This column will appear as frequently (or infrequently!) as new releases from the manufacturers. The idea behind it is to give a "thumbnail review" of the releases as they hit the shelves with a detailed review to follow at a later date (hopefully!). We'll see how it goes! (Ed. Note: The kits are listed in no particular order)

- '50 Chevy Street Machine (AMT #6681): Molded in Lt. Gray....modified reissue of stock pick-up....no V-8 for "Street Machine"....Rod parts consist of a chrome valve cover/air cleaner for six cylinder, custom wheels and Goodyear Eagle VR series tires, custom mirrors, shifter, and ZR-1 style rear tail light panel....flame decals, "ST RIDER:, "CTYSLKR", IN plates.
- '95 Chevy Blazer (AMT #8978): Molded in Lt. Gray...glass frosted on the rear, installs from the outside (with exception of front glass)....(4) Goodyear Wrangler AT tires....Arkansas "BLAZING" plates....nice dash engraving, separate, engraved dash gauge face....(2) sets of wheels-stock 5-spokes and 10hole aluminum....2-piece front bucket seats....platform-style interior....nicely done Vortec V-6 without the longitudinal seam!...nice, flash-free molding.
- '95 GMC Sonoma SLS (AMT #8109): Molded in Lt. Gray....(2) sets of wheels-5-spoke SS-style mags & 6-spoke smoothies....GMC grille with separate emblem...(4) Firestone tires....custom aero package and show car grille...."GMC Truck", "Sonoma" decal stripes (black and white) & emblems, Oklahoma "SONOMA" plate....see Blazer engine....separate door panels on interior....excellent instructions.
- '95 Ranger XLT (AMT #8945): Molded in Lt. Gray....chrome Ranger 5-spoke wheels (from Splash), and optional 3-spokers...(4) Firestone tires....correctly updated grille....modified reissue of Ranger STX...."Ranger XLT" emblems on cab....platform-style interior with separate door panels....8-piece aero

kit....custom grille w/integral fog lights...."95 RANGR" AZ, "RANGER" MI, and "XLT" Idaho plates.

1994 Harley-Davidson FLSTN Heritage Softail Special

(IMEX #405; 1:9th scale; 230 parts; white, black, chrome, clear, rubber tires, cables, springs, metal screws)

Now **THIS** is a Harley kit. In fact, building this model should be the employment test for prospective assemblers at the H-D plant in York, PA.

With about 230 parts, I won't detail each part or assembly, choosing instead just to hit the highlights. First of all, there is no flash and the high-gloss plastic is all separately bagged. The white fenders and tanks do not even need to be painted. There are five large chrome trees. Almost every individual part on the real bike is represented here in 1.9th scale. There are real axle bolts. The engine block mounts to the frame with tiny bolts. There are six separate steel springs for the working front and rear suspensions. A detailed battery mounts in the battery box which is located behind the oil tank, never to be seen again- but it's there! Cables for fuel, oil, brakes, and ignition are included. A three-piece carburetor holds a two-piece air cleaner. The builder drills the hole in the fuel tank to mount the detailed gas petcock. I could go on and on- the detail level is fantastic.

The decal sheet has all of the silver paint panels with very thin, red pinstripes and all of the other small, detailed markings on the real bike.


The builder must paint the whitewalls on the tires (I suggest thinned Polly S flat white). In fact, the only inaccuracy that I can find in the kit is the Dunlop Elite tires-they should be Goodyears.

I have purchased and built several motorcycle kits (and 1:1 scale bikes) over the last several years and would have to rate this kit the best ever, with the possible exception of the Gunze Sangyo '41 Indian. Although there is no skill rating on the box, this kit is for the experienced model builder (or Harley mechanic). If you are a fan of motorcycles, you **must have** this kit.



1965 Pontiac 2+2

(AMT/ERTL #6629-Modified Reissue)



I applaud AMT/ERTL's decision to market the 60's musclecars, as it is my favorite automotive segment. When I first looked at this kit, I was mildly disappointed, due to its lack of detail. Then I remembered that it was a modification of a 1965 Pontiac Bonneville kit, from the body, interior tub, engine and chassis, and that is not all bad.

<u>Body:</u> Modification of a 1965 Pontiac Bonneville 2 door hardtop as stated earlier, with the appropriate emblem changes to transform it into a 2+2. The emblems are crisp, yet faint in that they can be lost if there is a heavy build-up of paint. The two major inaccuracies in the body are 1) the tail light panel, where the tail lamps are too long, with no back-up lamp provisions, and 2) the body itself is 4 scale inches too long in the wheelbase through the decklid. If the optional fender skirts are left off, the added length is not too noticeable.

<u>Chassis:</u> 1965 issue in that all components are molded in, and metal axles are used to attach the wheels to the chassis.

<u>Interior:</u> 1965 tub-style which has been rescribed to the 2+2 upholstery pattern.

Engine: 1965 421 V-8 which is not very well detailed by today's standards i.e. hole in the sides of the engine block for the axle to pass through it, molded in starter and oil filter detail, as well as the unsightly seam down the middle of the oil pan.

<u>Wheels & Tires</u>: Pontiac's famous 8-lug wheels and 70's Goodyear Polyglas tires which can be red or white lined or replaced with Replicas & Miniatures Company of Maryland's red or white striped tires.

The car builds up easily and with some detailing and attention to detail will yield a wonderful addition to any muscle car fanatics collection.



Well gang, Phase 11 of Monogram/Revell's SSP program has arrived with the following goodies: <u>Revell-'57</u> Ford Ranchero (chopped top), "T" Touring Street Rod, Henry J, Don Schumacher's Vega funny car, and for you non-car guys, an atomic-powered submarine and an Apollo Astronaut on the moon. And from <u>Monogram-"Fast Buck"</u> (armored car

- bank), '26 Mack Dump truck, '32 Cadillac V-16, Panzerspaahwagen, and again for non-car types, a Fokker D VII and an RB-66A. A disturbing trend seems to be emerging in that the prices for these items are creeping up. The Mack dump truck, for example, has a retail of \$26.25!!

- "Pontiac-Driving (by itself) excitement?!" Scientists at Carnegie Mellon University's Robotics Institute are busy developing systems that will enable cars to "drive themselves" with software, computers, video cameras and other equipment. Last month, researchers took a Pontiac Transport minivan for a test drive from Pittsburg to Washington. The van averaged 57 mph on the approximately 250-mile trip. A video camera mounted below the rear view mirror "reads" the roadway, including oil spots and lane markers to determine its position. This info goes to a laptop computer mounted between the two front seats which processes it and sends signals to an electric motor which moves the steering wheel left or right. The system is powered by the cigarette lighter. To retake control of the van, you merely grab the steering wheel. There are some minor bugs to work out however. The van still doesn't know how to stop for red lights, can't brake on its own, cannot change lanes by itself, and sometimes mistakenly takes exit ramps which look inviting. Oh well, its progress! 


