

Sneakin' a Peek!

This column will appear as frequently (or infrequently!) as new releases from the manufacturers. The idea behind it is to give a "thumbnail review" of the releases as they hit the shelves with a detailed review to follow at a later date (hopefully!). We'll see how it goes! (Ed. Note: The kits are listed in no particular order)

- #94 "McDonald's" Thunderbird (AMT #8188): Molded in Lt. Gray....hood, and front bumper updated to '95 specs (rear bumper unchanged)....window braces molded in, missing window rails on rear glass....Goodyear Stock Car Special tires w/chrome Bassett 9-hole wheels (again, how long ago did they stop running chrome wheels?)....pretty complete decals again including tire marking decals and "Bassett" wheel decals...builder is on their own with regard to painting the yellow around the bottom of the car (black striping provided).
- #6 "Valvoline" Thunderbird (AMT #8189): Molded in Lt. Gray....builder to paint both blue and white areas, decals for the remainder....see "McDonald's" T-Bird for remainder.
- #8 "Raybestos" Thunderbird (AMT #8191): Molded in Lt. Gray....builder to paint faded paint scheme on decal as it is not provided....see "McDonald's" T-Bird for remainder.
- "96 Ford Explorer 4X4 (AMT #8968): Molded in Lt. Gray....4-door "Limited" model w/running boards....standard chrome grille and optional body-colored "Limited" style grille....clear head and tail lights along with back side door glass....glass frosted on rear for black areas....interior builds up platform-style....seats appear to be leather, consistent with upscale "LTD"

- package....Goodyear Wrangler AT tires with BBS-style wheels....full four-wheel drive mechanism....upper and lower radiator hoses....separate rear shocks, including a third "torsion shock"....exterior/interior color matrix chart included in typically excellent instructions...."EXPLORER" OR, "96 LTD" CO, and "LIMITED" MO plates, and white stripes.
- #87 "Burger King" Monte Carlo (Monogram #2468): Molded in Kodak yellow....identical to Goodwrench & Kodak cars reviewed last month...both colors will need to be painted, separation stripes supplied on decal sheet....decal sheet also includes Bassett wheel decals, Goodyear tire decals, and grille openings.
- '67 Shelby GT350 (AMT #6633): Molded in Lt. Gray....chrome 5-spoke magnum-style wheels....Shelby roll bar....Shelby scooped hood, spoilered decklid, correct front end w/twin driving lights (w/clear lenses), correct rear end with large tail lights, & separate C-pillar scoops as well as quarter panel-mounted scoops....complete 289 cu. in., 271 hp. motor carried over from GT version....decals include white stripes, Shelby emblems for front fenders and decklid.
- '67 Z28 Camaro (AMT #6638): Molded in Lt. Gray....Body exhibits "CAMARO" block script on front fenders above peak, "Chevrolet" scripts on panel over headlights and on trunk....Rally wheels appear different than '68 units (molded closed, different center caps)....'67 Camaro-specific grille....seat upholstery, console different....exhaust system, "Chevrolet" script valve covers unchanged....chrome 14" low restriction air cleaner in addition to '67 Cowl Induction air cleaner....rear traction bar....optional 5-spoke billet-style wheels (unplated) w/(4) Firestone tires, (2) Goodyear L60-15's....Black and White 'Z' stripes, '302' air cleaner decal, '67 CUSTM' CO, '1ST Z28' DE plates.

50 Chevy chopped pick-up Cab body

[Replicas & Miniatures Company of Maryland #B-12; 1/25th scale; 1 piece; molded in white resin (bagged), including "Working with Resin" instructions]

WOW! Thank you Lyle and Norman! This is a chopped top 3 window cab for the AMT 50 Chevy pick-up. I understand the master was modeled by *Lyle Willits* and he did a NICE job. In my opinion, the mild chop, coupled with the stock height rear window provides a nice 'look' for a non-stock model.

Specifically, what was changed: the top was lowered 2 scale inches, Nuview windows were filled, left, right, and cowl vent openings were filled, windshield wipers, door handles, and drip rails were removed, and the external gas cap was replaced with a fuel filler door. This body still requires the kit rear cab extensions and left/right fender fillers. The kit hood fits as if it belongs with the resin body.

Now, for the other details: flash is minimal for a resin body, RMCM's white resin feels slightly heavier than the AMT kit body and thickness appears the same, the kit mold lines are non-existent on the resin cab, and yet hood latch detail is still crisp. Body clean-up and prep should be minimal with a minor bit of seam work around the top of the doors. On mine, I found NO pin holes or sink marks.

The "Working with Resin" instructions are general resin tips and are clear and easy to understand. A contact name, address, and phone number is provided for problems or comments.



BITS & PIECES


