

The idea behind it is to give a "thumbnail review" of the releases as they hit the shelves with a more detailed review to follow at a later date (hopefully!). We'll see how it goes! (Ed.  front axle, along with posable steering...molded-in exhaust system...body features separate hood and
 tail _ate, along with optional El Camino-style roofline...(3) sets of license plates-'E-55MAD' AZ,
 'NOMADR' CO, and 'BEL AIR' GA 1955 issue plates.
- #24 'Jurassic Park The Ride' Monte Carlo (Revell-Monogram #85-1710, 1/32nd scale Snaptite): Mold d in red....reissue of earlier Monte Carlo, complete w/chrome wheels....nice, vinyl 'Jurassic Park' vinyl markings.
- #24 'Jurassic Park The Ride' Monte Carlo (Revell-Monogram #2525): Molded in white...modified reissue with an all-new, slab-sided body...new front air dam...again, as in Snaptite kit, colorful 'Jurassic Park' decals...new air hoses in interior...new tires...inner front pillar braces as in the Pontiac.
- #44 'Hot Wheels' Pontiac (Revell-Monogram #2524): Molded in white....reissue of John Deere Pontiac with exception of colorful 'Hot Wheels' graphics.
- #16 'NAPA' Chevy® (Revell-Monogram #2519): Molded in white....reissue of earlier trucks with exception of colorful 'NAPA' graphics.
- 'Drag-On Lady' '67 Dodge® Coronet (Revell-Monogram #7632): Molded in white....modified reissue of '67 Coronet R/T....nice, new headers in place of cast iron manifolds....new 4-speed shifter,

tach for interior....console absent for drag version (excess weight!)....new Keystone-style mag wheels, w/Goodyear slicks...new hood scoop....decals include two variations-'STP' and 'Wynn's'.

• Robin's TM Redbird Motorcycle (Revell-Monogram #6725): Molded in Dark Blue Metallic....9piece Robin figure....excellent instructions including painting tips, including use of a flat black wash on chrome engine inserts.

1997 Chevrolet Camaro 30th Anniversary Edition

(AMT/ERTL #8222; Modified reissue; 1/25th scale; 115 pieces, including decals; Skill level 2)

In the 1:1 world, Chevrolet has made some refinements to the 1997 Camaro, most notably, a 30th Anniversary Edition package consisting of Arctic White paint with Hugger Orange sport stripes running from nose to tail, white or chrome 5-spoke wheels, and a special white leather-trimmed interior with the choice of black and white Houndstooth cloth or white perforated leather inserts for the seats.

Other changes which are common to all 1997 Camaros are an all-new interior with restyled seats, floor console, door panels, dashboard and steering wheel, in addition to the 5-spoke aluminum wheels, new tail lamps, and lower windshield wiper panel.

All these changes were translated to the model, which still builds into a nice replica. Other than newly included rear side marker lights and the aforementioned changes, the model is a carry-over from AMT's previous Camaro models. If it ain't broke, don't fix it!



1997 Chevrolet Camaro SS Coupe

(AMTERTL #8221; 1/25th scale; 106 pieces; modified reissue)

Surprice! Surprise! When I reviewed the 1997 Camaro Z28 convertible from the same company, I suggested that an SS variant was in the wings, due to the extra parts included on the tree. In the essence of time, I will just cover the differences between the two kits.

All of the 1997 updates mentioned in the review of the convertible kit are present in this kit as well. Several upgrades which are present in this kit for SS status include:



- 1. A new set of 'Comp T/A' tires. The sidewall detail and tread are pretty good. The wheels, on the other hand, are completely wrong. The wheels supplied in the kit are the standard Camaro wheels. The wheels which should have been supplied are the same wheels as in the AMT/ERTL 1996 Corvette kit, with the exception of the removal of the 'Flag' emblems. As it stands, the wheels supplied are not correct, so a Corvette kit must be violated to be completely accurate.
- 2. The *exhaust system* with the *dual pipes exiting on one side is correct*. For complete accuracy, the tips should be drilled out, as they are molded solid.
- 3. The *Ram Air intake box* is supplied, and mounts to the intake plenum as one of the final assemblies. It appears to be very well defined and accurate.
- 4. The *Ram Air hood scoop* appears to be a little tall and boxy to me as molded, compared to the photos of the car on the box.

While the kit goes together as well as any 4th generation AMT/ERTL Camaro, A truly accurate replica will require work and parts piracy. I am quite sure that AMT/ERTL will sell a lot of these kits simply because the real car is so popular. I intend to build this kit, but I will correct its' few, but glaring faults.

The Lost World Gatherer's M-Class Mercedes-Benz

(Revell-Monogram #3616; 1/25th scale Snaptite)

This is a very cool kit, and so easy to assemble that any young child could do it with some supervision, however, it contains small parts, so beware....not too young. It always amazes me that model companies come out with kits before the movies are released, so it seems they get all the top secret specs before the audiences. Anyway.....

This kit contains three large, basic parts-the main body shell, the interior tub, and the undercarriage/frame. There is no engine. Point to note though, is that the model kit does not match the car on the box, as there are changes in the final product. Not that the kit is bad, mind you, just some differences between the picture and the kit.

The kit is molded in dark army green and the camo pattern is self-adhesive panels which could be dullcoated, or, you could paint your own pattern nicely if you chose to. The kit is very basic, with only 31 parts in all, but they are all molded very nicely, meaning no flash and good detail, and the vehicle is unique enough to make lots of good things out of it such as a futuristic police car, or a desert army patrol vehicle. Go for it, a great little, simple kit that has lots of potential.

The Lost World Hunter's Humvee Snagger

(Revell-Monogram #85-3620; 1/25th scale Snaptite)



Companion kit to the M-Class Mercedes reviewed above, this kit is fairly similar in quality to the Gatherer's vehicle, but not as unique in my opinion. Also molded in dark green, it is a pick-up type Humvee with short cab and a steel cage on the back, and is outfitted with a hydraulic crane assembly molded in chrome (which would look better painted).

The kit contains 41 pieces, with clear parts and BIG off-road vinyl tires. If you have no military vehicles in 1/25th scale, this could be modified to fit the bill. If you like Jurassic Park, you will want these for your collection. Both kits have rolling wheels, and are targeted at kids ages 8 and up.


