I had the pleasure of working with a young man on a Revell '65, so now I have an idea how to attack mine when I build it—*Thanks, Don—Tim* 







'GMC' has issued product recalls for the following vehicles:

lades/Escalade ESVs, Chevy Tahoes/Suburbans, and GMC Yukons/Yukon XLs over an issue with the rear suspension. A supplier provided 'GMC' with rear suspension bolts for the rear-suspension outercamber control arm assembly that may not have been properly heat-treated. These incorrectly heat-treated suspension bolts may weaken during use over time and potentially fracture.

The incorrectly heat-treated suspension bolts, which may be fitted to either the right or the left side of the SUV's outer-camber control arm, may fracture and misalign the rear wheel, increasing the overall risk of an accident or crash.

Since either or both rear suspension bolts can be affected, 'GMC' has instructed dealers to replace both rear suspension outer control arm bolts. The General will pre-ship an initial supply of rear suspension adjust link bolts, to dealerships known to have affected SUVs on their lots. This preshipment started on September 21st, 2023

The recall notice seems to indicate that no affected Suburbans/Tahoes have actually been delivered to customers at this point, with all units possibly still in dealer inventory. However, any owner with an affected unit who wishes to receive further information can contact Chevy customer

the subject of a new GM Service Update. The update identifies a potential brake fluid leak and what's required to fix it. The new Service Update was released this month. The bulletin covers Chevy Silverado MD trucks (4500, 5500 and 6500 HD) produced for the 2023 model year. According to the release, certain units may have a brake fluid leak at the brake pressure switch. In order to correct this condi-

#### C8 Watch

A 'GMC' engineer sustained life-threatening injuries after a crash in a '23 C8 Z06 at the GM Milford Proving Grounds. The crash occurred in June, and resulted in the C8 Z06 splitting in half and catching fire after it collided with a tree. Excessive speed is listed as a contributing factor in the accident.

According to a report from Detroit Free Press, the accident occurred on 'GMC's' Ride and Handling Loop, which has a posted speed limit of 75 mph. A police report indicates that the driver lost control and that the Z06 left the road, traveling 350 feet across adjacent grass before entering the nearby woods. The vehicle then reportedly collided with a tree, splitting into two pieces just behind the B-pillar near the driver's seat. The split occurred near the gas tank, igniting the vehicle on impact.

'GMC' was notified of the

crash roughly two minutes after the vehicle left the road. 'GMC' personnel called in a *life flight* to the University of Michigan Hospital. According

to a GoFundMe page created by the driver's sister, the 'GMC' engineer sustained multiple internal injuries and third-degree burns on more than 70 percent of his body, including his head and face. The GoFundMe page states that the driver will remain in the trauma ICU burn unit for life-threatening critical care for at least several months.

"We don't know what to expect for his life and if he will be able to overcome this tragedy, but his family is committed to supporting him through all that he will need," the page reads.

The driver, identified by <u>**De-**</u> <u>troit Free Press</u> as vehicle system integration engineer Shawn Getty, was reportedly conducting a rou-

> tine test drive at the time of the crash. The prototype Z06 had just performed a complete vehicle software update, which was already in place in production vehicles.

> > The GM Milford Proving Ground first opened in 1924. The facility has recorded eight



fatalities over the years.

Summer is winding down, and Fall is just around the corner. Seems like a great time to head to the beach for a little sun and surf. Unfortunately for this C8, its driver decided to take the midengine sportster all the way to the water, and, surprise surprise, it got stuck.

Coming to us from social media, the video is only a few seconds long, but captures the situation perfectly. It video appears as though it was taken from the cab of a pickup, which drives up on the stuck C8 as it struggles to free itself from the deep, wet sand. A large group of people are milling around as a few others push and pull on the C8's body panels.

As we can see, the rear wheels of the C8 are buried several inches in the sand. As the driver stabs at the throttle, we see the alloys scoop up several clumps of the stuff, burying the wheel deeper and deeper. It seems as though this tactic has been tried more than once, likely with exactly the same results.

As the camera moves away, we see a group of people pushing on the front end, trying to dislodge it from its hole. Funny enough, the pickup with the individual taking the video simply drives off, rather than help. It looks like the tide

tion, dealers are instructed to inspect the brake pressure switch for a specific lot code. If the vehicle has a brake pressure switch tagged with the suspect lot code, or the code is missing or unreadable, dealers are instructed to replace the brake pressure switch. Additionally, if there is evidence of a fluid leak, then dealers will need to replace both the brake pressure switch and the brake jumper harness.

The Brake Pressure Wiring switch is tagged with part number of 19409480. The fix may also require a wiring harness, battery terminal nut, DOT 3 motor vehicle brake fluid, and blue dielectric grease.

In other Chevy Silverado MD news, 'GMC' has implemented a new Customer Satisfaction Program with a reimbursement check for customers who were incorrectly charged for an Air Suspension Dump Valve. The reimbursement only applies to 2022 Chevy Silverado MD models, including 4500, 5500, and 6500 HD, with dealers issuing a \$60 reimbursement check to affected customers. 'GMC' techs will also replace the switch assembly and disable the Air Suspension Dump Valve switch and Low Pressure indicator.

In this modern age of globalization, vehicles produced by American brands may source parts from Korea, build engines in Mexico, and *manufacture vehi*-

cles in China. While many people takes this into consideration when purchasing a new vehicle, Mexican consumers don't seem to mind all that much, as a majority of new vehicles sold by GM Mexico are built in China.

In fact, the six best sellers—which includes the Chevy Aveo, Chevy Captiva, Chevy S10 Max, Chevy Tornado Van, Chevy Onix, and Chevy Groove were all manufactured in *China*, and represented a vast majority of GM Mexico sales over the course of H1 2023. Meanwhile, the two vehicles built in the US or Mexico—the Chevy Silverado/Cheyenne and GMC Sierra—claimed a minority of GM Mexico sales.

Indeed, it appears as though Mexican car customers may actually have a preference for vehicles built in China.

As can be seen in the graph above, the Chevy Aveo stands as the popular most vehicle sold by GM Mexico by a wide margin. To this end. 'GMC' recently launched the

next-gen 2024 Aveo in April 2023. Available in either a five-door hatchback or four-door sedan, the all-new Aveo will continue to serve as GM Mexico's best-selling product.

"The new 2024 Chevy Aveo responds to the needs of our customers, with great value within the offer of subcompact vehicles," GM Mexico Marketing Manager Wilberto del Ángel said in a statement. "The 2024 Aveo will allow us to keep current customers in this segment and most importantly, win over more Mexicans. That is why we call it the best Aveo that has ever existed."

As a whole, 'GMC' has been busy updating its Mexican offerings over the course of the past several years, with several mid-

cycle refreshes and vehicle launches that include: 2024 Chevy Captiva, 2023 Chevy S10 Max Pickup, 2022 Chevy Tornado Van, 2022 Chevy Groove and the 2022 Chevy Cavalier.

"Made In China" strikes again.

As a general rule of thumb, modern vehicles are far safer and more reliable than vehicles of the past, thanks in large parts to high levels of innovation and optimization. However, this isn't to say that newer vehicles are infallible, as the owner of a 2022 Chevy Suburban has had a rough going the past few months.

According to a report from Boston Globe, Corey Morris was driving home from a Christmas Eve party with his wife and kids when the Check Engine Light on his 2022 Suburban went off. Concerned and confused, Morris took his SUV to his local Chevy dealer, where he was informed that they couldn't do anything until they heard back directly from 'GMC'. His vehicle is equipped with the 5.3L V8 L84 engine.

This is where things start to get frustrating. Since December 2022, Corey Morris has been given the runaround from his Chevy dealer and from The General itself. To date, the response has generally been the same: a fix has not yet been released for the issue Morris is currently experiencing, and that he should continue to check in to learn if anything has changed.

"It's an unbelievable situation," Morris stated. "For sevenplus months I've been begging for help. But the dealership blamed 'GMC' and 'GMC' has been of no help. This situation is seriously impacting my life. It is impacting my stress levels, my sleep and all the hours of effort I

am having to put into a situation that is not my fault."

This has understandably been irritating for Morris, who will soon fail Massachusetts state inspections due to the Check Engine Light. However, shortly after Boston Globe released their report and contacted 'GMC' directly, the Detroit-based automaker finally reached out to Morris and informed him that he may need a new oil pump. That being said, Morris is wary that this will actually solve the mystery of the Check Engine Light.

"'GMC' is aware of concerns raised by Mr. Morris about his Chevy Suburban, and our Customer Assistance team will continue to work with him directly to resolve the matter as quickly as possible," a 'GMC' spokesperson wrote.

Sounds clueless, much like 'GMC' seems to be in general post-bailout.

While using vehicles designed for light off-road activities can be a great way to get outside and enjoy the outdoors, it's important to keep in mind the vehicle's capabilities, as well as the area you



intend to explore. Unfortunately one 2023 GMC Canyon AT4 driver was able to quickly find the limits of their pickup truck while climbing a Colorado mountain hiking trail.

According to a report from CBS News, the driver of a Canyon AT4 was fined for climbing a hiking trail in a pickup truck, and eventually getting stuck on it. Multiple hikers posted several photos of the midsize pickup on social media to complain of the misuse of machinery in places it shouldn't be.

Further compounding the issue, the Canyon was thoroughly stuck. After contacting a towing company to get a quote for removal of the truck, the driver then elicited the help of a non-profit recovery organization. After the latter was unable to dislodge the Canyon—which had its rear passenger tire sinking into loose rock and had also ended up highpointing on its rear differential the driver then accepted the \$3,500 quote from a towing business to get the midsizer unstuck. With the help of modified Bobcat excavator, the Canyon AT4 was




