



Sneakin' a Peek!

This column will appear as frequently (or infrequently!) as new releases from the manufacturers. The idea behind it is to give a "thumbnail review" of the releases as they hit the shelves with a detailed review to follow at a later date (hopefully!). We'll see how it goes! (Ed. Note: The kits are listed in no particular order)

'66 Thunderbird (AMT #8210): Molded in Lt. Gray (body badly warped, also)....mildly
modified reissue....tub-style interior, simplified chassis....body exhibits light engraving, and some

• "Western Auto Parts America" Monte Carlo (AMT #8404): Molded in Lt. Gray....straight reissue of earlier Monte Carlo....chrome 9-hole wheels and jack....front and rear glass has rails and braces molded to them....quarter windows have duct openings molded in, and a separate NACA duct for the driver....no yellow Goodyear tire markings for tires....main sponsor decals present, builder must entirely paint car otherwise....#17 numerals are gray rather than silver foil as on box lid photo of actual car.

Ford GT90



AMT #8381; 1/25th scale Snapfast Plus; one version; molded in white, blue, chrome, clear, vinyl tires)

The GT90. Ford's angular, 720hp., DOHC twin-turbocharged, V12-powered \$3-million dollar one-off supercar (whew, say that three times fast!). Built for the show circuit, it was hinted that Ford might even consider a return to Lemans with this car. After all, this summer doers mark the 30th Anniversary of Carroll Shelby's assault on the famous race track when his teams scored an impressive 1-2-3 finish. Apparently, the only way we will see this car in production is by way of AMT, in the form of this Snapfast Plus kit, and a promo to be released later this year.

Engine: A simplified rendition of the V12 is molded to the interior tub. Good engraving is evident, and the "Powered by Ford" plates on the valve covers are easily readable.

<u>Chassis:</u> Basically, a flat plate which attaches to the body via four screws. There are two separate fans which mount on the front end which are visible through the hood opening.

Wheels and Tires: AMT tooled up the unique GT90 tires. What makes them unique? The "GT90" which is cut into the treads around the entire contact patch of the tire, that's what! These tires mount onto the correct rims with separate knockoffs. The really neat thing about these rims is that they are 1-piece, but the center is blue plastic with a chrome outer ring, just like the real thing! Its as if they masked off the blue center and chromed the outer ring.

<u>Body:</u> The basic body consists of seven pieces, and seems to capture the angular look of the car very well. Mold lines are at an absolute minimum, and easily attended to. The separate mirrors are nicely done, standing off the body on their twin stalks and are provided with their own separate silver mylar faces. The 'hood' is a separate item, along with the inner scoop faces and the rear panel. The exhaust outlet is a separate piece. Clear red tail lights are provided, which isn't totally correct as these lights have an amber strip on the inner face.

Interior: The interior is tub-style, with the engine bay attached. The interior floor, and 1-piece bucket seats are true to the original, with "GT90" literally written all over them. The dash is 1 piece, with the 3-gauge cluster molded separately. The steering wheel and column are 1 piece each. The small triangle on the steering wheel is yellow, from the reference material available to me. The unique console is molded in black, with the special, exposed shifter rail and shifter molded in chrome. A shot of dullcoat does wonders for this unit. Gauge faces are provided as either waterslide or vinyl stick ons.

Glass: The glass canopy is 1 piece with a separate rear window. The door lines/window frames are engraved on the underside, and look good when painted. The rear window has a piece of the body work molded to the bottom which will need to be painted white to be correct. A decal is provided for the back of the canopy. Separate clear lenses slot into the front of the body for the headlights. Curiously absent are the front parking light lens covers. The tail lights are separate red items, to which the builder must add the amber to the inner edge.

Markings: AMT thoughtfully provided markings for this car in two formats-vinyl stick-ons, or waterslide style. So, the kit should appeal to adult as well as junior modelers. AMT provides the amber strip for the tail lights, as well as (4) Ford logos (for the front, sides, and rear of the car. Guess they want everyone to know what it is!), along with some small decals for the B-pillar.

This is a car which, based upon its 'unique' look, people either love or hate. Upon receiving it, I began to look through it. The more I looked, the neater it got. This kit was a lot of fun (even for a snap kit!), and AMT did a really good job on it.

Resin Rantings

Well gang, we are back for another crack (Ed. Note: Don't say crack to a modeler!). We are gonna look at an offering from <u>Replicas & Miniatures Company of MD</u> (317 Roosevelt Ave Glen Burnie, MD 21061). That would be the '39 Chevy Coupe with "Posies" style roofline. Originally available from Altered States, *Rik Hoving* (who did the master) approached Replicas and Miniatures Co. of MD proprietor *Norman Veber*, offering him exclusive rights to several of his masters.

This kit features seven pieces, including the one-piece body and separate hood, separate grille, headlight buckets, and nicely done clear headlight lenses and clear red Blue Dot teardrop tail lights. There are no chrome pieces. A template for creating windows is provided. The recommended donor kit is either the Revell/Monogram '37 Ford or Monogram '39 Chevy.

This a cleanly molded and styled custom. The body had flash in the window openings and rear wheel openings. This was very thin and virtually fell out on its own. There were no pinholes evident. The panel lines were crisp and distinct.

I would recommend this kit for those seeking a well-done custom with loads of potential. Contact Replicas and miniatures Co. of MD at the address above for price, availability and ordering info.


Alan took Davey down a corridor and into a room. There sat the #7 "Hooter's" T-Bird. "Wow, is there racing up here?" Davey asked.

Customers.....


-like vendors with reasonable prices who are model builders too!

Toy Show Tips

- Save money, bring trades!
- Always ask for the BEST price, stretch your purchasing power!

- Get a business card from dealers!
- Get there early for a bigger and better selection!
- Ask questions! Networking produces results!
- Beware of sealed kits that have been exposed to excessive sunlight/heat! Could be your loss, not the vendors!
- Always check unsealed kits for completeness!
- Beware of damage hidden by price label (built-ups, promos)
- Always check prices between vendors before making purchase!
