
This will be our last meeting in room T-101. Starting in September and running thru December, we will be back in room Q-305.

MAMA: Do you subscribe to any model car magazines?


Larry: Scale Auto Enthusiast, Plastic Fanatic, UMCA, MCMA, Scale Wheels and Model Car Journal.
