

Well guys, word has just come down from the mountain regarding next years' schedule and meeting place. From the Baltimore Beltway (RT 695): Take Exit 7, Route 295 (Baltimore-Washington Parkway) south towards Washington approx. 18 miles to Route 193 (Greenbelt Road), and exit. When on the off-ramp, stay to the right and merge right onto Southway (see below).

From the Washington Beltway (RT 495): Take Exit 22 north, towards Baltimore. Stay in the right lane and take the first exit onto Route 193 (Greenbelt Road). When on the off-ramp, bear to the right and take Greenbelt road west, towards College Park. Stay in the right lane and immediately after passing over the Parkway, make a right (at the light) onto Southway (see below).

Once on Southway: Go straight to the second (2nd) STOP sign. Make a left onto Crescent road. Go to STOP sign and make a right into the parking lot behind the Greenbelt Library. Once in parking lot, look to right. The large, white building is the Greenbelt Community Center. Enter building using doors near fenced tot lot. The multi-purpose room is on the second floor. There is an elevator to the left of the entrance.

Sneakin' a Peek!

This column appears as frequently (or infrequently!) as new releases from the manufacturers. The idea behind it is to give a "thumbnail review" of the releases as they hit the shelves with a more detailed review to follow at a later date (hopefully!). We'll see how it goes! (Ed. Note: The kits are listed in no particular order)

- "AC Delco" Chevy Truck (AMT/ERTL #8305): Molded in Lt. Gray....repop of the "Goodwrench" Chevy....pick-up bed lines present, compared to none on the Ford....separate front clip w/screened-in openings, and (3) more on the airdam....separate rear cab wall....old, incorrect Goodyear Stock Car Special tires, with one side blank for decal markings....decals include head/parking light decals, "Goodyear #1 Eagle" markings, window tint band.
- "Quaker State" Chevy Truck (AMT/ERTL #8406): Molded in Lt. Gray....tail lights also included on the decal sheet for this one....see AC Delco for remainder.
- Shelby Cobra 427 (AMT #6589): Finished in Bright Yellow....'fully wired' Ford blue 427 big block....metal steering shaft for steerable wheels thru steering wheel....decal gauge panel....all exterior trim chrome plated....step-by-step instructions.
- 1969 Chevrolet Camaro Z28 (AMT #6590): Finished in Hugger Orange....302 small block w/o 'plug wires'....engine screwed together (probably neatly hidden by headers)....chambered exhaust...again, metal steering shaft for steerable wheels thru steering wheel...separate gauge panel/decal....all chrome trim separate.
- 1967 Corvette L-71 Roadster (AMT #6597): Finished in Tuxedo Black w/red hood striping....fat block w/tri-power....Chevy Rallye wheels w/redline tires....sidepipes....metal steering shaft for steerable wheels thru steering wheel....separate gauge panel/decal.
- 1997 Pontiac Firebird Trans Am (AMT #8223): Molded in Lt. Gray....retooled T/A bumper....same old tri-spoke wheels, w/new five-spokers also included....low-deck spoiler, instead of high off-deck spoiler....new decals, including 'Trans Am' marking for doors....incorrect single exhaust system.
- 1997 Chevrolet Camaro 30th Anniversary Edition (AMT #8222): Molded in Lt. Gray....seemingly incorrect (Corvette?) plated wheels....Anniversary graphics, gauge face decal!!....running gear, tires, and chassis virtually identical to Trans Am.
- 1955 Chevy Indy Pace Car (Revell-Monogram #2496): Molded in White....retooled from excellent '555 hardtop....choice of up-top or convertible boot....Pace Car graphics, 'Firestone' tire markings, air filter, and oil filter decals....26-piece small block.

- 1956 Chevrolet Nomad (Revell-Monogram #2489); Molded in White...retool of '55 Chevy....same small block, dual exhausts....same 2-piece wide whitewalls, with full wheel covers....three decals for engine, and four for the dashboard!
- #94 "McDonald's" T-Bird (Revell-Monogram #85-2486): Molded in White....reissue of excellent 1996 version, with updated decals.
- #29 Cartoon Network Monte Carlo (Revell-Monogram #85-2484): Molded in White....again, reissue of excellent 1996 Monte Carlo with updated decals.

- Revell Nationals!! It's official-Revell-Monogram will sponsor the NHRA event at Texas Motorplex, just outside of Dallas on October 16th to 19th. The press release, on NHRA's home page, specifies this is a multi-year deal. Guess those of us who have been buyin' all those kits have a piece of this one, eh?
- Carjacked Taurus!! An experimental Ford Taurus valued by police at about \$250,000 was 'borrowed' by teens at gunpoint in the 'Motor City', Detroit recently. On April 9th, a Ford Engineer parked the car outside a video store on the east side of Detroit. Police said it looked normal on the outside, but on the inside, there was about \$60,000 worth of computer equipment used for measuring gas mileage of an experimental engine. The teens drove the car to a nearby apartment. Acting on a tip, the police recovered much of the computer equipment, which had been scattered around the building. They later found the car, and apprehended a 15-year-old who tried to drive it away. Police speculate that these guys didn't know what they had!

The latest issue of <u>Custom Rodder</u> has a shot of <u>Ron Hamilton's</u> '58 Impala (in addition to mentioning MAMA's yearly NNL show!), and the latest issue of <u>Street Rodder</u> has <u>MAMA Prez Lyle Willits' peach Woodie</u> buried within its' pages-congrats to all of you!
- Speakin' of the NNL! It is with a heavy heart that I must relay to you all that this year's show must be postponed due to the renovation at the Armory, and not being able to get signed contracts of any appreciable lead time to allow for adequate planning. So, in the interest of sponsoring a well-run show, and not wanting to ruin past successes, we decided to lay off this year, and come back stronger than ever next year!
- More Mustang Mania! Finalists for the Mustang museum have been whittled from 25 to 10 cities. In alphabetical order, here they are: Atlanta, Charlotte, Chicago, Dallas/Fort Worth, Daytona Beach, Detroit/Dearborn, Indianapolis, Los Angeles/Anaheim, Orlando, and Philadelphia. Any bets on Detroit/Dearborn?! The museum is expected to open in April, 2000, perhaps on April 17th, which was the on-sale date of the 64 ½ Mustang. Thanks to the May 2nd Washington Times!
- Land of Lincoln. The staff of Ford public relations was nervous. The *new Lincoln Town Car* was about to be unveiled at the New York auto show, and *Jac Nasser*, President of Ford Automotive Operations, had not yet arrived. Finally, just in time, he arrived, after being delayed in brutal New York traffic (he was stuck, of course, in the Lincoln Tunnel). Thanks to Autoweek for this one!
- More Slixx! More news on Slixx '97 decals is out. Expect sets for the #1 "Delco-Remy" Pontiac, #16 "Primestar" T-Bird, #24 "Dupont Chroma" Chevy, #11 "Lowe's" Chevy, #31 "RealTree" Chevy, #36 "Skittles" Pontiac, and #98 "RCA" T-Bird (Winston Cup). Busch Grand National decals will include the #36 "Stanley" Chevy (Ed. Note: I believe its a Pontiac!), and the #87 "Bellsouth" Chevy. NASCAR Craftsman truck series will include the #07 "Lovable" Ford, #7 "QVC" Ford, #24 "Quaker State" Chevy, #80 "LCI" Ford, #87 "Bellsouth" Chevy, and the #99 "Exide" Ford. Vintage Winston Cup will include the #44 "Stratagraph" Chevy (80's), #90 "Sunny King" Ford (80's), and the #90 "Bull' Eye" Ford ('88-'89).

- Diecast Mania! One of our own, *Dennis Zadra*, is forming a spin-off of our club devoted to *Diecast Collectors* (Are you guys gonna banish me to that group?!). - happy!! Seems as though among his 1997 releases we find decals to build Pontiac's one-off Ram Air V Royal Bobcat GTO, along with 1970 Pontiac GTO Judge fender stripes (good for 1971 also!). Look for those in October 1997. Other highlights include 1966-1969 Mustang special stripes (GT-500KR, California Special, etc.), 1950-70 Ferrari white racing numbers, several Speedway oval racers, the "Strip Blazer III' '65 Chevelle Z-16, the "California Flash" '65 Plymouth, "Tasca Ford" '66 Mustang, Dick Landy's '69 Dodge Dart, a 1971 Dodge Challenger R/T sheet (black/white stripes, accessories), Chicago FD vehicles (1920-69-2-sheet set), and 1969-present Chicago FD vehicles (2-sheet set), emergency vehicle art (names, symbols, civil defense, star of life), 1990's Cook County (Illinois) Sheriff's dept, '50's Buick style side panels/aluminum trim (white, red, teal), and '50's custom hood, sides, top, and trunk scallops (silver/red outline, 2-sheet set).
- Studependous! Seems as though the Avanti may be returning in the form of the AVX- short for AVanti eXperimental. The brainchild of Avanti enthusiasts Jim Bunting and Tom Kellogg (an original member of Raymond Lowey's Avanti design team), it is said to be based on the 1993 and later Firebird platform. Each car is hand-crafted by Bill Lang at Lang's Custom Auto Body in Harrisburg, PA, where the Firebird body is stripped of most of its sheetmetal (only the roof and quarter panels remain). A revamped interior is next, and topping it off is a set of wheels designed by Kellogg and manufactured by Boyd's Wheels. For motive power, any one of the Firebird's current engines from the 3.8 V-6 to the 5.7 liter V-8 can be specified, in addition to a wild, supercharged version built by Racecrafters of Lancaster, PA that puts out 650 hp! Cost for the conversion is \$26,500, and customers must supply the Firebird. Engine 'tweaks' run from 30 hp for a mere \$1,273 to only \$20,799 for the 650 hp screamer! Each AVX gets a 30-page color portfolio which includes Kellogg's concept drawings and sketches. For more info, call (717)299-0254 or visit their website at http://AVXcars.com! - More Firebirds! Got word from a fellow Pontiac (Firebird) enthusiast about a 4th generation Macho Trans Am! Dennis Mecham, developer of the first Macho T/A's, has purchased several for prototype development. Three levels are planned, with prices ranging from \$30,000 for level one, \$42,000 for level 2, and \$60,000+ for the third (top) level. The first level will include mainly bolt-ons, while the second level will supplement that with a 400hp CARB-legal small block, and the top level will most likely be a Macho SD. It should include the basic package along with a 500hp stroker motor, big tires, and big brakes. Interested? Run, do not walk to your nearest Pontiac dealer where you can either order the car to be drop-shipped to Biddulph Pontiac (formerly Mecham Pontiac) in Glendale, AZ (where it will be modified). The only downer is that from there, it will have to be driven (bummer!) or transported to its destination by the owner.
- Out-of-this-Galaxy Chebbies! Word reaches me from Salt Lake about the upcoming Galaxy Chevies. Reported to number seven cars from '41, and '46 to '48, they are reported to be in the \$25-\$30 range. Word is they will be contenders for 1999 Kits of the Year if the tooling people can translate all the detail drawings and photographic reference into plastic-we'll see!
