

Sneakin' a Peek!

This column will appear as frequently (or infrequently!) as new releases from the manufacturers. The idea behind it is to give a "thumbnail review" of the releases as they hit the shelves with a detailed review to follow at a later date (hopefully!). We'll see how it goes! (Ed. Note: The kits are listed in no particular order)

- '69 Olds 442 W30 (AMT #8232): Molded in Lt. Gray....Reissue of earlier version of kit with changes limited to decal sheet (deletion of white stripes, leaving only black), and new scallops....choice of single 4-barrel or tri-power....possible posable front end....hoses and underbumper scoops for W30 ram air....pair of Goodyear slicks included....optional American 5-spoke wheels included....nice chassis, with separate exhaust system....4-speed car....clear headlight lenses, clear red tail light lenses.
- Ford F150 Extended Cab 4X4 (AMT #8308; 1/25th scale Snapfast Plus): Molded in Dark Blue Metallic....3rd door lines present on passenger side....body proportions appear correct....separate mirrors...."F150" emblems are decals....separate mirrors....XLT rims present....chrome step bumper....front window and 1/4 windows 1 piece, separate rear window....gray interior....Firestone Radial ATX tires.
- Ed "Big Daddy" Roth's Mother's Worry (Revell #7623): Molded in White....Beady Eye decals....'23 T Roadster with Hilborn fuel injection....dice shifter....1-page instructions complete with painting instructions.
- Ed "Big Daddy" Roth's Outlaw with "Robbin Hood Fink" (Revell #7622): Molded in White....These instructions are several pages, including painting instructions....multi-piece engine block with Cragar 4 2-barrel intake....acetate included for windshield (template included in instructions)....Trophy and show stantions included (builder must supply thread)....large chrome tree (smooth and bright).
- '65 Chevelle Z-16 (Revell #7611): See review in this newsletter!
- '59 Impala Hardtop (Monogram): See review in this newsletter!
- '96 Mustang GT (AMT #8118): Molded in Red....tan interior....correct, new 5-spoke rims mounting Goodyear ZR rubber....glass frosted on rear for paint....1-piece bucket seats w/no backs...."PASSNU" CO, "FAST GT" GA plates, (2) spoiler stripes,& (2) different color cove stripes (red & blue).



1965 Chevelle Z-16

(Revell #7611; 1/25th scale; one version; 116 pieces; white, chrome, clear, clear red, vinyl tires)

Once the good folks at *Pontiac* knocked down the corporate-imposed cubic inch barrier, the muscle car wars were on. The Chevrolet division was forced to play catch-up when faced with the immediate success of the GTO, so they hastily stuffed the 350 hp, L-79 327 into the '65 Chevelle. This combination proved to be a very potent muscle car in its own right, but the automotive press preached the axiom "There's no substitute for cubic inches" in every publication. Chevrolet responded again with the introduction of a 375 hp version of the new 396 big block in the Chevelle and designated it as "Z-16" on the order form. Very few, if any, actually were ordered because all 201 Z-16's were given to corporate executives and celebrities, such as Phil Hill, A.J. Foyt, and Dan Blocker from the hit TV show Bonanza. A few, of course, were provided to the automotive press, to chronicle the arrival of Chevrolet's answer to the GTO.

Exactly 200 two-door coupes and one convertible were produced under the Z-16 code and each was optioned identically except for color. Z-16 colors were limited to *Black, Red*, and *Crocus Yellow*, Black being the rarest. Interior were either black or white. A few Z-16's had vinyl tops. All Z-16's came with "mag-style" wheel covers, gold line tires, unique tail panel treatment, AM-FM multiplex radio with an under-dash speaker control box and a dash-top mounted clock (*No, it ain't a tach!*).

Revell has provided us "little car" people with an extremely accurate and highly detailed kit to produce a replica of this rare muscle car. Only a few minor parts were carried over from the '67 Chevelle kit as this is basically an all-new tool. This kit equals or surpasses the detail level of the GTX, Dodge Dart, or '55 Chevy recently released.

Body: The kit is molded in white with crisp, clean detail throughout. The body, with separate hood, has well-engraved, highly detailed scripts and emblems which will not get lost in the paint. The leading edge of the hood receives a thin, chrome molding. The unique tail panel is correctly represented with a separate chrome piece which needs to be painted matte black between the ridges. The uppermost ridge for this panel, however, is molded to the edge of the trunk lid and needs to be covered with chrome foil. There are separate, chromed rocker panel moldings, separate door handles that mount into locating notches chromed windshield wipers, clear lenses for the turn signals and backup lights (and headlight lenses, of course!). and even a small, chromed dome light for the inside of the roof.

Engine: I would have thought that Revell would simply reissue the fine 396 assembly from the '67 Chevelle but instead, they have tooled a completely new big block that is incredibly detailed. This 25-piece work of art actually has a separate fan clutch which mounts to the front of the most accurate plastic fan I've ever seen in a kit. A new, detailed carburetor is provided, along with a correct for '65 dual snorkel air cleaner base and a separate chrome lid. Of course, all the 'normal' separate engine parts are included along with accurate decals for the right side valve cover and air cleaner. Revell keeps finding new ways to impress this old modeler!

Chassis: Did Revell use the finely detailed chassis components from the '67 Chevelle which would be perfectly correct and acceptable for this car? NO!! Again, they have tooled brand new pieces and there are 19 of them (!)including the separate exhausts. Individual items include left and right control arms, four coils, shocks, a 3-piece differential and a separate, accurate rear say bar. Wheels are assembled from simple backing plates and beautifully done chromed wheel covers. Ignore the painting instructions for the wheels, however. You will need some flat clear, dark metallic gray, semi-gloss black, and a good reference photo (Ed. Note: Can ya help us there, Lyle?). These wheels can be used on several other Chevy models from '65 through '68. The tires in the kit are the old Michelin TRX's. Some folks will complain about these, but I like 'em because of the good tread detail and because the sidewalls can easily be painted using a draftsman's compass. If you know how to do this painting procedure, the paint you will need for the 'gold lines' is Polly-S #400432 CP Yellow. If you are unfamiliar with this trick, read George Bojaciuk's article in SAE #46, December 1996. Or.....buy a neat set of thin line resin tires from Replicas & Miniatures Company of Maryland and paint the

thin, white resin insert with the paint mentioned above before assembling them. (Norm will donate the money to his favorite mortgage company).

<u>Interior</u>: The interior is built up from the platform with 13 highly detailed pieces. The engraving just has to be seen to be believed- I just doesn't get any better than this (Can we say that, Lyle?). Three gauge faces are provided on the decal sheet for the dash. There is no separate decal for the dash-mounted clock, but it would be too small to be seen anyway-the clock is not shown on the instruction sheet but it is in the kit as part #14.

With the complete photoetched kit from the <u>Model Car Garage</u>, you can build any replica stock version of a '65 Chevelle. The kit includes the standard Chevelle rear panel trim, engine insignias for a six-banger 250, 283, 327, and the 396. Also included are individual block letters for both the hood and trunk, scripts, steering wheel spokes, interior details, etc., etc., etc., El Camino scripts are also included so the kit can be used with the forthcoming reissue of the '65 El Camino kit from AMT. Oh yeah, I almost forgot to mention the beautiful photoetched grille in the kit. Buy several of these so that Bob Korunow can pay his phone bill. We now return you to our regularly scheduled review. Anyway, this kit is fantastic as have been the other recent offerings from Revell and Monogram. Unless you only have little blue ovals pulsing through your veins, you must get one or more of these kits. An easy kit-bashing project would be to use the wheel covers and the L-79 engine assembly from an AMT '66 Nova to build a 'standard' '65 Malibu SS. Many other possibilities come to mind. Anyway, start building!

1959 Chevy Impala 2-door hardtop

(Monogram #2454; 1/25th scale; Modified Reissue)

This kit is a companion to Monogram's excellent '59 Impala convertible issued last

year, and, yes, this kit shares most of its major assemblies with it. When you open the box, a pleasant surprise awaits-white plastic! Thank you, Monogram!

Engine: The same excellent 348 "Turbo Thrust" V-8 equipped with three two-barrel carburetors which was present in the convertible. The 22-piece assembly comes with separate items such as the fuel pump, starter, oil filler tube, power steering pump, generator with molded-in bracket and two-piece air cleaner. This unit is typical "Monogram style" with the engine and transmission being a single unit, split down the middle, so the seam will require some attention prior to paint. The transmission represented here is the short-lived "Turboglide" automatic transmission. The molding is crisp and it assembles into a very convincing unit. With a few carefully selected aftermarket detailing items, this engine can easily find a home in any contest-winning late fifties/early sixties Chevy.

<u>Chassis:</u> Again, the same as the convert, and it is an excellent rendition of a late fifties/early sixties chassis. The engraving is crisp, and the separate front and rear suspension assemblies, while simplified, are beautiful once finished. Separate components include an accurate dual exhaust system, upper control arms, lower control arm assembly, rear axle with control arms and coil springs, steering box and shaft, shocks, and rear sway bar.

Interior: Modified from that in the convertible in that the rear seat is reconfigured for the hardtop application as well as the side panels. Again, all engraving is clean and crisp. The interior tub has a unique assembly layout as it has a separate lower floor, side panels, front floor with firewall molded on the opposite side, dashboard with separate, chromed lower panels, separate pedals, steering column with gear lever, turn signal lever, and quadrant indicator, and a beautifully molded "Impala"

steering wheel to top it off. Turquoise and red striped adhesive-backed seat inserts are included to depict your choice of upholstery.

The underhood compartment needs to be mentioned in that the firewall accessories are accurately depicted on the firewall, and the core support is separate from the body with a 2-piece radiator, with upper and lower radiator hoses, and a battery along with comprehensive instructions on mounting them.

"No Name" tires with separate whitewall inserts are included with accurately engraved stock wheel covers with optional, 2-pronged spinners. Note-if you do not use the spinners, the wheel covers will not be compromised with regard to their accuracy. Tip-Paint the very edge of the wheel covers black, red, or the color of your choice for that Fifties look after the black wash in the slots and fins in the wheel cover for that superdetailed look.

Body: This is without a doubt the best rendition of a '59 Impala 2-door hardtop which I have ever seen in scale. There is one little problem, and it appears to be a common one shared with several Revellogram new tools of the past few years-the roof appears to be overly flat! I can only assume that this is a concession for molding and/or ease of assembly, but that fact aside, it still looks very good. From the side view, the roof proportions appear right on! There is even a separate roof ornament, which is mounted over the rear window. A two-piece rear view mirror, fender skirts, separate chrome side trim, 2 complete sets of bumpers, a continental kit (optional and accurate), separate door handles, windshield wipers, not to mention excellent engraving on other emblems and ornaments. Fair warning though, this car has a lot of chrome trim, and while there are separate chrome pieces, you will need a lot of chrome foil to trim out this girl after painting!

I know this review may seem a little long, but this is an excellent kit that is aimed towards the experienced modeler. If you have not been building models for very long, a word of advice-take your time on this one! Work slow and you too can have an excellent model as the end result. I wholeheartedly recommend this kit.
