

(Testors/Burago; 1/24th scale; one version; diecast metal painted black, plastic pieces in tan, gray, chrome, and black)

Engine: The engine was only three pieces but well detailed for the kind of kit this is.

Chassis: The chassis was one piece with working steering through the steering wheel.

Interior: The interior was easy to build although it didn't

have a lot of detail, but detail can be added easily enough.

Body: The body is two pieces with opening doors and engine cover. They work well and fit tight. The paint is very glossy. The tires are soft vinyl with "Bburago" on the sidewall. There is a small problem with door hinges which are kind of brittle and could break easily, but Testors knows about the problem and has taken care of it.

This kit is basically an unassembled Bburago diecast shelf model.

# 1940 Ford Coupe

(AMT #8056; 1/25th scale; two versions; 105+ parts; Light Gray, clear, chrome, vinyl tires)

AMTs venerable 40 Ford Coupe has held up pretty well for its

age. Very little flash was present, parting lines are more pronounced, and some details have been worn off over the years. The trunk lines disappear after a few light coats of paint and the detail on the hood latch/ornament is nonexistent.


The boys in Dyersvilles attempts at bringing this longawaited Reissue up to date falls a little short of success. The new high back, Lumbar-supported bucket seats, custom dash with bar graph-type gauges, a/c outlets, and stereo are excellent as

is the billet-style steering wheel.

Along with the stock rims, hubcaps and trim rings, are new high tech Boyd's (can I say hat?) style wheels. The Goodyear Eagle VR40 tires included in the kit look out of place on the fat-sendered Coupe. The stock suspension comes complete with metal axles and the nail head Buick engine could use an update as well.

The kit seems to go together well, except for the radiator, which seems to sit too low in the chassis making for alignment problems with the coolant hoses.

The decals include shadow graphics and Kentucky license plates as well as several speed equipment manufacturers decals.


