





Back to the Future" Delorean

(AMT #6132; one version; 1/24 scale; over 100 pieces; gray, black, clear, "aluminum" finished chrome, vinyl tires)

Hurray! It's finally here! I've been hoping and waiting for this to come and now it's here. Some of you may be thinking that it's "just another licensed movie kit", but this is "top of the line".

This is one of the best kits I've seen lately. It has absolutely no sink marks that I have found, no flash, or those annoying plastic "swirls" on the surface of the plastic. And to top it off, this kit is extremely detailed. My only complaint is that the kit is imported, which brings up the price a little.



The chassis of the kit looks like your average, everyday "flying car". There is nothing recognizable about the chassis of the car-it's all fictional, but detailed.

The body is 1 piece with no opening doors, hood, etc. The body looks stock as far as I'm familiar with except for some molded wires running up and down both sides of the car.

The kit comes with rubber "Pirelli" tires and the stock wheels. The kit is designed to let you go from regular "street driving" to "off-road driving"....literally, with a simple flick of a switch on the chassis the wheels go from upright to "hover" mode.

The interior exhibits excellent detail throughout. Most of the decals are used in the interior. The instrument panel is a decal with major detail. The "Time Circuits" actually have the dates as used in the movies. If that's not enough for you....then get this, the alarm clock that sits on the dash even reads 10:04 which was an important time in the movie. Everything that was in the movie is in this kit, right down to the "flux capacitor".

The "engine" (if you can call it that!) has a lot of detail as well. Some parts even exhibit rivet and bolt head detail.


For those of you who want to build a **Replica Stock** version of this kit, **good luck!** It will take many hours of filing and sanding of the parts. Your best bet would probably be to just make it a curbside model, but the sky is the limit! All in all, I give AMT/ERTL a thumbs up for this kit!

In case some of you came in late, the Monkees were the "New Kids on the block" of 1966, a synthetic Rock Group manufactured by NBC to sell zit creme and other teen products in Prime Time. They had sort of a cool car, though-a **Dean Jeffries-customized '66 GTO**. There were actually TWO such cars, one featuring a working GMC 6-71 blower. In 1967 one of the Monkeemobiles (I don't know which) went to Australia and apparently never returned. The other (apparently) went to **George Barris' Movie & Motorcade Museum** in Hollywood and was apparently restored for the show circuit three or four years ago, albeit with some subtle changes.

ERTL's recent re-release of the Monkeemobile through the **Blueprinter** was a welcome blast of nostalgia, an instant collectible, and a genuine bargain at \$6.00 postpaid-watch your money double and triple almost while you wait! (Hope you bought two!)

That's the good news. The bad news is that the kit as reissued won't build either an accurate "original" or "restored" Monkeemobile out of the box. You see, the original had the GTO "diamond" badges on the front fenders, along with another set of emblems that represented the Jeffries' Family crest, which went on all his cars. The restored "Monk" is missing the "diamond", and carries a simple "G_T_O" logo instead. ERTL has altered the



sold to the restored fashion! But the kit comes with the Cragare of the original (nice ones, too!), instead of the Ansen Sprints (or similar) of the restored car. Quickest fix: Yank the Ansens from the AMT '32 Vicky or your parts box and go for the resto. (The kit's tires are closer in size to the new than the old, anyway). The color is a brilliant, deep "Tomato Juice" red-orange. A 2:1 mix of Chevrolet Engine red and Testor's 1104 Dark Red (in the little bottles) is almost perfect; if you don't want to get into paint mixing, Italian Red over Black Primer is probably the closest match right out of the bottle or spray can.

The original 'Mobile will take more work. As soon as I get around to it, I plan to strip the paint off my original '67 MPC body and dupe the correct emblems with foil and epoxy. (Anybody interested in a set of these? While I'm mixing epoxy, I might as well make a bunch of 'em).

The color of the original is another problem I haven't solved yet. I know that it had "30 hand-rubbed coats of Candy Wine Burgundy", but the one color photo I have of the thing and the TV show both show the car in a shade I'd call more a "Strawberry Red" than any kind of Burgundy. I'm experimenting with mixing it up and will advise if anyone's interested. Stay tuned....
