

'93 Firebird Formula & Trans Am

The Firebird Formula and Trans Am. Currently in their 4th generation with the release of the gorgeous 1993 editions. When the '93 Firebird Formula in 1/20 scale from Lindberg and the '93 "Firebird" in 1/25 scale from AMT arrived, there had been so much coverage since January of this year, that you could very possibly have found a magazine with an article of some sort at any point in a three month span! These new F-cars were one hot topic with the magazines! From their "go-fast" LT-1 Corvette engines backed by Borg-Warner six-speeds, to their "go-whoa" anti lock brakes and dual air bags (not to mention their new road-ripping suspensions), The editors seemed almost unable to heap enough praise on them!

With the arrival of the kits, a question also arose as to the aluminum wheels included in the Formula from Lindberg. This question was resolved with the arrival of the requested info from Pontiac. These wheels were base Firebird wheels rather than Formula wheels. The Formula and Trans Am utilize the same wheel and tire package. The reference material used for these reviews is as follows:

(Ed. Note: A quick call to Pontiac Motor Divisions toll-free hotline brought these two items. I might add here that the Road & Track guide has a \$5.95 price on the cover, but I didn't pay one red cent! Give 'em a call at 1-800-762-4900 and ask for info on the '93 Firebirds and you too should receive the same thing! It contains a brief history of the car, a racing history, and the development of the all-new car along with a full-on road test of

the '93 Trans Am. You can't beat the price!)





1993 Pontiac Firebird Formula V8 (Lindberg #72509; 1/20 scale, 90 pieces; black, chrome, clear, clear red, vinyl tires)

The body is molded in a high gloss black and is nearly flash-free. It includes the specific twin inlet (non-functional) front bumper (as opposed to the twin foglight front bumper of the T/A) as well as the rear spoiler which mounts flush to the decklid rather than above it forming a tunnel, similar to the Mustang GT (both of these items are shared by the Formula and the base Firebird). Another item of note here is the absence of T-Tops on this kit, Lindberg instead deciding to go with a steel-roofed Formula, which plays well with the Formulas cheaper, lighter theme when compared to its big brother, the Trans Am. The body consists of six pieces (basic body, front and rear bumpers, hood, and mirrors). There is a small, raised area on the nose of the car to aid in locating the Firebird decal which mounts there. There are separate windshield wipers as well, and the glass mounts from the outside.

The 350 cubic inch, 275 hp LT-1 small block engine is a nicely detailed 17-piece unit. It includes both upper and lower radiator hoses. A nice touch here which deserves mentioning- the inclusion of three decals which mount on the engine/transmission assembly (in step 6) may not necessarily be seen when the car is

completed, but I applaud Lindberg for including them.

The chassis consists of over 15 pieces (not counting the exhaust system). On the minus side, there is no disc brake detail. However, on the plus side, the front suspension will be posable if built properly using the 'ol "heat 'n smash" technique. The exhaust system's tailpipe tips are oval-shaped rather than being four round, chrome-tipped units as on the real car.

The aluminum wheels included in this kit had me scratching my head for a while. The lug nuts in the wheels center are surrounded by a pentagon. Arrayed around this pentagon are five ellipses in a uni-directional pattern. After finally getting some requested Firebird info from Pontiac Motor Division, the mystery was solved. The wheels in question are actually base Firebird wheels, rather than Formula (or Trans Am) items. They are 16"x7.5" as opposed to the 16"x8" standard Formula and Trans Am wheels. Adding to my initial confusion was the box art, which shows a black Formula with the correct, tri-spoked wheels. These wheels mount on Lindbergs Goodyear Eagle ZR45 series tires (as seen earlier in the Stealth, S10, & Syclone kits) rather than the new Goodyear GS-C tires that allow these cars to reach the incredible ride and handling plateau that they are capable of.

The interior is a tub-style affair which has separate door panels. The bucket seats are two pieces each, and the rear seat back is a separate item. The dash has the gas, brake, and clutch pedals molded to it, and exhibits good detail. Again, to Lindbergs credit, they included an instrument face decal to highlight the dash. Unfortunately, there are ejector pin marks

evident on the interior floor.

The glass is clear, and scratch-free (because Lindberg

thoughtfully places the clear plastic pieces in their own bag, a practice I would like to see all manufacturers start doing!). There are no engraved rear window defroster lines on the rear window and no "line of demarcation" to aid the modeler in painting the black areas which exist on both the front and rear windows.

The decals are another plus for Lindberg. They exhibit much better registration than some of their earlier offerings. They include both white and silver "Formula" graphics, the aforementioned gauge face decal, and 11(!) underhood decals!

The instructions are clear and easy to follow in the placement of the numerous decals. Food for thought on future sheets Lindberg: Include painting instructions and color combinations to aid younger modelers as well as first time modelers to paint their cars to closely resemble the real thing.

The bottom line here is that Lindberg is the only manufacturer to date to offer a model of the 1993 Formula, albeit in 1/20 scale. The only problem that I have with this kit is the inclusion of these obviously incorrect wheels. Hopefully, Lindberg will update the tooling to a) turn this kit into a stock 1993 Firebird replete with the stock 3.4 V6, 5-speed (highly unlikely!) or, b) do the correct Formula wheels (much more likely!). And thats the way it is, sports fans-you make the call!





'93 Firebird [AMT #8610; 1/25 scale; over 95 pieces; molded in white (thank yew!), chrome, clear, vinyl tires]

The body is molded very cleanly and consists of seven pieces (basic body, hood, rear spoiler, front and rear bumpers, and outside rear view mirrors). The body exhibits a very open, airy feeling from the C-pillar forward due to the fact that AMT chose to model a Tran...oops, Firebird with the T-Top option, and the T-Tops and windshield are molded as a single unit. The only "nit" on the body to pick is the absence of the "Trans Am" logos from the doors as well as the decal sheet.

The LT-1 engine consists of 17 pieces and exhibits a nice level of detail down to and including the "LT1" markings on the new valve covers. The engine/6-speed transmission are molded in two halves that when joined and properly attended to look pretty good.

The chassis is very nicely done, including a separate front subframe, front suspension and transmission crossmember which mounts to it. Disc brake detail is evident at the rear, but absent at the front. The two-piece radiator with twin cooling fans is a nice touch as are the upper and lower radiator hoses.

The wheels are the new Goodyear GS-C P245/50ZR-16 tires and in a word, they are great! They do not come molded with a center that necessitates being cut out prior to installation. The center of these tires is molded open. The tread pattern looks to be pretty accurate as well. Sidewall detail seems a tad bit heavy, but on balance, a nice addition to our scale tire line-up. These tires mount onto Pontiacs new 16 x 8J cast aluminum wheels. These wheels again look to be right on when compared to their full size counterparts. The minor problem here is that they will need to be "toned down" with dull coat or stripped to be finished in their

proper aluminum finish rather than the bright chrome finish in

which they are molded.

The interior, is built up platform-style rather than being a tub. The door panels extend from the firewall the length of the car, terminating at the rear bumper. They capture the unique shape of the armrest and the interior door handles. To these interior panels mount a trunk panel, which sits on the rear of the chassis. The dash exhibits nice, albeit somewhat light detailing including the analog gauge faces. The foot pedal assembly mounts to the dash, and the air bag-equipped steering wheel complete with redundant radio controls, tops this unit off. The uniquely-shaped console mounts between two one-piece bucket seats which are molded left- and right-hand. The rear seat is one piece and drops into its specified place.

The glass is very nicely done. As stated earlier, the windshield/T-Tops are molded as a single unit. The windshield wipers are also molded to the base of the windshield. The rear window features raised defroster lines as well as a frosted area on the inside of the glass. The tail light is also included as a clear part, to be backed up with a decal. It has the proper

engraving on its inner face.

The decals contain two "Pontiac" window bands, one in red and the other in white. Also included are several underhood decals, Michigan and New York "FYR BRD" plates, and a Firebird emblem for the nose. AMT handled the tail light in an interesting fashion. They produced a correctly-colored decal of it which will be installed on the tail light area of the rear end, and the clear plastic tail light lens merely mounts over it. There is another small problem here, though. "Trans Am' appears on the rear tail light panel, between the tail lights of the real car, however the decal sheet says "Firebird". A final decal included is the "Pontiac Parking only" sign decal, which requires the builder to build the sign out of the material of their choice to use this decal.

The instructions are, as always up to AMTs excellent standards. They include all part names, as well as painting suggestions. There is even a section detailing painting instructions for the interior, with its different colors. They even suggest that the "ambitious" modeler may want to try to duplicate the factory colors at their local paint store, and even include a warning that using automotive lacquer may damage the

bare plastic. Thanks, AMT!

Well, there you have it, the first release of Pontiac's newest "thoroughbred" (a mature ponyear!). This car will be a nice addition to our collections (not to mention the promo versions due out this shortly). AMT missed on a few minor details ("Trans AM" logos and/or decals missing), but hit on a few nice details (new Goodyear GS-C tires). We will just have to wait and see as to just how it stacks up to its "crosstown" rivals at Monogram/Revell (a glue kit from Monogram, a snap kit from Revell). At any rate, there will be no shortage of both 1993 Firebirds and Camaros this year!

Sneakin' a Peek!

This column will appear as frequently (or infrequently!) as new releases from the manufacturers. The idea behind it is to give a "thumbnail review" of the releases as they hit the shelves with a detailed review to follow at a later date (hopefully!). We'll see how it goes!

Off-Road Pick-Up (Revell #6299): Re-issue molded in yellow....Goodyear Tracker A-T tires....snap kit w/vinyl stickers....skid plates...roll bar w/off-road lights.

* "Country Time" Thunderbird (Monogram #1094): Molded in yellow....1/32 snap kit w/vinyl stickers....re-hash of earlier "Havoline" & "Valvoline" T-Birds.

* "Quaker State" Thunderbird (Monogram #1095): Molded in

green....1/32 snap kit w/vinyl stickers....see

Time" kit above.

*'93 Formula V8 (Lindberg #72509): Molded in black....1/20 scale....correct twin inlet Firebird "snout" and Formulaspecific rear spoiler....incorrect base aluminum wheels in lieu of Formula/Trans Am wheels....numerous underhood decals, gauge decals, and silver and white Formula graphics much better registration....tub-style w/separate door panels.

'93 Firebird (AMT #8610):Molded in white....new 16" GS-C Goodyear tires are real nice....platform-style interior....windshield/T-Tops molded as one piece...glass installs from the outside....clear tail light backed up by decal....no "Trans Am' markings on body or good instructions sheet....usually w/painting

tips...."chrome" needs to be "toned down" somewhat.

* "McDonald's" dragster (Revell #7354): Molded in red....rehash of earlier dragsters....colorful "McDonald's" decal sheet....chrome appears not as bright as compared to the

funny car.

* '67 Mercury Comet Cyclone GT (AMT #6750): Molded in Lt. Blue (!)....GT stripes in black, white, and red (same as Fairlane)....engine, chassis, and tires same Fairlane....roofline apparently same as Fairlane....new, chrome wheels....dash & interior properly different.
