


If you signed up to bring something, don't show up emptyhanded! Otherwise we'll have to get Larry "One Armed Bandit" Boothe on your case & you don't want that!



Kit Reviews *********

1989 Corvette ZR1 (Monogram #2785) by Tim Sickle

This kit uses the chassis & interior from Monogram's Coupe & 1987 Roadster, the problem here being that the interior has no clutch pedal. But this is hardly noticeable when done. The is molded in white (yay!) with smoke tinted clear windows lights & satin chrome. The body appears to be with the ZR1 I.D. engraved on the widened rear body section. excellent wide & wider 17" gatorbacks with _ nice finish wheels. The centerpiece of this kit is undoubtedly It's great! Once the engine/trans halves are assembled, very minor work will remove the parting seam on the oil there is a separate finned trans pan. The engine wiring goes locks good. Upon installation of the engine into body/chassis combo, I experienced a slight interference problem the header/motor mounts firewall/valve covers but



to "tweak" them into place. There are very few decals, one being a "Heartbeat of America" plate which is very hard to read. How about decals for a more realistic dashboard? On balance, this is a very nice kit which builds into a very nice replica. How long before we see a ZR1-powered street rod?

Valvoline Pontiac Stock Car (Monogram #2787) by Dave Lewis


This review concerns the Pontiac Stock Car which I won in the raffle at our February? meeting.

I built mine with the #27 Rusty Wallace "Kodiak" markings from Fred Cady Design, sheet #609. I believe that JNJ Hobbies also produces a "Kodiak" decal sheet which is a bit easier to work with (a one part system as opposed to a two part system). The JNJ sheet also has a more accurate decal of Rusty's name.

I found the new Pontiac body to be a refreshing change you Norm!). It seems to be extremely (mot accurate according to the reference materials available to me. There few parting lines front and rear, and some flashing, nothing that a light sanding couldn't take care of. front and rear bumpers and the hood all seem to fit perfectly. The body in white. Under the body is the standard Monogram molded NASCAR chassis and small block Chevrolet motor. I did notice that, seems to be no way to attach the chassis to the front the body from the underside. I may end up using epoxy to keep mine in place. The chrome in my kit was way too shiny. to have the look of Aluminum, but mine looked chrome. Two coats of Testor's Dullcote solved the problem. I tend to think that this was a fluke, and not standard fare. Monogram known for their outstanding models, and this one exception.

Special note to all you M.A.M.A. MOMS (Mail Order Maniacs!)




