FL, in April.

The vehicles to be

sold are ones that have been little used at the Heritage Center or were created for special events, such as the SEMA show in Las Vegas, Freiman says. GM has been working with B-J during the past five years to sharpen the focus of its collection, Freiman says. GM sometimes buys significant cars at the auction to add to its collection.



Hippe Hemi Dragster

[Auto World; 6 clear parts, 4 rubber tires, 28 white, 56 chrome]

This is one of the initial offerings from the new 'Auto World,' which makes it a re-issue of a modified re-issue based on the old **Don Garlits** Wynnsjammer dragster.

The *engine* is marginal at best. It's an early 392-type hemi with featureless block and heads, and the valve covers are ugly. They may have been correct for the Swamp Rat, but should be replaced. There are several other kits that can supply better-detailed engines. The engine in this kit is soft on external detail but has a chromed crankshaft with individual crank, blower and idler pulleys. The blower has chromed impellers as well and a rubber blower belt. All 'bottomed' off with choice of clear, red or green clear oil pans. It might be better used as a display engine in a

diorama, but with help.

The *chassis* is cast in left and right halves, which I think is better than the one piece method we get in newer kits because the

tubing is round rather than 'D' shaped. If you are attracted to shiny parts, this kit has twice as many chrome parts as white. The tube front axle is all chrome and steerable.

The *streamlined body* is what attracted me to this kit. It is only four pieces and totally impractical for competition due to poor forward vision, but it does make a rather kool lookin' kustom. In a new twist on an old kit, it has a choice of three canopies. One is clear; the other 2 are either clear red or green.



The *decal sheet* is as psychedelic as the name implies with no less than *eight different decals* for the nose alone. With different colors of paint, the combinations are infinite.

Also included is a *reduced size promotional poster* of the kit, a kit box approximately 2' x 3' to cut out and glue together and an 'AMT' peel and stick decal. The kit contents are silhouetted on the bottom of the box of this and other Auto World kits. A good feature which may not last.

The bad news is that after the swap on March 7th and 8th, the show will no longer be held at the Lucas County Rec Center!



Santa, gettin' some much-deserved R & R!

'64 Fairlane 'Quickie'

I recently purchased the *Revell* '64 Ford Fairlane Street Machine 2 'n 1 kit, hoping that the manufacturer made some significant changes. A few did occur, and while I am not surprised that one of the versions was a true "replica stock" version of the car, there were a few changes in the kit that made it worth a look.

There were a few parts added to the kit, which are:

- 14" steel wheels with a-c-c-ur-a-t-e '64 Ford dog dish hubcaps, and 14" tires
- flat hood sans hood scoop
- low profile oval air cleaner to use with the 427 engine
- glasspack mufflers with side exit exhaust pipes which attach to the exhaust headers
- new decals, with a fictitious racing team theme, and "Flames"
- inboard headlamp lenses and buckets

Fortunately, the parts to build an accurate "T-bolt" are still there, as well as the three wheel styles, and two different transmissions, which have been a part of the Revell T-bolt kit since its inception. It is also molded in crisp, white styrene.

With the limited amount of capital a company has to work with these days, I have to ask the question:

Why would a company devote additional tooling dollars to a kit that has been in continuous production in various liveries over the past decade, and end up with this result?

Don't get me wrong, the parts

provided in this kit are very welcome, and will build into an interesting street machine, but most modelers I

have been in contact with wanted to see the following changes in this kit:

Take the concept a little further, add a bench seat, a 289 V8 or dare I say, a 6-cylinder engine (ya heard it here first, Matt!!), with the appropriate interior and chassis mods to this tool to make a "Mainstream Replica Stock" build possible with the parts provided from the kit.

—Or—

A newly tooled 2-door hardtop body as either a *Fairlane 500*, or *Fairlane 500 Sports coupe*, with the aforementioned mods.

Neither of which happened, and the true "mainstreamer" rep-



lica stock builder will be disappointed in this kit. To build this kit as a true "Replica Stock," it will take a lot of work, aftermarket parts, and parts box raiding to make it happen. The dog dish caps, and steelies will have a home for me. Can we say *full size* "R" code '64 Ford Galaxie 500 from the old AMT kit? Why yes we can. The rest of the Fairlane kit will be built as a T-bolt with some aftermarket decals, or as a "As Delivered" race car.

Is this a nice kit? Yes indeed, but I feel that Revell missed the boat on this one.

Pontiac's Good News/Bad News. The Hot Rod '09 G8 GXP

will start at \$39,995, including \$685 destination and freight charges and \$1,700 in applicable federal gas guzzler taxes. Options include a \$695 six-speed manual trans and a \$900 sunroof.

Final EPA numbers are 13 mpg city and 20 mpg highway. *G8 ST DOA*. To no

one's great

surprise, GM told dealers recently that it has decided to cancel the G8 ST sport truck that was due to launch late this fall. The reason for killing the car is partly due to GM's "continuing vehicle review" to make the company viable for the long term, says Pontiac spokesman Jim Hopson. That includes Pontiac becoming a "niche brand" as GM outlined in a plan to Congress late last year. "With Pontiac being more focused on sporty fun to drive cars, we took a long look at the ST and it didn't fit with what our future vision of Pontiac would be," Hopson said. "At that point, we decided to not proceed with this vehicle." Although Pontiac plans to trim nameplates in the next three years to possibly one vehicle, the front-wheel-drive G3 will arrive on schedule next spring. The '10 G3 subcompact will have a sub-\$15,000 sticker price. It is essentially a rebadged Chevy

Aveo, but (thankfully!) won't have a long life in Pontiac's lineup. It is meant to help them through this period of time where fuel efficiency and affordability are the

two top reasons for people who are purchasing in that segment of the market..."Crushing the Competition?!" A Hawaiian Chevy dealer got a little more than he bargained for when he tried to crush the foreign competition literally. On Dec. 19. James Severtson, general

sales manager of *Island Chevrolet*, was planning a stunt to crush a few import-brand cars with the "*Hawaiian Rebel*" *Chevy Suburban monster truck*. Things started off badly. When it attempted to crush a *Honda Civic*.

the truck blew a hydraulic line, forcing it to be repaired. A few hours later, the truck reappeared to crush the Civic and a Hyundai Excel, to the delight of onlookers and photographers.

Severtson says he will crush a little more of the cars each day. "We'd like to send a message that the best way to support your country is to buy an American vehicle today"...Latest Camaro News. After months of teasing us with pictures, concepts and finally the real thing, all that's left for the

new Camaro is to crank up the assembly line so the car can hit the road this year. But there may be a glitch. GM is suing *Cadence Innovation*, a bankrupt interior parts supplier that is liquidating, to get back parts and equipment it needs for the Camaro. In standard industry practice, GM handed over the parts and machines to Cadence to make the Camaro parts. But even though Cadence is going out of business, it hasn't been in a hurry to return the equipment, as some company managers have tried to engineer a buyout to keep the firm going. GM says that if it doesn't get the production equipment back by early January, the start of Camaro production will be delayed. And that won't be good news to the Camaro faithful—especially those with one on order... High-Zoot M-**B**. The end of the line for the current SLR comes next year, but it'll be going out with a bang. Mercedes announced that the final

chapter of this generation will debut at the Detroit auto show. The *SLR Stirling Moss* is the second in the line to commemorate the legendary racer following the '07 release of the *SLR 722 Edition* honoring

Moss's '55 Mille Miglia race win. The SLRSM adopts drastic styling revisions hearkening back to Moss's SLR 300, with the carbon fiber body being sculpted in an arrow-shaped form, exclusive front fascia, long hood line and short rear overhang. The car also

ditches a windshield and roof, but will have two small wind deflectors to reduce airflow penetrating the cabin. Further nods to the past include: air scoops that house roll bars behind the passenger compartment, black ventilation gills affixed to the side and behind the front wheels and high side skirts. Mercedes took a minimalist approach with interior accommodations and simply lined the surrounds with carbon fiber, aluminum and high-quality leathers. An aluminum plate is engraved with Moss's signature and is mounted by the shifter. The cabin can be enclosed by two tonneau covers that are stored in the trunk when not in use. Power comes from the 5.5-liter supercharged V8 that also powered the 722 Edition with 650hp, enabling the SLRSM to run to 60mph in less than 3.5 seconds and reach a top speed of 217mph. Lots of wind tunnel work help make sure the Sterling Moss generated enough downforce to achieve high speeds safely—thanks largely to the SLR's closed underbody and the larger rear diffuser special to the model. Production of the limitedrun of 75 units begins in June and will carry a sticker price of a little north of \$1 million. Unfortunately, it will not be come to North America due to certification issues—mostly because of the lack of a windshield. As the most exclusive member of the current SLR family, Mercedes will only be offering it to select customers that already own an SLR in Europe... Prancing Yellow

Stallion? From the "Things We Don't Need But Want Badly" file comes Novitec's Rosso Ferrari 430 Scuderia. The German tuner of Italian hardware upped an already super supercar to 717hp, from the 510hp it comes fitted with out of the box. N-R was not timid with the parts list, starting with twin superchargers AND dual intercoolers (one for each cylinder bank), alongside a new engine-management system, highperf air filters, and larger injectors. It also added high-capacity

fluid coolant systems and additional plumbing for the compressors and intercoolers. The tuned Ferrari turns in a 0-to-62-mph time of

3.5 seconds and reaches 120 mph in 10 seconds. For handling, they lowered the car's center of gravity with sport springs. There's also an adjustable suspension that can raise the car as much as 1.6 inches for driveway entry and clearing speed bumps. According to Novitec, the car's new top speed is 216mph. The car gets the bumblebee treatment—yellow paint with black stripes, and three-piece black and yellow rims. Owners can choose any color combo they want for the interior. The cost? Take a customer Ferrari and add \$73,583. That was easy?!...Less is More?! With car prices reaching ever skyward, it is interesting to note that *Ford* motor company is doing its level best to **remove** two long-standard items from new vehicles—the radio antenna and the gas cap. Within

the next few years, the antenna mast should be replaced by either in-glass versions, or small roof-mounted satellite ones. As far as the gas cap is concerned, it is already MIA (missing in action!) on '08 Explorers, and '09 F150 and Flex vehicles. The system came from Ford's NASCAR racing experience, first appearing on the '03 Ford GT. Ford says that eventually all its cars will 'go capless'...London Taxis Made in China?! Yup. London Taxi International, which will

continue to build nine out of ten cabs used in Britain at a factory in Coventry, now also has a plant in Fengjing, China (a Shanghai

suburb), and actually has orders for 6,000 cabs, more than double the company's annual output in Britain. The cars will be more like status symbols, being bought by hotels, limo services, airports, and even a few collectors. The car's price was not available, but it is rumored to be cheaper than the British-made models, which cost \$54,000. Oh, and by the way, for more of an international flair, they are powered by 2.4-liter Mitsubishi engines

(Thanks to the Washington Times, autoweek.com, and other Internet sources for this insanity! Ya just cant make some of this up!!
Thanks also to those of you in the Peanut Gallery who have attempted to help me entertain y'all by sending stuff along—I 'preciate it!)

Auction Madness

The start of the new year means only one thing—Auction Insanity! Of course, we had Barrett-Jackson, with last years' auction hawking everything from 'Tribute Cars,' 'Recreation cars' (both just a nice way of saying **CLONES!**), to **guitars** and sheet music! Well, I guess we can now count on **Dueling Auctions**.

He memorably played a car thief in Gone in Sixtv Seconds, but Nicholas Cage is offering his '70 Plymouth Barracuda

through legal means: the Hemi hardtop was one of the headliners at Russo

and Steele's annual auction in Arizona (ironically, he also stole a Hemi Cuda in the movie). Detroit muscle via Hollywood-and it's rare too. His car is No. 128 of just 284 Hemi-powered '70 'Cudas with a four-speed manual transmission. It is "triple black" just as it rolled off the assembly line in November of '69. The

> powertrain has been completely rebuilt, and the Hemi has been broken in and tuned on a dyno. Other features in

clude the iconic pistol-grip shifter, super track pack, shaker hood and rallye instrument cluster and wheels. Race fans will want to check out a *Monte Carlo SS* that Dale Earnhardt Jr. drove to victory in March '04 at Atlanta Motor Speedway. It's refurbished, and the dash is signed by Junior. Also on the block: a '27 Bugatti Type 37 Grand, a '57 Ferrari 250 Testa Rossa, and a '55 Mercedes-Benz 300 SL Gullwing.

Meanwhile, the annual Kruse collector-car auction will have the usual classics—a '58 Mercedes 300 SL and a '66 Austin Healey among them. But interspersed among these and other gems is a white, '01 motor home. And just why, exactly, is this

seven-year-old Airstream notable? It's the former mobile quarters of *Baywatch babe Pamela Anderson*. And it was a gift to the starlet from none other than *Playboy mogul Hugh Hefner*. Anderson used it as a dressing room, according to the auctioneers. The listing says it's "fully loaded," and the features include a *disco ball* and, *uh*, *dance pole*. There also are pink Playboy bunnies on the seats and a mirror that reads "Lovestream." The auction was Dec. 19-20 in Las Vegas (\$30,000 bid).

Interested in riding in *Michael Jackson's limo?* How about owning it? In April it could be yours, as the King of Pop is selling a slew of his personal items, including eight to 10 of his cars, at an auction in Beverly

Hills, California.

The Bentley stretch limo is the spotlight car. It was custom designed by Jackson himself, replete with a plush leather, wood and gold interior.

"It'll be quite spectacular," said Darren Julien, CEO of *Julien's Auctions*, which is organizing the sale.

More details on the limo, and the other cars to be sold, will be available closer to the auction. Julien also said a tour bus is likely to be sold, though Jackson hasn't made the final call on which cars to keep.

In addition to the sheetmetal for sale, the auction will also include Jackson's famous *white*, *jeweled glove* and the *entry gates* to the *Neverland Ranch* in



California.

In total, more than 2,000 items will be on the block at a live sale April 21-25. Potential bidders can get a look at the goods April 14-20 at a museum-style exhibition next to the Beverly Hilton.

that's why. Terms of the settlement were not disclosed. Former employee Mauricia Grant was a tech inspector for the Na-

tionwide Series, and her suit also alleged wrongful termination.

Meanwhile, *Petty Enterprises* recently *released* former Cup Series champ **Bobby Labonte** to seek another ride. His departure from the team owned by seven-time champ and stock car icon Richard Petty may be Petty Enterprises' last gasp at staying alive for another season.

Meanwhile, other than **Bobby** Labonte leaving Petty Enterprises on Dec. 11, the most shocking offseason move took shape the weekend of Dec. 27: A.J. Allmendinger will replace Elliott Sadler at Gillett Evernham Motorsports in '09. Sadler had two years remaining on his contract.

Gillett Evernham Motorsports and Petty Enterprises remain in negotiations about merging their **Dodge-based teams**. If it happens, Sorenson likely will drive the No. 43, the ride that Labonte gave up.

Early reports linked Labonte to the No. 41 Chevy of Earnhardt-Ganassi Racing, but nothing official has been announced.

Bill Davis, struggling to keep his team afloat during a fruitless search for sponsorship, has sold majority ownership of both his race team and engine company.

Let's Go Racin'! Mike Held, a California businessman, and Marty Gaunt, an executive with Bill Davis Racing, purchased majority interest from Davis. The duo said they've also taken control of *Triad Racing*

> **Development**, which supplied engines, chassis and bodies for all three of NAS-CAR's top series. The new company is named Triad Racing

Technologies.

NASCAR will test drivers for performance-enhancing drugs in January under a tougher policy that also bans using illegal drugs and abusing prescription meds.

NASCAR will probably test drivers the third week of January. and crew members must submit results from an approved lab by Jan. 16. A memo to teams lists specific banned substances for which crew members must be screened. No similar guidelines were issued for drivers, as NAS-CAR reserves the right to test competitors for anything.

Under the old policy, NAS-CAR had the right to randomly test based on suspicion of abuse. Under the new guidelines, everyone will be tested before the season begins, and random testing will continue all year. NASCAR expects to randomly test 12 to 14 individuals per series each weekend in '09.

The guidelines were strengthened in part because of former Truck Series driver Aaron Fike's admission that he had used heroin—even on days he raced. That led Tony Stewart. Kevin Harvick and other drivers to call on NAS-CAR to add random drug testing

to its policy.

After a two-year hiatus, the SCCA Trans-Am Series will return, with a planned eight-race schedule for the series which held its first race in '66. Five of eight races were announced recently in Orlando, Fla., as well as the series' title sponsor for '09, Muscle Milk. A joint venture between Sports Car Club of America Inc. and its subsidiary. SCCA Pro Racing, the '09 Muscle Milk SCCA Trans-Am Series will consist of six events in conjunction with some of the biggest SCCA club racing events across the country, and two key professional events.

The series will begin its 42nd season March 21-22 at Road Atlanta as part of the Atlanta Region SCCA's season-opening national race. Three additional races will be announced shortly.

All events are expected to be approximately 90 miles in length with no pit stops. Announcements regarding regulations and series administration will be made shortly, although technical regulations will be based on current GT-1 rules from the Club Racing General Competition Rules (GCR) with additional potential safety requirements.

Throughout the years, some of the greatest names in motorsports have participated in Trans-Am. Backdating the drivers' championship to the inaugural season, 30 different drivers took titles, with multiple championships won by Paul Gentilozzi, Tommy Kendall, Mark Donohue, Scott Pruett, Wally Dallenbach Jr., George Follmer, Peter Gregg, Horst Kwech, Scott Sharp and Bob Tul-

lius. Gentilozzi leads all drivers, with 31 career wins.

A new series website is being set up at www.sccatrans-am.com. Future announcements will be placed there and at www.scca.com.

The **Detroit Belle Isle Grand Prix** is the latest casualty of the global economy in general and the Detroit area's struggle in particular. Longtime CART and IndyCar Series team owner Roger Pen**ske**—who spearheads the event in his role as chairman of the Downtown Detroit Partnership informed the Indy Racing League and American Le Mans Series that the race will not be held in '09. Penske felt that Audi's recent decision to effectively quit the ALMS in '09, combined with Porsche pulling the plug on its factory RS Spyder prototype program—run by Penske's team hurt the race, as did Detroit's poor economy. That reduces the '09 IndvCar schedule to 17 races, and the ALMS races to 10.

The newly formed *Formula One Teams Association* is taking
Formula One group CEO *Bernie Ecclestone* on to get a bigger slice
of the action. FOTA members are
concerned about the costs of servicing the huge debt that was
loaded onto F1 when CVC (F1
owner CVC Capital Partners director) *Donald MacKenzie* acquired a majority stake in '06.
This comprised \$2.4 billion in
bank loans, and \$2.6 billion of
internal loans. Recent publication
of the '07 financial results of the

U.K. holding company indicated that the *annual interest* amounted to a staggering \$497 million—enough money to operate two F1 teams the size of Williams, without sponsorship. Ecclestone is predictably not happy.

Hyundai is driving its performance stake (?!) into the ground with the *rear-drive Genesis*. It loaded up at SEMA with three sedans and three coupes.

The two main attractions were a 460-hp supercharged Genesis sedan, and the track ready Rhys Millen Genesis coupe.

The *D1 Drift Series Rhys Millen Racing Genesis coupe* has carbon fiber body panels, winglets on the front bumper, a giant wing on the back and a *2.0-liter turbo'ed engine*.

Meanwhile, Millen's planned New Year's Eve backflip stunt flopped. He was unsuccessful in a stunt where he tried to backflip an off-road truck at the Rio All-Suite Hotel & Casino, as part of



an event called "*Red Bull: New Year. No Limits.*" He had to travel a distance of 80 feet at a height of 50 feet to pull it off. Last year, he was hurt in a similar stunt when he overshot the landing in his final practice before the event.

Following Suzuki's withdrawal from the World Rally Championship, Subaru—the company that once nicknamed itself "the Ferrari of the WRC"— dropped a bomb by announcing that it's *quitting the sport*.

It was quite a shock—the team's Imprezas recently tested in France to prepare for the '09 season. However, it has been no secret for some time that the bosses of Fuji Heavy Industries— Subaru's parent company—were unhappy with the performance of the Prodrive-run team. The Impreza WRC has not won a race since Sept. '05, after Sebastien Loeb purposely lost time on Rally Great Britain following the death of British co-driver Michael Park, handing the win to Petter Solberg. The last time it won on merit was the Rally Mexico in March of the same year.

Despite adamant denials from GM road-racing boss Steve Wesoloski, anonymous sources insist that *Corvette Racing* will *skip the* '09 24 Hours of Le Mans as the operation looks to cut costs by focusing solely on its move to the GT2 class in the second half of next season.

The original plan for '09 calls for the team to race two GT1-class C6.Rs at the Mobil 1 12 Hours of Sebring to open the American Le Mans Series season, followed by appearances at Long Beach and Le Mans. The team would then contest select races in GT2 to finish the year, before a full-season GT2 effort in '10. However, sources say that word came down recently to reduce the racing budget, and cancellation of next year's GT1 outings is the solution.

Speaking at a GM press event in Detroit recently, a high-ranking GM official said they would quit NASCAR before it quits Le Mans.


