


'97 Meeting Schedule

From the Baltimore Beltway (RT 695): Take Exit 7, Route 295 (Baltimore-Washington Parkway) south towards Washington approx. 18 miles to Route 193 (Greenbelt Road), and exit. When on the off-ramp, stay to the right and merge right onto Southway (see below).

From the Washington Beltway (RT 495): Take Exit 22 north, towards Baltimore. Stay in the right lane and take the first exit onto Route 193 (Greenbelt Road). When on the off-ramp, bear to the right and take Greenbelt road west, towards College Park. Stay in the right lane and immediately after passing over the Parkway, make a right (at the light) onto Southway (see below).

Once on Southway: Go straight to the second (2nd) STOP sign. Make a left onto Crescent road. Go to STOP sign and make a right into the parking lot behind the Greenbelt Library. Once in parking lot, look to right. The large, white building is the Greenbelt Community Center. Enter building using doors near fenced tot lot. The multi-purpose room is on the second floor. There is an elevator to the left of the entrance.

<u>Sneakin' a Peek!</u>

This column will appear as frequently (or infrequently!) as new releases from the manufacturers. The idea behind it is to give a "thumbnail review" of the releases as they hit the shelves with a detailed review to follow at a later date (hopefully!). We'll see how it goes! (Ed. Note: The kits are listed in no particular order)

- "Beatnik Bandit II" (Revell #85-7618): Molded in white....(6) tires....(4) Michelins are big 'n bigger, and are in a bag, while the other (2) are loose Dunlops....big 'n bigger chrome 5-spoke wheels....nice tuned-port 'Vette small block....clear dash gauge lens cover w/digital gauge face decal....Bonneville grille (Hey, Ron Hamilton!)....yellow-tinted canopy....new 2-piece Ed Roth figure, along with a 2-piece Rat Fink figure.
- Speedwagon (Revell #85-7606): Molded in white....Big 'n little Goodyears mounting textured Torque Thrust-style 5-spoke mags....5.0 liter EFI Ford motor....body features woodgrain texture on wood panel inserts, smooth hood sides....woodgrain decal inserts, 'USP 024' OR plate (new owner?). (See review this issue!)
- '78 Corvette Indy Pace car (Monogram #85-2444): Molded in white....(4) Goodyear Eagle GT Radials which mount correct slotted aluminum Rally wheels....clear T-tops....all spoilers are separate...nice 12-piece carbureted small block V-8 w/separate, chrome air cleaner and decals....tub-style interior w/decals for all gauges, even the 4-speed shift pattern on console!.... decals by Scale-Master include aforementioned gauges, all markings, striping, 1978 "Indy Pace Car" plates, "USA-1", "BRIKYRD" CA plates, Goodyear GT Radial sidewall markings.
- #10 "Tide" T-Bird (Monogram #2478): Molded in white....re-hash of excellent 1995 T-Bird kit.
- "American International Motorsports" dragster (Revell #85-7616): Molded in white....Goodyear Eagle F/C slicks (heavy flash), new small, bicycle-style front tires, mounting 8-hole front wheels, ConvoPros out back....decals include all major markings, even including tire markings....re-hash of earlier dragsters.
- Harley Davidson Electra Glide (Revell #85-7308, 1/8th scale): Molded in white...(2) large chrome trees included (one bagged!)....tubing included for brake/clutch cables....decals for H-D markings, speedometer, and marker lights (Revell of Germany reissue?).


Dan Fink's Speedwagon



(Monogram #85-7606; one version; 100 pieces; white, clear, clear red, chrome, vinyl tires)

This is the second incarnation of the excellent '32 Ford street rod kit from *Revell*, but this time, it is in a *Monogram* box. This version fairly well represents the one-off phantom woodie designed by *Thom Taylor* and built by *D.F. Metalworks* in 1993. Although the box art photos and instruction sheet provide a good start for detailing this kit, it is also very helpful to find a copy of *Street Rodder*, *September 1993* as an additional reference source. To produce an *exact* replica of the prototype, the above magazine is a must, because some reasonable concessions have been made to tooling and production costs.


<u>Body:</u> The body appears to be amazingly accurate compared to photos of the real car. The height of the roof, the angle of the windshield and all of the wood paneling are right on the money. New, smooth hood sides are included in this kit, but the original hood top was reissued requiring the builder to remove the molded hinge ridge on top, yielding a smooth piece.



The fenders, grille shell, dropped headlight bar and spreader bars are reissued and are correct. A new, smooth gas tank cover duplicates the real thing and the correct tail lights are assembled from chrome reflectors and clear red lenses (*Now* I know what those chrome oval things are in all the 3-window kits I bought!). Finally, a two-piece outside mirror and all of the clear windows complete the assembly. All of the inset wooden panels are reproduced on the decal sheet, so the builder need only paint the raised wooden framework a light tan. Although these woodgrain decals do not actually match the coloring on the real car, they will save mucho aggravation to the builder who is not experienced in woodgraining with paint (Another alternative would be to offer *Tim Powers* some *mega bucks*, and maybe he would woodgrain it for ya!).

<u>Interior</u>: The interior is assembled from 13 pieces and very accurately duplicates the prototype. The floorpan has the rear seat molded to it and the front buckets are built up from two pieces each. The rest of the interior is reissued from the 3-window kit and is correct for this car. The wide stripe in the middle of the door panels should be painted Ford Engine Blue and the rest of the assembly painted a very light beige. The carpeting is dark blue.

Engine: The correct Ford 302 small block is reissued from the 3-window kit, but this time includes the fuel injection unit with integral hose and air cleaner, and new, smooth chromed valve covers. Ignore the painting instructions on the sheet regarding the heads and oil pan. The entire engine assembly (other than chrome pieces) should be Ford Engine Blue. The real car does <u>not</u> have an electric cooling fan as provided in the kit, but rather a six-blade aluminum, crank-driven fan. Several of our favorite aftermarket photoetch purveyors or (perverts) can provide this item.



<u>Frame/Chassis:</u> All of the frame and suspension pieces have been directly reissued from the 3-window kit. However, much of this assembly does not actually duplicate the items on the real Speedwagon. Most of us do not display our models upside-down, so who cares?!? For those wishing to build an exact replica, the frame could be modified with some scratchbuilt plastic tubing and, the exhaust system could

be copied with some tubing and correct mufflers from the parts box. The 'visible' parts of the chassis are, of course, the wheels which are technically not correct, but they are pretty darn close. The beautiful textured five-spoke mags from the 3-window kit should not be 'textured'. The real car has highly polished (chromed) American Racing Torq-Thrust wheels, which can be found in any AMT '69 Olds 442 kit.

<u>Decals:</u> The decal sheet includes the aforementioned woodgrained panels, a three-gauge dash panel, and two Oregon plates (Maybe the real car was sold to someone in Oregon!). There is also a D.F. Metalworks logo decal for the rear window, and one other small decal that could not be identified by most healthy birds of prey!!

Our friends in the aftermarket businesses will be providing some high tech items for this kit, such as the curved billet grille assembly, but straight from the box, this kit builds into a pretty accurate replica of a modern 'famous' car.

"Kulture Korner"



An easy match for the black Corvette of Big Ralph from Rolfe




They set up a meeting one moonlit night

If Ralph would win or if it would be Peggy from Poky




The flag went down and the squeal and roar

SUBARU: Send undercover boat and radioactive Uranium


