<u>'98 MEETING SCHEDULE</u>

From the Baltimore Beltway (RT 695): Take Exit 7, Route 295 (Baltimore-Washington Parkway) south towards Washington approx. 18 miles to Route 193 (Greenbelt Road), and exit. When on the off-ramp, stay to the right and merge right onto Southway (see below).

From the Washington Beltway (RT 495): Take Exit 22 north, towards Baltimore. Stay in the right lane and take the first exit onto Route 193 (Greenbelt Road). When on the off-ramp, bear to the right and take Greenbelt road west, towards College Park. Stay in the right lane and immediately after passing over the Parkway, make a right (at the light) onto Southway (see below).

Once on Southway: Go straight to the second (2nd) STOP sign. Make a left onto Crescent road. Go to STOP sign and make a right into the parking lot behind the Greenbelt Library. Once in parking lot, look to right. The large, white building is the Greenbelt Community Center. Enter building using doors near fenced tot lot. The multi-purpose room is on the second floor. There is an elevator to the left of the entrance.

SNEAKIN' A PEEK!

This column appears as frequently (or infrequently!) as new releases from the manufacturers. The idea behind it is to give a "thumbnail review" of the releases as they hit the shelves with a more detailed review to follow at a later date (hopefully!). We'll see how it goes! How about this, gang? To better identify possible kit reviews, at the end of the item on the kit, the words 'Available' or 'Not Available' will appear. Obviously, any kit which is available may be reserved by a club member with a simple call to the Editor. Conversely, a kit which is 'Not Available' was either already reserved by someone, or was something new inserted by yours truly, and paid for with my hard-earned moolah! (Ed. Note: The kits are listed in no particular order):

- #99 "Exide Batteries" Ford Taurus (Revell-Monogram #85-2556): Molded in white....Retool of last issue Thunderbird kit....sleek, new two-door Taurus body....glass is consistent with past kits-NACA ducts in 1/4 windows, frosted on rear for painting, even seem to have captured odd shape of rear window....decals include all major sponsors, wheel decals, and Taurus head and parking light decals. (Not Available)
- '98 Firebird Ram Air (Revell-Monogram #85-2539): Molded in white....Reissue of 25th Anniversary T/A, without 'Trans Am' logos!....correctly molded in T-Tops....new front bumper and Ram air hood w/separate inlet grilles....Goodyear GS-C tires rather than proper Goodyear Eagle F1's mounting 17" chrome five-spoke wheels....new LS1 V-8 retooled from earlier small block....decals include T-Top 'glass', incorrect 'Firebird' tail light decal, black and white Ram Air hood decals, wheel center logos, underhood decals, 'EFA 400' WI, and '1B25815' SD plates. (Not Available)
- Pro Street Camaro Z28 Snapfast Plus w/Plus Pack (AMT/ERTL #8307): Molded in Orange....appears to be a retool of an earlier promo....more flash than usual....neat pro street chassis tooled up for a car without an engine...upper portion of chassis has interior tub, front fender aprons, and wheel tubs molded to it, while lower portion has lower portion of engine, headers, and rear end molded to it....separate, plated front frame, and wheelie bars....Mickey Thompson front tires and treaded rear tires, mounting Centerline-style rims...large, separate chrome rear spoiler...separate, two-piece hood scoop...decals consist of 'SCREAM N' Ca, 'PRO92" ARK plates, tail light decals, and several small flame and scallop decals. (Available)
- '65 GTO convertible (AMT/ERTL #8201): Molded in Lt. Gray....straight reissue of earlier kit....choice of tri-power of single four-barrel....(4) Firestone skinnies mounting Rally I wheels....optional tires consist of (4) Goodyear L60-15's mounting Hurricane-style wheels....(2) hardtops offered....one-piece chassis w/molded on exhaust system and metal axles. (Available)
- Porsche Boxster (Revell-Monogram #85-1906, Snaptite): Molded in silver w/red interior....chrome directional 5-spoke wheels, mounting Michelin tires....tub-style interior w/separate drop-in door panels....no engine....nicely engraved chassis...2-piece bucket seats...twin red stripes w/breakaway for hood and trunk, and upholstery pattern for seats, stylized #8, Porsche logo. (Available)
- Hummer (Revell-Monogram #85-1907, Snaptite): Molded in red....soft top Hummer w/molded uptop and tonneau cover....tub-style interior w/4 separate bucket seats w/no backs....no engine, simplified chassis w/separate coil springs....body-colored steel rims mounting Goodyear Tracker AT tires....vinyl seat upholstery, exterior graphics, tail gate 'Hummer' marking, and license plate, tail lights. (Available)

- '68 Corvette Roadster 2 'n 1 (Revell-Monogram #85-2544): Molded in white....reissue of earlier, stock Vette....stock L-88, optional blown big block w/Moroso valve covers....stock small block hood, L-88 hood....stock Rally wheels, optional 6-spoke custom wheels....sidepipes....flames, 'GHI 771' CA, '68 VETT' Ca plates.(Available)
- '69 Shelby Mustang 2 'n 1 (Revell-Monogram #85-2545): Molded in white....reissue of earlier stock Shelby....stock and 2 4-barrel tunnel-rammed V-8....stock 5-spoke mags, optional deep dish Centerlines mounting either Goodyear F70-15's or GT Radials....(3) sets of GT stripes-black, white, and gold, several underhood decals, '1969', 'MILANO' IL plates. (Available)
- '92 Firebird Pro Street Snapfast Plus Pack (AMT #8341): Molded in Apple Green...knocked off of earlier Camaro....GTA body....decals include 'PRO ST' CA, 'SPOILR' AL plates, and Camaro tail lights (Modify them per instructions)! (Available)
- Pro Shop Ford Supertruck (AMT #6206): Molded in Lt. Gray...reissue of earlier Fords race truck minus decals. (Available)
- Pro Shop Chevy Supertruck (AMT #6301): Molded in Lt. Gray....reissue of earlier Chevy race truck minus decals. (Available)
- '55 Corvette (AMT #6210): Molded in Lt. Gray....choice of single or dual 4-barrel carb setups....stock 'Chevrolet' or custom chrome finned valve covers....front suspension could be posable....platform-style interior....stock hubcaps mounting Firestone skinnies, optional mags mounting Goodyear L60-15's....optional uptop with side glass....color matrix included....(3) sets of license plates-'VET 55' OH, 'USA 1', and 'MJ19 62'. (Available)
- '66 Pontiac GTO (Revell-Monogram #85-2537): Molded in white...nice 389 tri-power V-8....Rally I rims (slots molded open) with Goodyear F70-15 tires, and redline or lettered sidewall decals....platform-style interior, w/separate chrome console and wood steering wheel....separate parking brake/gas/clutch/brake pedal assembly mounting to firewall....hood scoop molded open....(3) sets of license plates- '429 453' IL, 'RRG 389' CA, 'TRI POWR' CA.... California plates have registrations on rear plates only....decals include all emblems and crests, along with floor mats. (Not Available)
- 'Hot Wheels' Race rig (Revell-Monogram #1712, Snaptite): Molded in Hot Wheels blue....easy-to-follow instructions....trailer includes cabinets, bench grinder, vice, and drill press....trailer decals are one huge decal for entire trailer, which should be very difficult to get positioned right the first time. (Available)
- '98 Corvette Roadster (Revell-Monogram #2527): Molded in White....decals include 'WDJ 515' AZ plates (registration on rear), underhood decals, crossed flag logos, gauge face, and wheel center logos....20-piece engine/trans assembly....tub-style interior w/drop in door panels....clear and clear red lights....separate uptop. (Available)
- '98 Corvette convertible (Revell-Monogram #1904, Snaptite): Molded in....curbside (no engine)....simplified chassis which screws together....clear and clear red lights....tub-style interior w/drop in door panels....'UPGRD 1' IL plate, gauge face, floor mats, upholstery pattern, stripes for side and trunk. (Available)

[Note to all concerned: It has been brought to my attention of late that there is a potential problem with regard to the review articles published in this newsletter. Let me give you a little background on this subject. The model manufacturers (AMT/ERTL, Revell-Monogram, and Lindberg) all attempt to send our club current releases in exchange for our critiques on what we liked and didn't like about them. That means that we need to get written reviews published in the newsletter in a reasonable time frame to accomplish this. If you will recall, I have stood up at recent club meetings to enlist the aid of the members in attendance to get kit reviews. At present, Ron Hamilton has done more than his fair share of reviews. In the past, Lyle Willits also did his share of reviews, as well as yer Fearless Editor. If anyone wishes to see reviews written by someone else (or take a crack at it themselves), they need to contact me, in order to determine which kits are available for review. You may also rest assured that if you take a kit for a review, and do not return it within a reasonable time, that you will not receive another!]


QUICK LOOK

My buddy Ron Hamilton turned me on to Bob after the November Dunn Loring, VA swap meet. Not only does Bob have currently available *JOHAN promos* in stock *(or order)*, he carries other promos as well. Ron knows I'm not much of a promo collector, but Bob also has available, on a limited basis, *unassembled JOHAN promos molded in white plastic*. Bob tells me he's the only one offering these.

I purchased a 1955 Pontiac 2-door sedan (Ed. Note: Yer talkin' my language!) and a 1959 Dodge 2-door hardtop. Neither one has an interior (this is the same as the regular assembled promos), but they both do have clear windows. The assembled promos I've seen have darkly tinted green windows, to mask the lack of an interior, I presume. These unassembled models are priced less than the assembled promos. My two were purchased for \$24.95 each, compared to \$31.95 apiece for the assembled promo version.

If you were thinking of a JOHAN promo as the basis of a future project, this is a lower cost alternative that may appeal to you. (I already have a '59 Rambler wagon on order!)

- What's next-a Lincoln Pickup?! Well, maybe! A blurb in the Business section of a recent Washington Times newspaper quoted a Ford official saying that the Lincoln Blackwood may be launched next year. It would feature a chrome grille, leather and walnut interior, and a varnished wooden bed. Oh yeah, it would sell for \$45,000 to \$50,000! I guess Lincoln wants their own 'Cowboy Cadillac'!
- More new stuff!! New York Toy Show announcements from AMT include a '98 Corvette Pace car (snap) (surprised?), a stock Taurus snap kit, both 'Bigfoot' and 'USA1' monster trucks with new parts (snap), "Cheerios", "Valvoline", and "McDonalds" Taurus stock cars and the new Dodge Copperhead (all snap). Glue kits include "Kelloggs" and "Kodak" Monte Carlos. The next "Buyer's Choice" selections include the "Rat Packer" Nova altered wheelbase drag car, a '72 Nova, '53 Studebaker "Double Whammy", and the "Ramchargers' dragster. Hooooo boy!
- Lightning strikes-again! Ford will release a '99 Lightning which is pumped up from its earlier iteration. The newest version will pack a factory supercharged and intercooled 5.4-liter Triton V-8 (Ed. Note: By the way, this is the first use of a supercharged V-8 in a production pick-up!), which will be backed by a 4-speed automatic. Ford's preliminary estimates peg output at 325 hp. (Sources say this may be 5-10% conservative), and 0-60 times are rumored to be in the 6-second range. The truck will utilize a standard cab, short-bed stepside F-150 body, gas-charged shocks, a rear anti-roll bar, lowered ride height, and will 'wear' 5-spoke 18X9.5 inch alloy wheels shod with 295/45ZR18 Goodyear Eagle F1 tires. It should stop as well as it goes too, with four-wheel disc brakes with four-wheel ABS. It will have a front

fascia with SVT-style Cobra driving lights, as well as a rocker panel and rear panel treatment, with dual chrome side exit exhausts to set it all off. It will be available in black, white, and red. The interior will be done in a combination of leather and suede, and it will have the Cobra signature white-face gauges. What's all this gonna cost? Early estimates peg the *price* at a tad *under 30 large*. Thanks to the May '98 issue of *Motor Trend* for this one!

- BMW spanks VW! Guess you are all aware that it appears as though BMW has won the bidding war over rival VW in its bid to acquire Rolls Royce. Just how much is RR worth? How 'bout 571 million bucks?!
- Crown Vic-Crown Prince! With the 'untimely' demise of the Caprice in 1996, the only game in town for big, rear drive sedans is the Crown Vic, and Ford is loving it, accounting for 85% of new police vehicle sales. But, the old Chevies are fighting back from the grave. A firm in Lansing, Michigan replaces the engine, transmission, suspension, and rear axle in their 'rebuilding' of the old warrior, using 20 work stalls for nothing but Caprices, and they have done more than 1,300 cars since 1996. The price for this service is pegged at about 12 grand. That compares to about 20 grand for a new Crown Vic, and that doesn't take into account the inventory of Ford parts necessary to maintain the cars once purchased. Granted, Chevy is marketing Luminas and Camaros, and is now beginning to offer Tahoes, while Ford offers the Explorer and Expedition, and Chrysler offers the Jeep Cherokee. But, as far as the Crown Vics and Caprices go, "It's a love affair-they just don't want to part with them!"
- More American Muscle! <u>Matchbox</u> is at it again. This time in their 1/43rd scale American Muscle collection. They have added five more new cars to this line-up. They include a 1970 Plymouth GTX (incorrectly identified as a Roadrunner!), a 1966 Ford Fairlane GT (identified as an XL), a 1966 SS396 Chevelle, a 1969 Dodge Charger R/T, a 1971 Dodge Challenger R/T, and a 1970 Olds 442 W30 convertible.
