

1972 GMC Stepside

(AMT #6081; two versions; 1/25; 102 pieces; tan, chrome, clear, clear red, vinyl tires)

I've been waiting for this one.
The last time I saw a '72 GMC kit it
was selling (or rather not selling)
for \$65. Needless to say, I passed on
that particular opportunity.

This is a reissue from tooling designed nearly 20 years ago and it looks it. The parts are molded very cleanly with a lot less flash than expected, but (typical of the times)



all chassis detail is molded into the one-piece chassis. This makes any super-detailed Replica Stock projects very tough, but as far as customs go-l've got my eye on a certain C-1500 Sport Side chassis that might be just the ticket.

The 7 piece cab looks good and is well proportioned. The only problems here are minor sink marks at the front of the fenders (they don't seem to affect the turn signal lamps) and an awful parting line at the back edge of the roof. The stepside bed is a 16 piece affair whose only affliction seems to be the sink marks which span the width of the woodgrained floor in two places.

The 5 piece interior is a basic tub configuration with surprisingly sharp door panel details. It strikes me as odd that a truck of this vintage would be molded with bucket seats. I would really prefer a bench seat, but I'm lucky to have this kit at all so I won't whine.

When looking under the bood, to say the firewall detail is spanse would be a tremendous understatement. You don't even get a master cylinder. I've seen cars with inadequate braking power before, but this is a bit extreme!

The **engine** consists of 18 or 19 pieces depending upon which version you choose to build. The box art claims that this is a 250 hp 350 cubic incher. I don't yet know which engines came in these trucks, but the parts in this kit look an awful lot like a big block chevy to me. The optional Corvette style tri-power induction doesn't do much to make you think of anything less than 427 cubic inches.

As for the 6 decals-don't bother.

In the tire department you get a choice of AMT's ubiquitous skinny Firestones or their Goodyear Gatorbacks. 'Course they only gave me 3 Gatorbacks in my kit so I guess I get to try out their toll-free phone number. It's really good to see that a manufacturer cares enough to offer phone assistance with assembly problems or misssing parts. Good goin' ERTL! I also liked the fact that they listed original colors for the body and interior.

In all, with a good bit of work, this kit will make a fine shelf model. I wonder how the turbo'ed and intercooled 231 c.i. V6 from a GNX would fit into that C-1500 Sport Side chassis?!?

191 Chevrolet 45488

(AMT/ERTL #6032; 129 pieces; 2 versions; black, chrome, red, clear, vinyl times)

ERTL did a great job on this kit.

Presumably starting with their Silverado Sportside kit, they tooled up a brand new Fleetside short bed, an all-new engine & transmission, exhaust system, wheels and seats just to name a few parts. Right out of the box this kit does justice to its subject. With just a little effort a very high quality Replica Stock model is possible.

As stated in the title, this is a 191 45455, but a 190 vension wouldn't be difficult to achieve with just an engine, transmission and exhaust system swap.

The valve covers accurately replicate the cast aluminum covers on the 7.4 liter Mark V powerplant from Tonowanda, NV. The serpentine belt assembly/engine accessory arrangement is authentic according to my research. I can't really comment on the new 4L80-E 4 speed automatic transmission since I haven't actually seen a full size one, but what ERTL provides looks very believable. By the way, this kit is a landmark in C-1500 model history! ERTL finally got the air cleaner and intake tract right! I can stop raping my Monte Carlo 68 kits for their air cleaners!

The **new seats** are dead on accurate, but the gauge faces are the '88-'90 variety. The **interior door panel detail** is very close to being dead on, so I won't complain. The **interior tub** even has the right number of pedals, too!

The new stock wheels are very well cast and totally accurate except for the center caps, which are close enough (caps from a C-1500 long bed or Sportside are more accurate). One big letdown is the lousy chrome on the stock wheels in both of the kits I bought (in case you haven't figured it out yet, I'm planning to do a '90 and a '91). The rest of the chrome parts were plated very well.

The chassis is the same one as in the Sportside kit with the exception of the new exhaust system and driveshaft. This is the third driveshaft design and, guess what? You get all three in this kit! The new exhaust parts replicate the true dual system used to unlock an extra 25 ponies on the '91 45456. The spare tire still looks as hokey as ever, but the vents on the gas tank cover finally point the right way.

The cab is the same one from all the other C-1500 variations so it still has the Silverado emblems behind the doors which must be removed for the 45488. ERTL saved us some work by not the grille and bumpers on this kit. They 日中で painted black, anyway. The hood doesn't have the out out for the intake custom from the other C-1500 kits so there's no more sink mark on hood. ERTL also got pretty darm close with the rear view mirrors. They're a little large, but they're shaped right as well. rear window has frame lines for the sliding window, which 45488's are equipped with, molded in. One part ERTL left

the light on the back of the cab roof to illuminate the bed. I'm not positive about the '91's, but all '90's had these lights.

The **new bed** is beautiful but it has two flaws: ERTL neglected the wheel opening trim and the tailgate still has those awful vertical sink marks. It'll take a lot of primer and block sanding to straighten the tailgate out.


I still think the optional spoilers and such look dumb. Oh well.

The basic cab, interior, bed and chassis assembly is still the well-engineered assembly it was in earlier C-1500 kits. This kit exhibited incredibly little flash and it still had a lot of engine parts from other versions on the sprues.


The decals look very authentic and include two sets of license plates (Oklahoma and Michigan).

This is a great kit which should build well and be a basis for many interesting conversions. I would like to build or see built a Sportside 45456 since, as legend has it, Chevrolet originally planned to build them that way (the fiberglass sides of the Sportside bed make it lighter), but they couldn't produce them quick enough for regular production demands, let alone for the 45456's.




