About 58 people were in attendance at last month's meeting, which had as its highlight nothing in particular except what we are known for and that is good models, good friends, and good times!





This column will appear as frequently (or infrequently!) as new releases from the manufacturers. The idea behind it is to give a "thumbnail review" of the releases as they hit the shelves with a detailed review to follow at a later date (hopefully!). We'll see how it goes!

* Ford F-150 Lightning (AMT #6153): Molded in Lt. Gray...reissue of F-150 short wheelbase truck...incorrect XLT moldings on sides of truck body....correct front bumper w/air dam, twin-tube rear bumper....new Lightning intake....incorrect chrome grille (should be body color)....new bucket scats....Firestone tires.

* 1994 Mustang GT (AMT #6178): Molded in Lt. Gray....separate front, rear bumpers (w/nice indented 'MUSTANG' lettering)....tail lights done correctly....chrome headlight buckets....disc brakes at all wheels, quad-shock rear suspension....nicely engraved 5.0 intake..platform interior w/separate side panels....very fine dash engraving....chrome 3-spoke mags mounting incorrect Goodyear ZR tires (as compared to GS-C's).

* 1994 GMC Sonoma (AMT #8128): Molded in Lt. Gray....5-spoke wheels from S10 LS/SS (custom option?) plus 2-wheel drive GMC wheels...chrome GMC grille w/separate GMC emblem (grille s/b body color as noted in instructions)....white & gray "Sonoma" graphics, dash gauge face (w/clear cover), Texas "GMC SLS" plate....7-piece aero package w/front

end reminiscent of early Blazer prototype.

* 1970 Challenger R/T (AMT #6466): Molded in Lt. Gray....Reissue of AMT/Matchbox "Street Machines" version....440 six pack motor....Magnum 500 wheels....Goodyear G70-15 tires....new decals with both black & white stripes which include the ones which run from front bumper to back bumper as well as the stripes which run around the tail light opening (white stripes have severely blurred "R/T" emblem on them).. .."MOPAR Muscle" plate also included....nice 2-piece exhaust system... ...optional hardtop (vinyl) included.


* "Viper" Stealth R/T Turbo (AMT #8313): Molded in black....Snapfast

Plus kit....updated sheetmetal....(4) ZR40 series tires.

* Dodge "Lil Red Express Truck" (AMT #6459): Molded in Lt. Gray....much smaller Goodyear G70-15s as compared to original issue tires....."Lil Red Express Truck" door and tailgate decals, "Adventurer" emblems, "360 Express" air cleaner emblem, wood trim....metal axles....nicely molded, relatively flash-free.

* "Tide" T-Bird (Monogram #2449): Molded in White (thank yew!)....
....rehash of earlier T-Birds....front and rear bumpers not up to
1994 standards....colorful "Tide" decals w/yellow Goodyear tire
markings.....usually good Monogram instructions, especially for decal
placement.

1955 Ford Pick Up



The catalog says this is new, however, I will be comparing it to a certain red Stroh's beer truck which I built 7 years ago. Welcome back!! The kit has very little flash with minor mold marks and some really nice improvements in more current parts to reflect the 90's. I am sure I will buy more of this kit.

The engine, consisting of 17 pieces, is listed as a 5.0 with Mustang fuel injection. With the exception of the EFI intake and air hose, it is the same Cobra engine as before. The tri-carb air cleaner is gone but the three-deuce carbs are an extra piece on the chrome tree. The valve covers are chrome Cobra. The EFI is not well detailed, but maybe I am spoiled by the Revell engines in the T-Bird and Cougar.

The chassis consists of 17 pieces. The side pipes of the older kit are replaced with a 4-piece dual exhaust system exiting under the rear bumper. Each side is 2-pieces-a chrome extension, a single piece with catalytic converter and muffler from header to extension. The rear is an IRS as before and the usual highly simplified independent front end. Two plated disc brakes are provided for the front but no rear brakes.

The interior and cab unit consist of 24 pieces. The interior has been updated and greatly improved from before. A bench seat is provided. The dash now has a gauge decal and clear cover, modern tilt chrome steering column and a billet-style steering wheel. New 'separate' inner door panels are provided and are very 90's. The original kit steering wheel and fire extinguisher are still on the trees but are now 'extras'. The remainder of the cab is the same-clear headlights, two chrome side mirrors, 2-piece grill and chrome gas cap.

The <u>Bed</u> and <u>fender unit</u> consists of 11 parts. The bed sides and rear fenders are all separate pieces. The tail gate can be movable. Bumpers are one piece and chrome.

Wheels & tires are 16 pieces. The wheels are a more modern 5 spoke. The tires are low profile Michelin of the wide and even wider variety. The front tires will barely fit under the fenders, while the rear don't fit at all (Maybe I'll attempt to 'tub' this puppy after all!).

The <u>decal</u> sheet, in addition to the gauge cluster, has blue scallops for the cab and two sets of license plates-VENOM (IL), and EZ 4 ME (ID).

BUT none are called by name. Paint suggestions are done by color name not just a code letter.

As for accuracy, I heard someone say they thought the nose of the hood sat a little too high. Compared to pictures of rodded '53-'56 pick ups, this may be true. As for me, I am glad the kit is back at buildable prices so I can buy and build the 4-5 ideas I have in mind.





1994 Mustang GT (A.K.A. "A Tale of Two Mustangs" - no pun intended!)

(AMT #6178, Monogram #2967; 1/25th scale; one version; molded in Lt. Gray and Yellow respectively, chrome, clear, clear red, vinyl tires)

By now, most modelers have seen the 1994 Mustang GT either in one of the many car magazines or have caught a glimpse of one on the road or on the showroom floor of their local Ford dealer. Ford wanted to capture the same kind of enthusiasm that the original 1964 1/2 Mustang created upon its introduction. Earning the Motor Trend Car of the Year let Dearborn know it was indeed successful in keeping the rear wheel drive pony car alive with much needed modern improvements such as four-wheel disc brakes to bring the 5.0 liter (302 cu. in. for us old timers!) GT to a safe stop while listening to the 230 watt Mach 460 stereo system (!).

Like Ford, Monogram and AMT/ERTL had to re-tool many dies as this Mustang body has little in common with its 1979-1993 predecessors. Both model companies decided to initially produce the same "model", the GT coupe. Despite this commonality, the kits do exhibit differences that will

be the subject of this review.

The Monogram kit was the first to hit the shelves this Spring and I had the opportunity to assemble one. The first impressive thing I noticed was the one piece body, this appeared to be a painting timesaver until it became evident that the tail lights had to be glued into place and masked to cover the lenses. That is the only negative of this excellent casting which includes a semi-hinged hood, separate windshield wipers, chrome 4wheel disc brakes (someone in model companyland is listening!), a clear coolant washer fluid tank, and a clear dash instrument cover (nice touch). It also features aluminum-like (satin) wheels to be installed onto very nice Eagle GS-C rubber, and the Ford part numbers on the oval mufflers similar to the Boss 302 kit of a few years ago.

The AMT/ERTL kit was released recently and the extra few months did not translate into a superior offering. The three piece body took some bending of the separate front and rear sections and super glue to attain a one piece unit. However, the tail lights are done better than the Monogram kit because the red lens can be attached after the assembled body is painted. There are a few minor details AMT picked up that Monogram didn't such as the seat belt loops and the painting instructions, which are much more detailed. The box art depicts the real car which is nice for reference as compared to Monogram's built-up. The 17" wheels are chrome (aluminum on the real GT) and the tires are ZR45 blackwalls with very large raised letters. The AMT kit also includes the 4-wheel discs, but they require painting.

If I could only pick one kit, I would preser the Monogram version but both are good enough to add to your collection with some work. Now, if I could figure out how to make a working Mach 460 sound system for my miniature GT's, I would really have something!

They are modifying their excellent Nissan & Toyota 4-wheel drive pick-em ups into what they call "Street Custom" Duallys. They will feature dually fenders, off-road lights and running boards, roll bar, rear roll pans, along with custom decals. Expect these in August/September '94. Also in August, they will release the Jurassic Park Ford Explorer in 1/20th scale. No doubt knocked off of their excellent Explorer Sport model of last year. Seems to me that I remember these vehicles being 4 doors with clear roofs ("better to view the dinosaurs, my dear!"). We shall see. In September '94, we will get "Super Snaps" (1/20th scale snap kits) of the new '95 Chevy Blazer and Jeep Grand Cherokee. They will feature Lindberg's "glamor gloss" plastic, metal axles, and "peel & stick" mylar decals. And then in October '94, we'll get glue versions of these two. Thanks, Mike!
