

Sneakin' a Peek!

This column will appear as frequently (or infrequently!) as new releases from the manufacturers. The idea behind it is to give a "thumbnail review" of the releases as they hit the shelves with a detailed review to follow at a later date (hopefully!). We'll see how it goes! (Ed. Note: The kits are listed in no particular order)

* Plymouth Prowler concept vehicle (AMT Snapfast Plus #8284): Molded in "Prowler Purple"....separate door panels....gauge face decals.... beautiful wheel and tire set!....windshield features frosted areas for paint (inside rear view mirror missing)...."Prowler" plate decals, front parking, rear back-up light decals....cycle fenders, front suspension, and bumpers separate pieces....clear, concise instructions with painting tips.

* '95 Firebird Formula V8 (AMT #6562): Molded in Lt. Gray....rehash of excellent '94 version....new 5-spoke wheels thrown in (unplated) Ed. Note: They are available either way).



(AMT/ERTL #6631; 100+ pieces; Lt. Gray, chrome, clear, clear red, vinyl tires)

Well, it's finally here. The AMT/ERTL '67 Mustang GT. This is the one I've been waiting for. Although it's not a true GT model, it does come close, but more on that later. I'd like to get the negatives outta the way first, so I'll start with the most striking omission, the absence of the M U S T A N G lettering across the trunk lid lip, and while we're back here, the trim on the trunk is barely noticeable and doesn't even exist on the quarter panel end caps. The gas cap is a poor representation of the flip type on the real car, and the back up lights are missing. Moving to the front grille, the fog light insert sits a tad too low, and there should be a slight spear on the bottom of the galloping horse emblem surround, duplicating the one on top. There should also be separate GT emblem badges on both lower side front fenders, not a decal as in the kit (Ed. Note: Decals include GT stripes in black, white, and red as well as the 289 decal for the air cleaner and an underhood decal). One last thing, the rocker panel should have a full length chrome runner, just under the door, from front to back. Now on to the highlights of this kit, as there are some standout pieces to be found.

The <u>body</u> is very accurate and nicely done, with no sink marks to be found, and good, crisp detailing, although the peak on the rear of the roof is too pronounced. The non-functional side quarter panel vents and the side roof vents are separate pieces. The trunk is also separate, and it takes a little work to get it to fit correctly. The front and rear clips are each one piece and it's a little tricky getting them to match up to the body as there are no locator pins to assist you. The hood, although correct for the GT, was not nearly as popular as the dual indented "turn signal in the hood" option. It would have been nice if both hoods were included in the kit

The engine turns out to be the 289 cubic inch, 271 horsepower power-plant and the kit refers to it as an extremely rare option for this model. That, my friends, is quite an understatement as the 390 was found between the fenders in most all '67 Mustang GTs. That being said, the little 289 is a jewel. It is made up of over 20 parts, and builds into the best 289 ever available in any kit, ever! Check out the dead accurate exhaust headers and the plain chrome rocker arm covers, which is the way all 271 hp engines came from Ford. Thank you AMT for this one.

The platform-style chassis is certainly correct for '67, but the stamped-in detail is a little soft. The best part is that all components are separate pieces and build into a very convincing chassis when finished. Especially nice are the rear leaf springs and the inclusion of motor mounts along with a good dual exhaust system.

The <u>interior</u> is where this model really shines. Correct all the way through. The door side panel is great, and the seats, both front and rear really hit the mark. My only suggestion here would be some decals for the dash gauges.

All things considered, I like this kit as long as you are not trying to duplicate the real car on the box. This kit can be built into an accurate GT model with a little work, or an equally accurate standard 2+2 model. The best news is, most everything you need to do either will be

available in the near future from Replicas & Miniatures Company of Maryland from my masters.

(The following story aptly illustrates what happens when NASCAR race fans have too much time on their hands in the off-season, so without further ado, here goes....)

Japanese in NASCAR....

API. Talladega, AL. The Japanese are crying foul following Sundays thrilling NASCAR Winston Cup stock car race at Talladega Superspeedway in Alabama.

Yoshi Matsushiki, Japan's hopeful, failed to qualify for the 500 mile race with a one lap best of 178.82 seconds (or 2.98 minutes!) at 53.55 mph in their factory-prepared Toyota Tercel.

In a heartfelt display of sportsmanship, the American teams passed the helmet and collected a total of \$32.00 that was presented to Yoshi's crew chief, Niko Foo Yung to assist in their continuing R & D effort.

At the urging of both drivers and fans alike, NASCAR offered Yoshi a starting spot on the outside pole as outside front row qualifier Rusty Wallace blew an engine idling through the garage area immediately following practice.

NASCAR allowed the Japanese team three laps to get up to speed before displaying the green flag. In a noble effort, Yoshi, with his size 18 shoes, stood on the loud pedal for all it was worth, as the field, led by polesitter and 7-time champ Dale Earnhardt closed in from behind heading into turn one. The sound of the Tercel engine was barely audible over the roar of the 200,000 plus fans in attendance.

As Earnhardt took the low groove, Mark Martin, in his Valvoline Thunderbird, went high. Both veterans, totally forgetting about the Japanese driver, came together and high fived each other in a spectacular display of driving talent. The Tercel was crushed between the two 3500 pound race cars and slid to a stop as the remaining 39 cars drove like monster trucks over Matsushiki's demolished race car.

Doyle Ford's red flag waved as the emergency crews sped to the crash

scene nearly passing last place starter Kyle Petty.

Miraculously, it soon became apparent from the muffled sound of Japanese expletives that Matsushiki had survived the horrifying incident. With the use of tin snips, Yoshi was cut free of the mangled car. After being restrained, he was transported to the infield care center as a precaution.

Thousands of enraged Japanese tourists have inundated NASCAR's Bill France Jr. and the Talladega speedway with letters and complaints as a

result of the incident.

This week, through the combined efforts of Richard Childress and Rousch Racing, the remnants of Japan's first Winston Cup entry was salvaged and the pieces welded together forming a unique sculpture consisting of a blue sheet metal oval, with a slanted bowtie-shaped conglomeration of broken mechanical parts painted red, serving as a stand.

The sculpture will be placed in an as yet unannounced location serving

as a historical tribute to the spirit of American stock car racing.

The Japanese have vowed to return again next year. Rumor has it, that they are preparing an 8-cylinder version of their Suzuki Samurai for an all-out assault on the American Superspeedways.

1970 Chevelle SS454

(AMT/ERTL #8940; 81 pieces; Lt. Gray, chrome, clear, clear red, vinyl tires)

A couple of years ago, ERTL put a reasonable amount of effort into retooling to correct some deficiencies in the '69 Chevelle kit. Apparently, no such effort was made to reissue this 1970 annual version.

Engine: The engine, in stock configuration, consists of 20 parts and none of them are chrome plated even though the valve covers and air cleaner lid should be. An optional high-rise manifold with Accel Superram fuel

injection system is provided, also unplated.

Chassis: This assembly is rather crude, even by 1970 standards. The front wheels are to be attached to flat plastic pieces which are then glued to flat slabs in the chassis with no representation of a front suspension at all. The rear wheels are pushed onto the tried-and-true metal axle which slides through a very short representation of a rear axle housing. The exhaust system is molded to this housing. Separate coil springs and shocks are then added. The optional custom wheels are the strangest looking round things I've ever found in a model kit and I doubt that they represent any real-world wheels (Ed. Note: These wheels represent the new Weld Racing EVO wheels, Lyle and I agree, they look somewhat unique!). Firestone Super Sport thin-line tires, first issued in the '66 Fairlane kits, are completely wrong for a '70 Chevelle.

Body: It should be noted that the box art shows the real car-not the model). The body kinda, sorta represents a '70 Chevelle. Instead of very subtle bulges around the wheelwells, there are spear-shaped lumps above each wheel. Above these is a sharp crease that runs the length of the body, reminiscent of a Ford Torino. A one piece, chromed grille/bumper/headlight assembly and rear bumper receive the appropriate clear lenses. The cowl induction bulge in the hood incorrectly comes to a point in the front and

is too long.

Interior: The bucket-style interior is assembled from 8 pieces. Faint engraving represents the door/side panels. The front bucket seats and

center console are all molded as a single piece.

Decals: The decal sheet provides factory stripes in both black and white as well as a Turbo-Jet 454 air cleaner decal. If you have a youngster who is ready to move from snappers to glue kits, this one is acceptable. However, adult musclecar modelers will run (not walk!) back to the Monogram shelf for a nicely detailed '70 Chevelle kit. I love ya ERTL, but this one really misses the mark!

part? It's free!






