





## SNEAKIN' A PEEK!

This column appears as frequently (or infrequently!) as new releases from the manufacturers. The idea behind it is to give a "thumbnail review" of the releases as they hit the shelves with a more detailed review to follow at a later date (hopefully!). We'll see how it goes! (Ed. Note: The kits are listed in no particular order)

- Maverick's '64 330 Super Stock Dodge (Lindberg #72174): Molded in white....reissue of earlier 'Ramchargers' Hemi car, with new decals.
- 'McDonalds' Firebird funny car (Revell-Monogram #85-7636): Molded in white....modified reissue with a nice looking Firebird body which includes blower burst panel on hood and escape hatch on roof (and horrendous seams!)....same wheels and tires as earlier drag kits....blower now molded in blanket, with retention straps also included....larger 2-piece top hat injector with retention straps molded in.
- Chevy 'Extreme' pickup (AMT/ERTL #8350): Molded in Lt. Gray....modified reissue includes Vortec V-6 rather than 2.2 liter 4 cylinder....tonneau cover....bench seat....appears to have lowering blocks included.. nice, 2-piece rims! Outer rim chrome, wheel center lt. Gray....Chevy 'Extreme' graphics, aero package, 'XXX' IL, 'X FACTOR' AZ plates.
- '97 Corvette Snapfast Plus (AMT/ERTL #8395): Molded in Yellow....very nice Eagle EMT tires (big/bigger), mounting chrome big/bigger 5-spoke wheels...disc brakes at all corners...roof yellow plastic, not transparent....'BIG BOY' NY, 'KICKN' TX plates, crossed flag logos...incredible packaging!

# 1997 PROWLER ROADSTER WITH TRAILER

(AMT/ERTL #8568; 1/25th scale-new tool; 139 pieces; Lt. Gray, chrome, clear, vinyl

tires)

AMT/ERTL has done it again! To say that I like this kit is an understatement! It is wonderful. This is the second time AMT/ERTL has released a kit of this car in 1/25th scale, this time being a full detail glue kit, and it is not a re-hash of the previous promo-based SnapFast Plus<sup>TM</sup> kit, which was not a bad kit by itself.

This kit is customary gray convertible up-top, and tail lamps, and did them in chrome that someone will some point in this puppy.



molded in AMT/ERTL's plastic, along with a clear windshield and header, head chrome wheels (why they is beyond me, but you know do this on a real Prowler at time!). Let's take a look at

Engine: The engine is broken down into two assemblies, according to the instructions. The tenpiece subassembly is the basic engine without accessories. One error made in the instructions is that the engine block itself is CAST IRON, not aluminum. The eight-piece engine's final assembly consists of the valve covers (which should be painted with 'German Silver' paint, not black), as well as the upper intake manifold and belt assembly. Assembled and properly painted, a fine-looking engine will be the result.

<u>Chassis:</u> The nine-piece chassis assembly goes together pretty easily, with a combination of tabs and slots for a positive location of the separate pieces which comprise the chassis. The fourteen-piece drivetram and suspension assembly consists of a three-piece, finely engraved transaxle, coil shocks, separate suspension pieces, and a driveshaft.

The balance of the rear suspension consists of more pieces including the A-arms, sway bar, brake rotors, etc. AMT/ERTL has made a note that this kit is **NOT** designed to roll, as it is a display model. Thank you, thank you!

The eight-piece exhaust assembly/anti-shake frame completes the chassis assembly. There is a considerable number of pieces here, some a little fiddly, but it will go together with a little care and patience. I highly suggest that the builder work in getting the subassemblies together, paint them, then continue the assembly procedure.

The interior tub goes onto the chassis assembly, after the fuel tank is glued up under the trunk floor. Follow the instructions, as the firewall must be attached to the interior **BEFORE** the interior. The front suspension and steering linkage should be attached **AFTER** the body is mounted onto the chassis.

Wheels/Tires: The wheels are, as I stated earlier, chrome plated. While this looks good, as far as I know, Chrysler has yet to offer them as an option from the factory, so a factory stock builder should strip the chrome plating off of the wheels and wheel backs and paint them with the same paint used on the valve covers. The tires for the car consist of newly-tooled Goodyear GSD<sup>TM</sup> tires in a 17" diameter for the front end, and a 20" diameter for the rear end. (AMT should market these tires for the aftermarket, they are that good!). The trailer tires are the now-familiar Goodyear GS-C<sup>TM</sup> tires.

<u>Body:</u> This fourteen-piece assembly captures the shape of the Prowler perfectly. At this time, there exists NO Prowler Purple paint offered by the model paint companies, even though there are some shades on the market which are pretty darn close. The hood, grille, headlamp brackets, and rear fascia should be assembled as a unit prior to painting to ensure consistent color, especially if a pearlescent color is used.

The front body assembly consists of the windshield and rear view mirror, parking, and headlamp lenses, and the bumpers. If you notice, the bumpers are split across the middle. Don't run off and fill the seam right away, as if I am not mistaken, it is meant to be there.

The rear bumper, lamps, and fascia attach to the rear of the body. A nice touch are the included peel and stick chrome mylar mirror faces.

Final assembly consists of the tires, hood, and windshield washer reservoir. The up-top is separate, and the trailer is also optional.

<u>Interior:</u> The thirteen-piece interior is a work of art in itself. Everything is crisply engraved, and the instructions are clearly defined. The door panels attach to a tub-style interior, which also includes the inner trunk detail. It is most curious that the trunk panel does not open on the body. **TIP:** Tape off the dash, and shoot the insert body color (Purple) before you paint the rest of the interior per the instructions.

Yes, this kit has a lot of pieces, and personally, I think a lot of younger builders will have a difficult time building it, in that there is a lot of detail in this model. It is not a toy to be played with (Buy the snap kit if you want one of those), but a display model, if carefully built and properly detailed will be a welcome addition to any serious modelers' collection. Keep it up, AMT/ERTL!



## CHRYSLER ATLANTIC

(Lindberg #72712; 1/25th scale; new tool; 40 pieces, plus decals)

When I first came across the Atlantic in an automotive magazine, I said to myself that Chrysler should produce that car. It is that breathtaking. When Lindberg announced that they would be offering this car in their line, I was curious as to how it would be marketed. Well, this kit arrived as one of their "Snapfast Plus<sup>TM</sup>" offerings, in other words, an unassembled promo. Now, this kit differs from a lot of the other snap kits, in that some of the assembly will be glued together, along with snapping, and screwing the remainder of the model together. When you open the box, you will notice several plastic bags with different colored parts in each. This kit is molded in color, so you will find the body and assorted body parts molded in a shiny, medium brown, the interior parts in a flat beige color, and the chassis flat black. The chrome is brightly plated, and there are four nylon tires with attaching screws and metal axles, and the glass is commendably clear (and bagged to protect it!).

The six-piece *interior* consists of a tub with the rear seats, console, floor, and door panels molded in. The dash, steering wheel, and front seats are separate pieces. The assembly is molded in a textured, flat beige tone, that does not require painting, with the exception of the burgundy accents depicted in the instructions. The engraving is soft in spots, but overall, the interior doesn't come off too bad.

The glass unit, interior tub, tail lamp, front, and rear pan mount to the body by way of tabs molded to the body. If you'll notice, there are even lines scribed on the glass. Even though the instructions do not mention this step, these lines should be detailed with flat black from the inside to appear more realistic.

The tires slip over the wheels, which in turn, attach to the metal axles, and these attach to the simple chassis via holes. Note- The wheels and tires are drop-dead gorgeous! I'm quite sure that we will be seeing them on countless other models in the near future.

The chassis attaches to the body with three screws, but first, you must mount the body stiffener to the upper part of the chassis, which will help everything to line up when it is screwed together. Curiously, the doors are separate pieces, and they will be glued to tabs on the body. The instructions state that the doors should be held to the car body with rubber bands until the glue dries. I am unsure that there will not be alignment problems with this arrangement.



Completing the model, we have the mirrors, head and fog lamps, grilles, hood, and trunk emblems.

As intended, with careful attention to detail, this model will build up into a nice kit just as it is. With detail painting, along with *Replicas & Miniatures Company's clear red resin tail light*, a beautiful replica of a beautiful car will be the final result. *Lindberg did a fine job with this car*.
