



Fro... 'he Baltimore Beltway (RT 695): Take Exit 7, Route 295 (Baltimore-Washington Parkway) south towards Washington approx. 18 miles to Route 193 (Greenbelt Road), and exit. When on the off-ramp, st. to the right and merge right onto Southway (see below).

Fig. 1. the Washington Beltway (RT 495): Take Exit 22 north, towards Baltimore. Stay in the right lane and take the first exit onto Route 193 (Greenbelt Road). When on the off-ramp, bear to the right and take Greenbelt road west, towards College Park. Stay in the right lane and immediately after passing over the Parkway, make a right (at the light) onto Southway (see below).

Once on Southway: Go straight to the second (2nd) STOP sign. Make a left onto Crescent road. Go to STOP sign and make a right into the parking lot behind the Greenbelt Library. Once in parking lot, look to right. The large, white building is the Greenbelt Community Center. Enter building using doors near fenced tot lot. The multi-purpose room is on the second floor. There is an elevator to the left of the entrance.

SNEAKIN' A PEEK!

This column appears as frequently (or infrequently!) as new releases from the manufacturers. The idea behind it is to give a "thumbnail review" of the releases as they hit the shelves with a more detailed review to follow at a later date (hopefully!). We'll see how it goes! (Ed. Note: The kits are listed in no particular order)

- 1961 Ford Ranchero Custom (AMT/ERTL #8062): Molded in Lt. Gray....16-piece 'fat block' Chevy V-8 (with the 'axle hole through the block' trick), along with an upper radiator hose....molded chassis pan....Goodyear GS-C tires mounting three-spoke billet wheels and metal axles....optional custom roof, tonneau cover, and optional, wall-mount display bracket.....accessories include a tool box and bumper jack....red and teal scallops included for the hood, and front fenders, along with '62 CHERO' NY, and 'RNCHERO' MD plates (still, apparently too small!)
- Ford Thunderbird stock car (AMT/ERTL #6296): Molded in Lt. Gray....straight reissue of the AMT/ERTL stock car without decals, the thought being that the builder will secure aftermarket decals to finish it is they desire....still has chrome rims, even though chrome rims have not been used in NASCOR for at least 10 years.
- Chevrolet Monte Carlo stock car (AMT/ERTL #6372): Molded in Lt. Gray....same as the Thunderon J above.
- "Parts America" #17 Monte Carlo (AMT/ERTL #8163): Molded in Lt. Gray....Reissue of AMT's Monte Carlo, this time with the 'Parts America' markings....all striping is included on decal sheet, builder must add the highlights below the belt line....nice 25th Anniversary Darrell Waltrip decals....'Goodyear', 'Eagle #1' tire markings, headlight decals.
- 1957 Corvette Street Machine (AMT/ERTL #8213): Molded in Lt. Gray....modified reissue of excellent stock '57....15-piece 'fat block' V-8 w/builder's choice of velocity stack or small, chrome air cleaner topping off Holley 'Dominator' carb (plated)....separate plated alternator, chrome, finned valve covers....upper and lower radiator hoses...exhaust system consists of combination headers/Supertrapp

- muffler.....wheelie bars attach to non-IRS rear end w/chrome cover....electric fan for radiator....chrome 5-spoke wheels mounting big 'n bigger Goodyear tires (not GS-C's)....2-piece snorkel hood scoop....'ZEPHYR' AZ, 'MY WAY' CO, and 'POPPN' CA plates along with white scallops for hood scoop.
- 1940 Ford Sedan Delivery (AMT/ERTL #8215): Molded in Lt. Gray....appears to be a reissue....complete Ford flathead V-8, along with a Buck V-8 with choice of intake-tri-carb or supercharged....wheels & tires consist of (4) Firestone skinnies mounting steel rims, baby moons and trim rings, or Goodyear GS-C's mounting full wheel discs....stock bench seat, optional twin bucket seat option....stock dash, optional billet steering wheel....two hoods-one stock, one with cutout for blower....'DELIVRY' NV, '40 SEDAN' TN plates (both 1940), along with pink and white graphic striping for street rod version.
- 1963 Impala SS (AMT/ERTL #8321): Molded in Lt. Gray....apparent reissue of 'Prestige' series kit, down to and including missing firewall!!....10-piece 409 V-8....Firestone skinnies mounting builder's choice of stock SS wheel covers or mags....tub-style interior....all custom body parts included....accessories-trophy, TV set, record player, speakers, tools, and mascot included....'409SS' MI, 'L0215', and 'RABBIT' UT plates included (all 1963 vintage).
- 'Valvoline' T-Bird (AMT/ERTL #8088): Molded in Lt. Gray....reissue of earlier T-Bird kit with 1997 markings.
- 'Ford Quality Care/Ford Credit T-Bird (AMT/ERTL #8160): Molded in Lt. Gray....again, reissued with 1997 graphics....possible problem with roof-mounted '88' numeral is straight up rather than slanted as the door numerals are.
- 'QVC' T-Bird (AMT/ERTL #8161): Molded in Lt. Gray....Again, reissued with 1997 graphics.
- 'McDonald's' T-Bird (AMT/ERTL #8200): Molded in Lt. Gray....again, reissued with 1997 graphics...interesting to note that the above stock cars still have plated rims, even though they have not been used in NASCAR for at least 10 years.
- Harley-D.: .dson XLTM 1200C Sportster® 1200 CustomTM (Revell-Monogram #7310): Molded in Red, black, and gray...nice rubber tires (big 'n bigger) mounting chrome wire wheels....3-piece chrome exhaust system and chrome air cleaner....clear, clear red, clear amber lenses....decals include requisite H-D markings, speedometer face, engine marking for air cleaner, and marker lights.
- #5 'Kellogg's' Monte Carlo (Revell-Monogram #2479). Molded in White....reissue of the new 'Jurassic Park The Ride' Monte Carlo, with the latest 'Kellogg's' graphics.
- #24 'Quaker State' Chevy truck (Revell-Monogram #2499): Molded in White....Reissue of the earlier Chevy racetruck with the latest 'Quaker State' graphics.
- '37 Ford Panel (Revell-Monogram #7628): Molded in White....Modified reissue of the '37 Ford pickup with a great new panel body, complete with side-mount spare tire....multi-piece interior with such goodies as separate clutch and brake pedals, and an instrument panel decal....separate rear doors with inside panel and clear windows....decals for three different paint schemes-'Olympic Laundry', 'Ben Hur Coffee', and 'Blony Bubble Gum' ('Blows bigger bubbles!').
- "Sears Diehard" Chevy Truck (AMT/ERTL #8453): Molded in Lt. Gray....Reissue of the earlier racetruck with the updated "Diehard" graphics.
- 1997 Plymouth Prowler w/trailer (AMT/ERTL #8588): Molded in Lt. Gray....20-piece 3.5-liter V-6....absolutely beautiful set of 17" & 20" Goodyear Eagle GS-C tires front and back which mount big n' bigger chrome wheels....Eagle GS-C's for trailer also....platform-style interior w/separate drop-in door



panels, 2-piece dash, separate tach for steering column....20-piece rear suspension, including transaxle oil cooler!....separate outside rear view mirrors w/mylar foil faces....chrome headlight buckets w/clear lenses.... disc brakes at all cornersmolded clear up-top....all lenses molded clear....bad news-front bumpers molded in two pieces (top & bottom)....14-piece trailerfour sets of license plates-'SLEEK' D.C., 'JRE 97R' FL, 'PASSUUP' CA, and 'ONPROWL' ARK.

1940 SOLD SEDAN DELIVERY

(AA. 1/ERTL #8215; 1/25th scale modified reissue; 107 pieces, including decal sheet; molded in Lt. Gray, clear, chrome, vinyl tires)

It has been quite a long time since AMT last reissued this kit, and, like a lot of modelers, I was delighted when AMT announced it, judging from their other '40 Ford offerings. Now, you must remember that this kit was issued in the late 60's, and there has not been a lot of updating in this kit,. Taking these factors into account, the kit has withstood the test of time pretty well, although there are a few flies in the ointment.


Engine: You have a choice of two engines. The stock engine is the venerable flathead V-8. With this engine, there are no speed parts included, so aftermarket parts will be necessary if you want to build a period hot rod (Replicas & Miniatures CO of MD to the rescue!). The engine goes together quite easily, and with some patience and a little paint, looks good. The optional engine is the Buick nailhead V-8 with either triple Stromberg two-barrels, or a supercharger set-up. Again, this engine doesn't look too bad once painted and detailed, but where are the exhaust manifolds?!

<u>Chassis:</u> The chassis assembly consists of a pan chassis with the floorboards, single exhaust, and bumper horns molded in. The engine and radiator mount to the top. Where are the radiator hoses for the nail head engine?! There are two different front axles, standard and dropped, with molded in spring and brake drum back detail. The 'closed' rear axle assembly includes a molded in rear spring and brake drum backs. An extra left hand exhaust system or headers with baffled pipes for the supercharged engine are also supplied. The wheels and tires are attached with metal axles (1960's technology here).

Wheels and tires: Two versions here as well. AMT's Firestone skinnies with stock steel wheels, trim rings, and the standard 'Ford deluxe' hubcaps. Not mentioned in the instructions, a set of 'Baby Moon' caps are also included. A wide whitewall may be easily applied to these tires with some Acrylic Flat White paint. The Custom wheel/tire combination consists of 'Flipper' hubcaps with Goodyear GS-C tires. This combination seems weird to me in that we are using retro custom wheel trim with high-tech tires. The Flipper hubcaps will fit the skinny tires and with a whitewall, would seem to be a better

Body: The in that the parting lines AMT/ERTL captured very accurately. The inside the body, along side windows. The fenders are a single unit



vehicle as kitted. If you on the side of the box, it "Keystone Classic" 5- wheels were not the kit. body looks pretty good, are pretty well hidden. the shape of this body interior tub mounts with the windshield and running boards and to which the body and

interior mount. The instructions omitted a step where you trim down a crossmember at the front of the rear wheel arches. The body will not mount properly without making this modification. The hood, battery, and headlamps mount onto the fender/running board assembly. The rear door and window is a separate, non-hinged piece. The 1939-style "Chevron" tail lamps mount into indentations in the rear fenders.

The chassis mounts under the fender/running board assembly, but there is yet another problem. Either you will not do notch the body at the rear to clear the rear bumper horns, or cut the offending horns off. This step is also not mentioned in the instructions. There are various accessories and upgrades with this kit which allow the modeler to personalize their model with different items such as bumpers, antennas, and spotlights.

<u>Interior</u>: The interior consists of a tub depicting the floor, door and rear side panels, with decent engraving. Seat options consist of a two-piece split back bench seat, and Corvette style bucket seats. There are two different dashboards with two different steering wheels as well-one standard, one high-tech. A rear filler panel with a fake spare tire mounts under the floor at the rear. Extra items for the interior consist of a tachometer, three-gauge cluster, and a square-knobbed shifter.

The aftermarket has created a plethora of items which will fit this model. Anything from a photoetched grille, to a complete interior makeover, the possibilities are mind-boggling! If you can work your way around the foibles, the basis for a fantastic model exists with this kit. I really like what AMT hath wrought in this model.

- More new stuff! Word is out about the next round of AMT's "Buyer's Choice" offerings. We should see the 1/16th scale Richard Petty 'STP' Pontiac stock car, 1/20th scale McLaren M8D, 1/25th scale '51 Chevy Fleetline, and a 1/25th scale Haulaway trailer w/transporter. Additionally, in the 1/18th scale diecast line-up, we will get a '69 GTX, and a '69 Camaro. Expect these kits in the Spring of '98.
- Still more new stuff! Word is that Art "All American" Anderson will have at his table in Toledo a '65 Chevy Biscayne, and a '49 Buck Roadmaster station wagon (Hey, Matt!)
