

This column will appear as frequently (or infrequently!) as new releases from the manufacturers. The idea behind it is to give a "thumbnail review" of the releases as they hit the shelves with a detailed review to follow at a later date (hopefully!). We'll see how it goes!

*Rescue 911 Helicopter (?)(AMT #6400): Molded in Lt. Gray....1/48th scale...movable rotor....sliding cargo door....2-piece motor....forward and rear jump scats....large clear tree w/numerous windows....decal sheet containing numerous 911 markings.

* Rescue 911 Dodge Ambulance (AMT #6416): Molded in White....stock hubcaps....2 light bars....window-style 'Ambulance' decals which don't appear to be used.

* Rescue 911 Taurus Police car (AMT #6417): Molded in White....3 sets of wheels-stock hubcaps, 5-spoke SHO, and Custom....choice of Sheriff

or Police markings.

* Snapfast Kenworth Aerodyne (AMT #6418): Molded in Black....1/32nd chrome trees....rubber tires....'Haig Trucking' Dyersville, IA decals along with Iowa plates and red 3D striping....1-piece cab w/hood molded to it.

* Snapfast Volvo N10 & Trailer (AMT #6628): Molded in Red, Lt. Gray, black & chrome(!)....1/32nd scale....engine block....plastic & rubber

tires....refrigerated trailer.

* Dave Strickler's '62 Bel Air (AMT #6980): Molded in White....same as Proffitt Bel Air (not that that is bad!)...nice 'Old Reliable' decal

* '34 Ford Pickup (lindberg #72157): Molded in Yellow....bagged clear parts!....4 skinny Firestones, 4 wide Goodyear Eagle ZR tires, and what appear to be 2 Goodyear Eagle racing tires!....chrome Thunderbird V8....nice 2 spoke Boyd's type wheels!...decals include custom blue scallops, Sinclair and Red Crown gas logos (for tow truck) and CA '34 FORD, Texas '34 PICKUP plates.

Shelby, come Home!

One weekend last summer, Ellis Counts stopped at a car show in St. Charles county to reminisce about the 1968 yellow Shelby Mustang GT500KR that someone callously stole from him in 1971.

Another Shelby owner listened to his story and then pointed to a '68

across the lot.

"I went over to look at it," he recalled. "And it was my car!"

Finding a car that's been missing for almost 22 years is the easy part. Proving ownership is another story. Seems as though the clerk who issued his title in 1970 curiously omitted the first two digits of the VIN number. The really important number-the unique five digit production number-is on both his title and the car. But without a perfect match, he cannot prove that the car is his.

He has some fond memories of his Shelby. He courted his wife in it, and all four of his daughters recall stories about him topping 140 mph in one straightaway blast. He drove the car everywhere in those days. The car he originally paid \$2,000.00 for is now worth up to \$50,000.00. "They're incredibly rare", he says. There were only 939 fastbacks made in 1968 and

only 68 of those were yellow.

The Highway Patrol seized the car after Counts reported seeing it at the car show. A Sergeant for the Missouri Highway Patrol says that Counts will have to ask a judge as to who legally owns the car. "It appears that they both have ownership of the same car", the Sergeant is quoted as saying. "It will be up to the judge as to who has controlling possession of the car."

Counts cites as further proof of ownership the hole in the inner panel which he made on Labor Day weekend in 1971 when he was working on the car. It also has a Tri-Power set-up on it that replaced the single 4 barrel originally on it. "I'm not guessing about this, I know the car is mine" Counts said. He had no theft insurance on the car when it was stolen from his driveway in Normandy. All he could afford as a replacement was a 'beat up 'ol '63 Chevy', he says. The Highway Patrol wouldn't identify the owner since 1984. "He's put a lot of money into the car, and he wants it back." Counts sympathizes with the man who drove his car for ten years. He proudly showed Counts the car at the car show in August. "He didn't do anything wrong, and neither did I. And I want my car back."
