



3rd Annual Mid-Atlantic NNL Model Car Show & Swap Meet

Well guys 'n gals, NNL #3 is history as I write this little piece (or else I wouldn't be writing it, now would I?!?). Some observations in retrospect, if you will permit me:

The event was started off with an observed moment of silence for the tragic and sudden death of NASCAR Winston Cup Champion Alan Kulwicki in a plane crash on April 1 of this year. Alan had many friends, fans and supporters and will be sorely missed.

Due to the revised layout of the vendor tables and model display tables, the flow of people through the hall seemed vastly improved. Gone were the "traffic jams" which we experienced the previous year. Consequently, all vendors seemed to be doing a very brisk business.

Overall, the quantity of models declined slightly, but the quality and workmanship of those in attendance was markedly better. Also of note was the appearance of two former cover cars-Andy Mathews' Formula I McClaren (Scale Auto Enthusiast), and David Burket & Bob Korunows' '49 Ford Pro Street (Car Modeler).

The committees which were set up in the days prior to the event (due to the fact that the "Blizzard of '93" forced cancellation of our March meeting, where final arrangements were to be made!) seemed to work out very well, once everyone settled down and got into the swing of things. We had no problems to speak of, which means that the public and the modelers cooperated with us

and everything went smoothly.

The manufacturers and the aftermarket really stepped up this year, and supported this event in a big way, with items ranging from resin cast detailing items to gift certificates to cases of models. Unfortunately, Revell/Monogram models contribution arrived on April 6 (two days late), so it will be pressed into service in the monthly club raffle. * Lamborghini Diablo (Monogram #1092): Molded in black...... 1/32 scale snap kit....plastic ZR35 & ZR40 tires....CA "Diablo" tag & instrument cluster stickers....1-piece bucket seats w/backs....all body vents molded open.

* Nissan 300ZX (Monogram #1093): Molded in yellow....1/32 scale snap kit....same plastic tires as in Diablo....... separate, drop-in door panels....bucket interior w/separate door panels....nice Nissan 5-spoke wheels....1-piece chassis w/separate exhaust system....vinyl stickers for

dash, T-Tops, taillight panel.

* 40th Anniv. Corvette (Revell #7347): Molded in Met.
Burgundy....(4) ZR40 tires....Anniv. logos as decals for seatbacks and fenders....knocked off excellent '92 convt.

* '93 Firebird Trans Am (Revell #6289): Molded in red......
1/25 scale snap kit....nice, new Goodyear GS-C tires....
1-piece window assembly w/frosted areas to be painted black.....4-piece radiator!....disc brake detail-4 places!....tool to install front fog lights....vinyl stickers for dash face,

"Trans Am" IL plate, & "Pontiac Excitement" plate.

* '93 ZR-1 Corvette (AMT #8609): Molded in Lt. Gray....turn signal/parking lights molded in smoke plastic...new
Goodyear GS-C tires....40th Anniv., ZR-1 decals along with
"ZR FUN" FL, "Corvette Fever" plates.

* '93 Camaro (AMT #8611): Molded in Lt. Gray...nice Z28 5-spoke wheels mounting new Goodyear GS C tires wield the latest and the statest and the latest and t

spoke wheels mounting new Goodyear GS-C tires....windshield & T-Tops I clear unit (ala '93 Firebird)....defroster lines and frosted areas to be painted black...."GR8 Z28" CA plate, red & white "Camaro" windshield bands, "Camaro Parking Only" sign....separate rear spoiler....seats feature shoulder belt mounting bracket....nice dash with gauge engraving.

* '57 Ford Fairlane (AMT #8028): Molded in Lt. Gray....
...."Billit" air cleaner & T-Bird valve covers....(2) sets
of tires....new 5-spoke mag wheels....typically good
instructions which include paint combinations.

* Sting Ray III (Revell #7346): Molded in Purple....Unique engine layout w/rear-mounted transmission....disc brakes at all 4 wheels....excellent Goodyear GS-C tires which mount accurate Sting Ray III wheels....3-piece radiator w/separate radiator cap(!)....hardtop included.

* '93 Snapfast Plus Ranger STX (AMT #8953): Molded in black....1/25 scale snap kit....excellent packaging-cverything is wrapped up to prevent damage....correct cast aluminum deep dish STX wheels included which mount new Firestone ATX tires....hinged tailgate...STX vinyl tape stripes...."4X4" marking properly indented in front grille....plated headlights....proper flares on fenders for STX version...(Ed. Note: If the '93 Ranger glue kit is half as good as this snap kit, I can't wait!)

* Camaro Z28 Pace Car (Monogram #2964): Molded in white..... based largely on Revell snap Firebird Trans Am (see above).....proper painting instructions for Pace Car version....decals included for splatter & stripe effect on seats....again, tool included to insert front parking lights.


